everywhere.




Fantastic discussion about what we think will happen in our new story- The Gingerbread Man 2. Lots of imaginative ideas. Well done Year1!

The children worked really hard to describe the characters in the story.






Year 3 are looking at the parts of the mass and using their Mass cards to help sort out the different statements about the mass and the Bible readings for each part too.
