



Y3 exploring which materials are magnetic and looking at magnetic fields using iron filings...






















Reception read "The Three Billy Goat Gruff".

They worked with their friends to make bridges for their trolls and then made their own pictures at the creative table.


This week in Year One, the children listened to 'The Bear and the Scary Night'. We corrected sentences, wrote speech bubbles and sequenced and retold the story.

Year 3 used a formal written method of addition without regrouping and have been solving maths puzzles.


One pupil even achieved a Headteacher's award.

We have been looking at shapes, turns, twists, travel and much, much more.







We have made chains with all sorts of ideas of how we can make a difference and make someone happy today!



We praised God by singing "Our God is a great big God".














Fully involved whilst exploring mark-making using different media


EYFS enjoyed working together in groups using a range of musical instruments and made new friends




In RE, the Year One children heard the story of when Jesus was lost at the temple. They shared their understanding by retelling the story in their own words. Such a wonderful effort from all.
