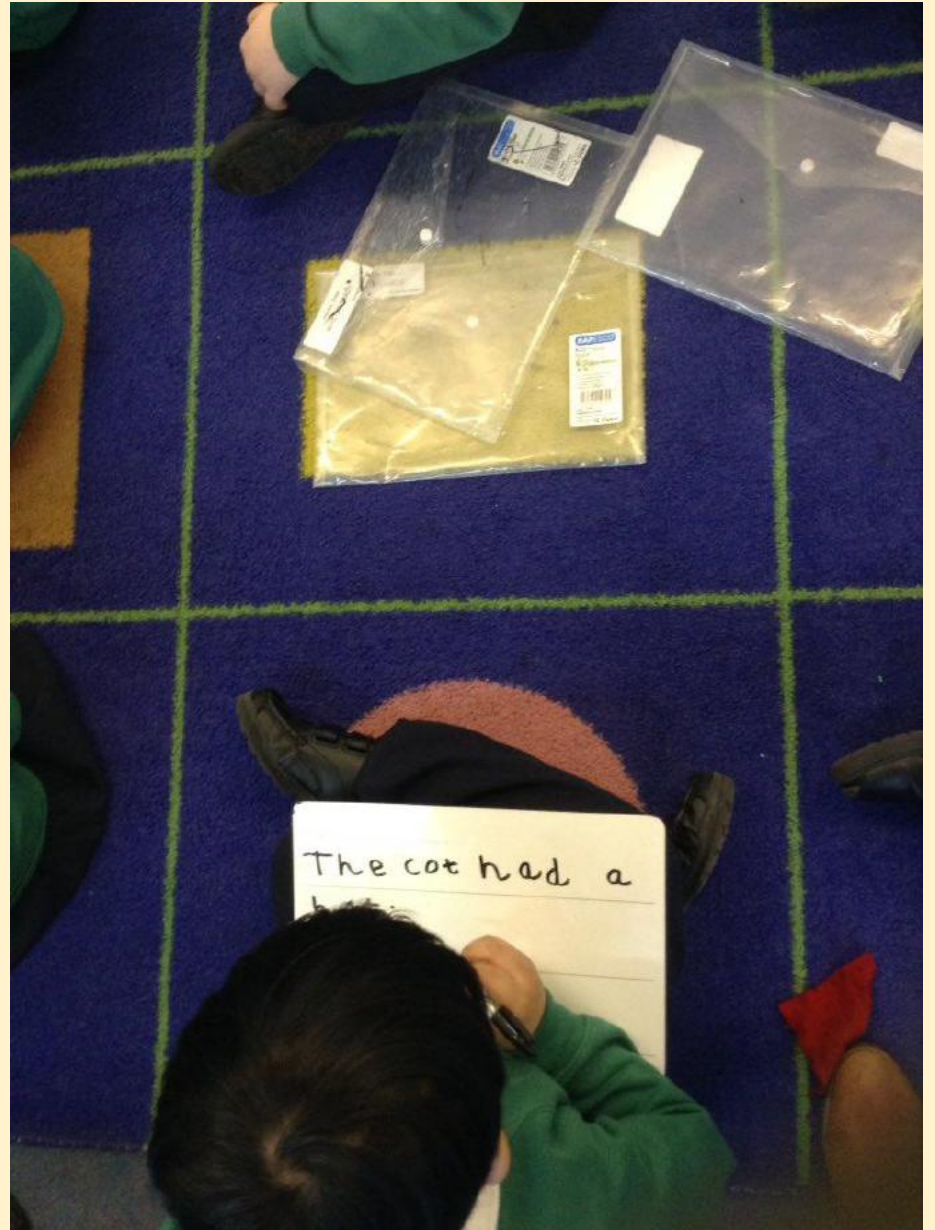




Our children wanted to create an area where they could pray for peace, standing together with our friends in Ukraine

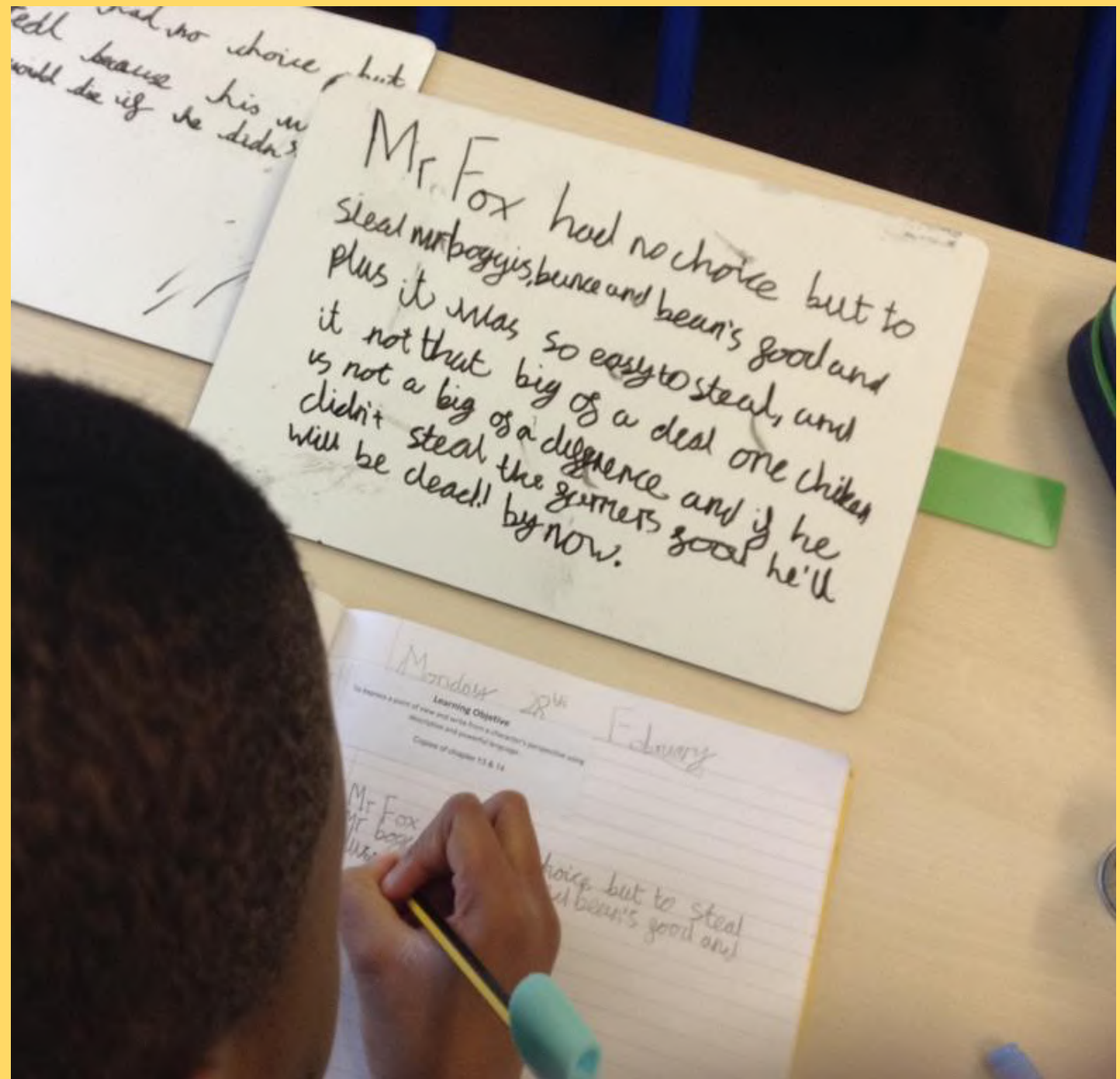


Reception enjoyed role playing in the Dinosaur Museum shop.

Fantastic reading of prices and coin counting.



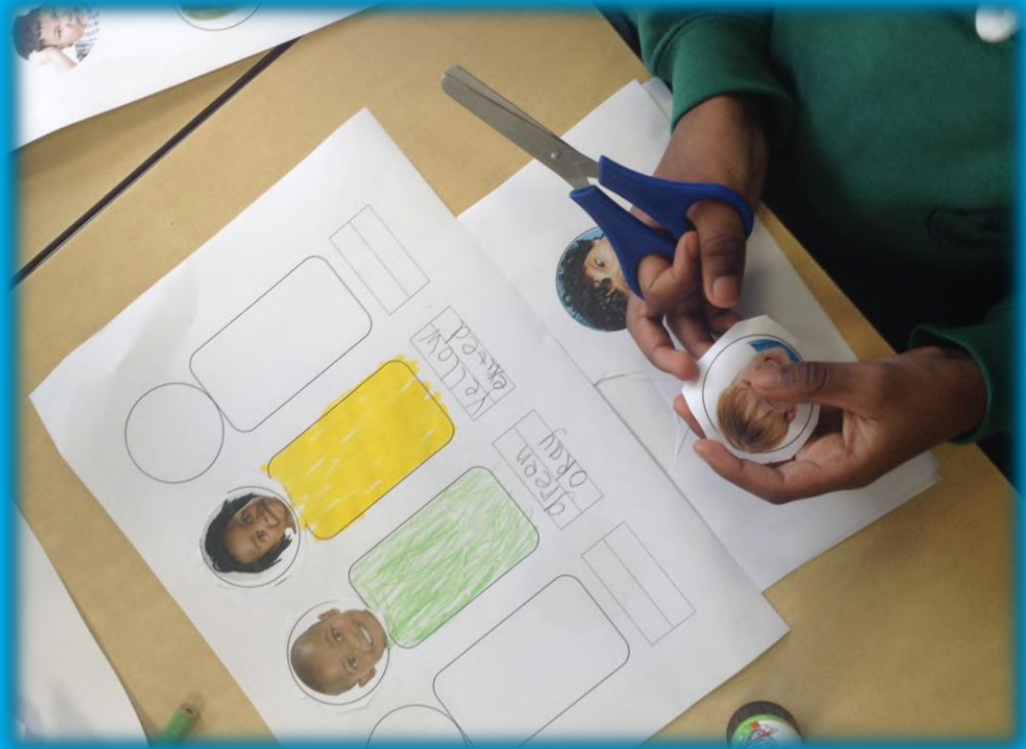
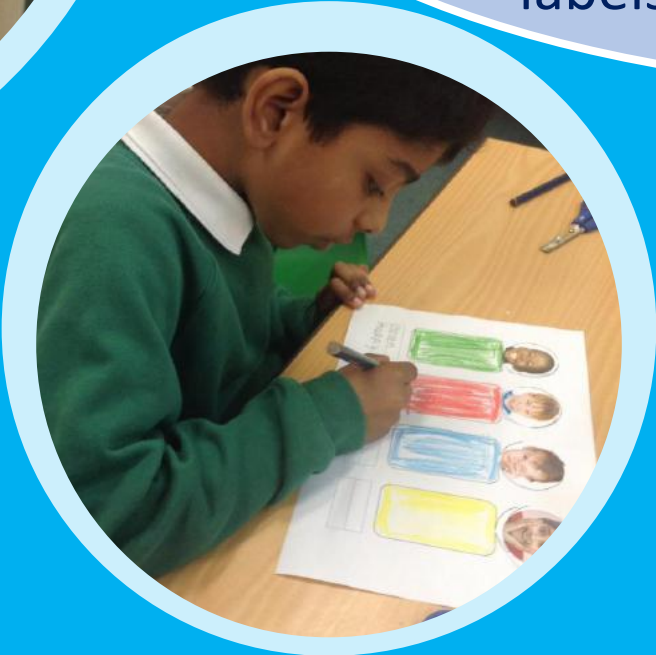
Reception also really enjoyed the dinosaur themed outside area!

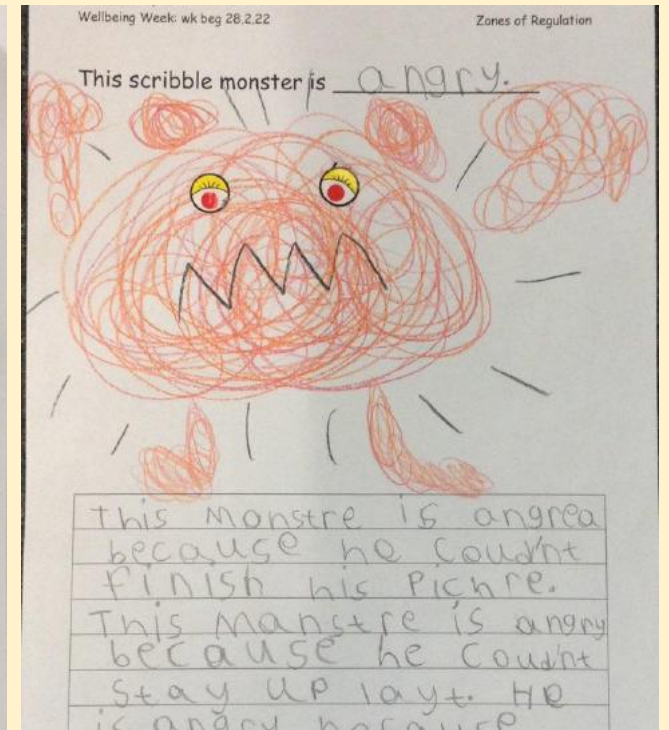
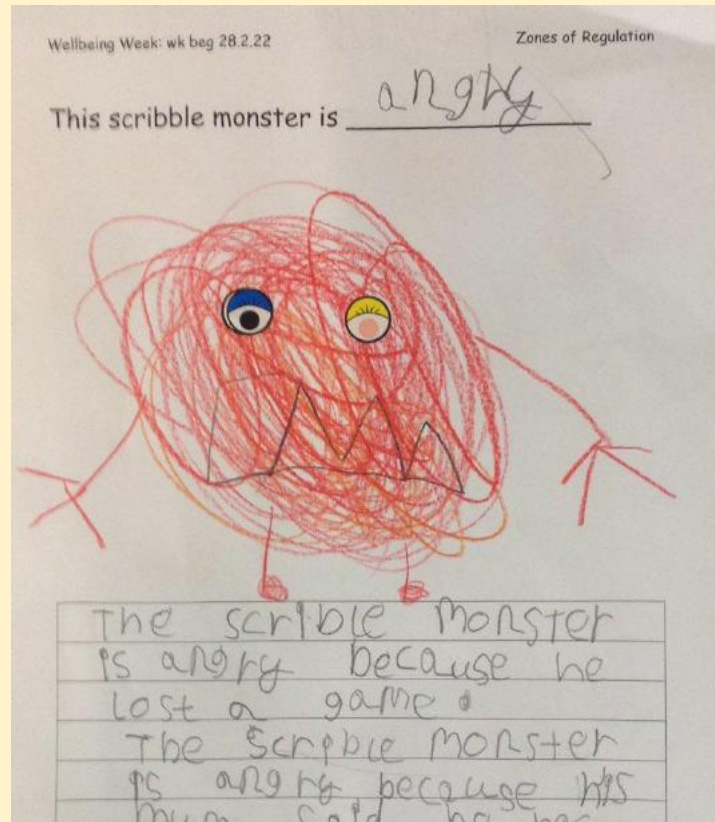


The Year One children then created rainbows using the colours that they had explored earlier in the day.

Take turns choosing emotions from the stack of cards and act it out using only face and body clues. Guess each other's emotion, discuss which zone it is in and why.



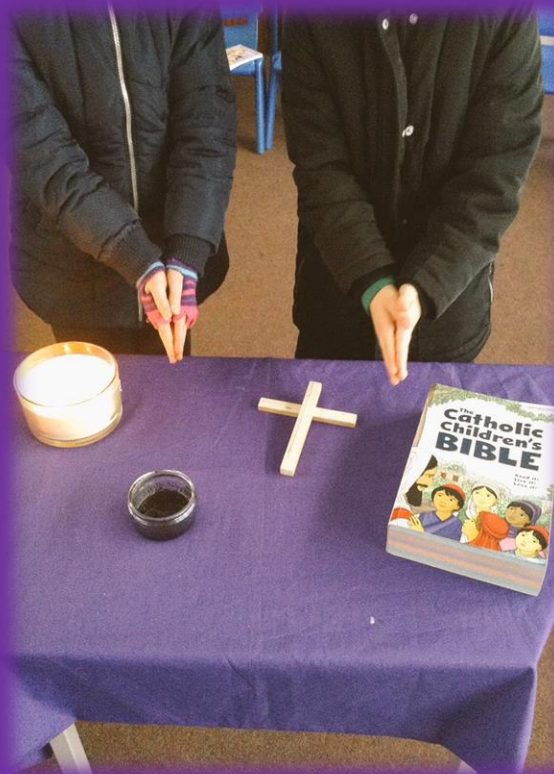

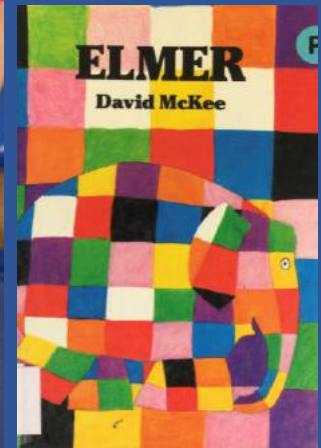

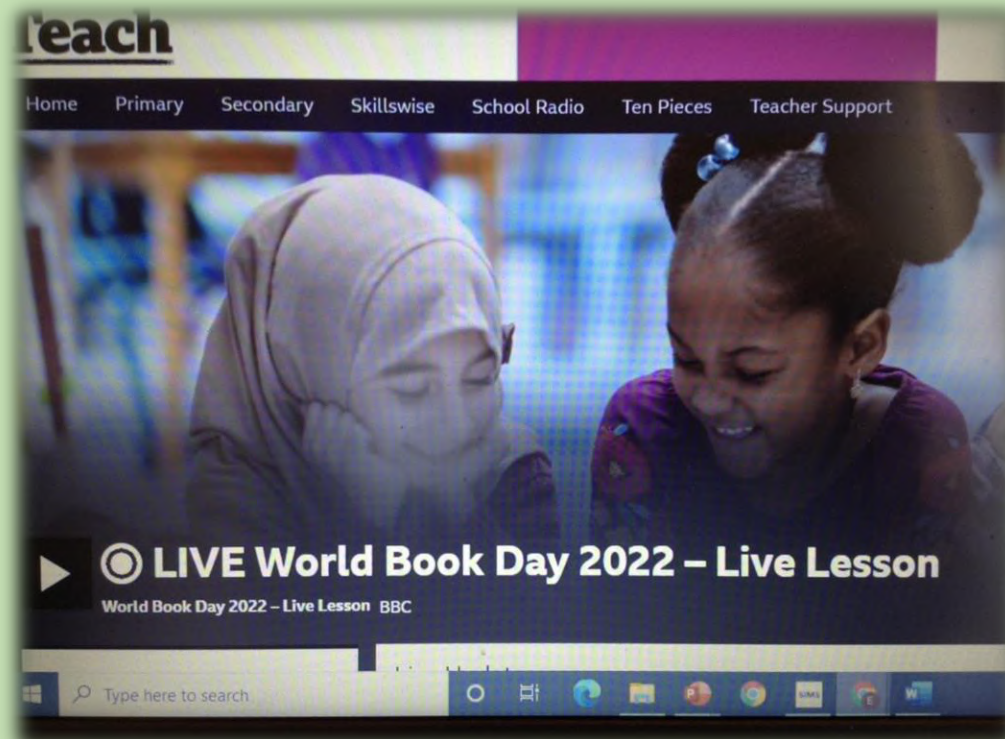
The children were happy to display their artwork. *“It’s Elmer!”*

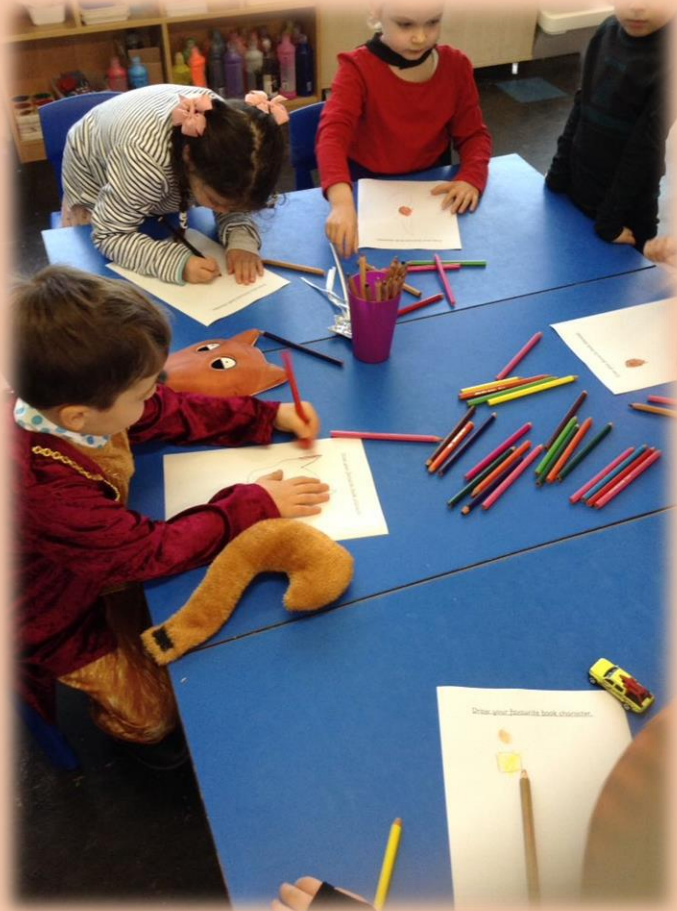

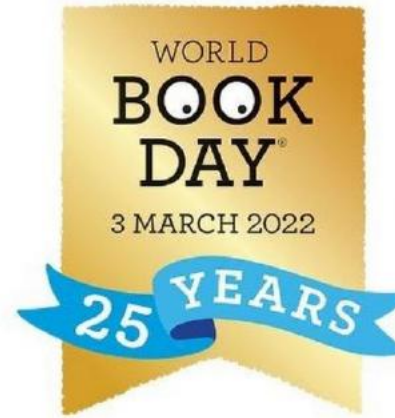

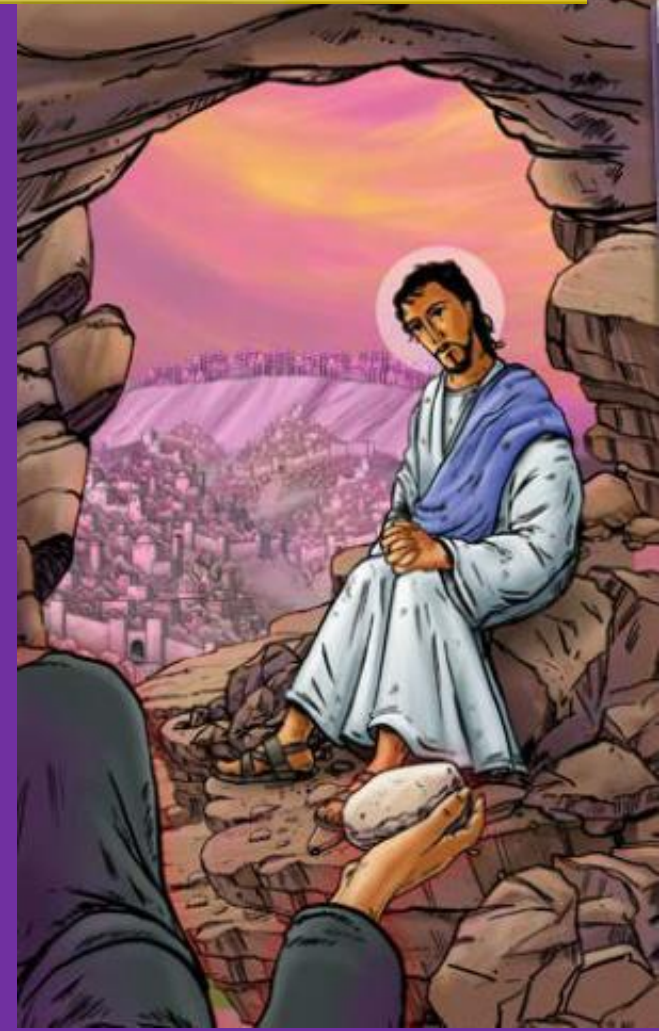
