Dear parents and carers

I write to you today with my final end of term newsletter. Through this newsletter I hope to share with you something of the very special nature of this community and my reflections as I move on to new and perhaps unknown horizons.



I am very proud to be a product of Catholic Education in Stevenage. I attended St Margaret Clitherow School as a pupil. I loved school and remember Mrs Hayday in my Reception year playing the piano in assembly each week and Mrs Cropton in the office helping us to bake cakes for the teachers' afternoon tea in those early days. How things have changed!

After St Margaret Clitherow, I moved on to St Michael's Catholic School under the stewardship of Mr Nash, Mr Ash & Mr Murrell and learnt to love in particular English literature and Ancient History. In my 4th year (as it was then) St Michael's joined with St Angela's (the girls' school) to form The John Henry Newman School and things changed significantly as Catholic coeducation became a reality in Stevenage. Miss Culkin was one of my new year group classmates! After JHN, encouraged by the wonderful teachers that I'd experienced, I was accepted to train for a teaching degree at Homerton via Cambridge University.

I returned to St Margarets prior to my BEd at Homerton for a 'pre school experience' in July 1991. When I completed my degree in July 1995, I first applied for a job at St Vincent de Paul School, Stevenage and was unsuccessful, but did secure a job at St Margaret Clitherow the day after! In so many ways, I am glad that I didn't get the job initially, as it was at St Margaret Clitherow that I met Nicole (Mrs White) who very quickly became my unofficial mentor and dear friend. St Margaret Clitherow offered me many excellent opportunities, taking over from a teacher who had actually taught me! My journey to leadership was nurtured at St Margaret Clitherow through the guidance of the brilliant Geraldine Cartwright (currently one of our amazing governors). I learnt so much from her inclusive practice and her faith in action. I owe so much to both Geraldine and Nicole for my 28 years in Catholic Education, including 12 years in Catholic Headship and I thank them sincerely for their wisdom and great counsel.









After 6 years of headship at St Margaret Clitherow, I felt called to something new and this is what led me to St Vincent de Paul School – yes, a calling! I hope that in my time here I have listened to my calling and have made a difference. This is a very special community and somewhere where I have really felt at home over six years.

I am leaving not because I am unhappy, but simply because I feel called to something else. At the moment this calling is directing me towards family and things closer to home but I am sure that over the next few months as I listen carefully without distraction I will be called to something new and exciting in the wider world too!

As St John Henry Newman said:

"God has created me to do Him some definite service. He has committed some work to me which He has not committed to another. I have my mission. I may never know it in this life, but I shall be told it in the next. I am a link in a chain, a bond of connection between persons. He has not created me for naught. I shall do good; I shall do His work."

We have a wonderful community at St Vincent de Paul School and it has been a privilege to get to know so many families and children over my time here. Your generosity as a community never fails to amaze me in both your support for each other and for the school. Thank you sincerely for this commitment to community.

Speaking of generosity. How amazing it was to hear this weekend that parents have managed to raise a total of £13, 560.35 for the school during this academic year. This has enabled the purchase of another trolley of Chrome Books for KS2 and will ensure that the KS1 library project can be completed. Thank you to everyone for your generous support of fundraising activities and in particular to the PSA committee who work so hard behind the scenes to ensure that events can go ahead. Things would be very tricky without this level of financial support – thank you!



It has been a very special last few weeks in school. Tuesday presented us with the opportunity to shine in Sports. What a fantastic Sports Day we had. Three full hours of KS1 and KS2 inclusive sports on both fields. I managed 12,000 steps just in watching everyone! It was great to see the competitive spirit, the encouragement for others and the absolute determination and









participation across the age groups. Thank you to Mr Jennings and the whole team for this inclusive yet competitive day. We await with anticipation Thursday's result.
