












Year 1


Reception have been drawing still life pictures as part of our Art project. We have been thinking about colours and shapes and have also been experimenting with colour mixing.








### In Reception, we are learning to write eve words

### A week in Nursery
























In English, Year 3 created a Role on the Wall for the Daughter in the book


