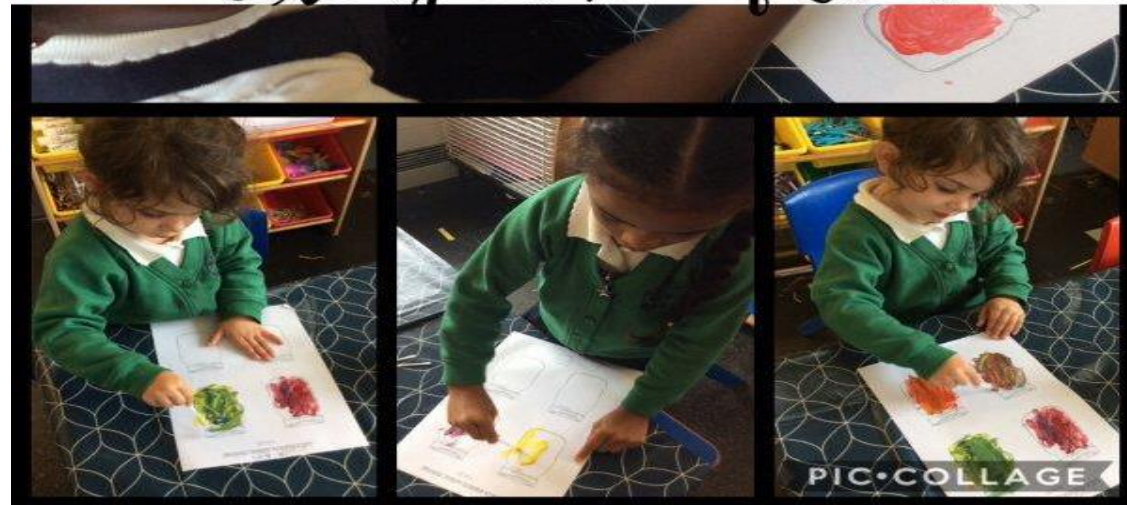
Reception have been drawing still life pictures as part of our Art project. We have been thinking about colours and shapes and have also been experimenting with colour mixing.
