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Dear Parents and Carers,

RE and Catholic Life

We started the year following the Church's season 'Care of Creation'. The children have thought about this as part of our Catholic Social Teaching and how this reflects on us here at St Vincent de Paul School and in the wider world. The children have produced some wonderful reflective work and we hope that this is mirrored in their everyday lives.

The school celebrated The Feast Day of St Vincent de Paul with balloons, buddy reading, art and fun activities for all. The children also took part in a singing session with Jasion (Mr J) one of the Choral Directors from Westminster. It was so successful that we have decided to continue with this on a weekly basis.

It's been great to see the return of the class assemblies. Year 5 and Year 4 (Bonafacio) have enjoyed performing to the whole school and parents. It can be incredibly nerve racking standing up and speaking, acting and singing to such a full hall. However, the children have performed with great enthusiasm and confidence and we are all so very proud of them.

Curriculum
