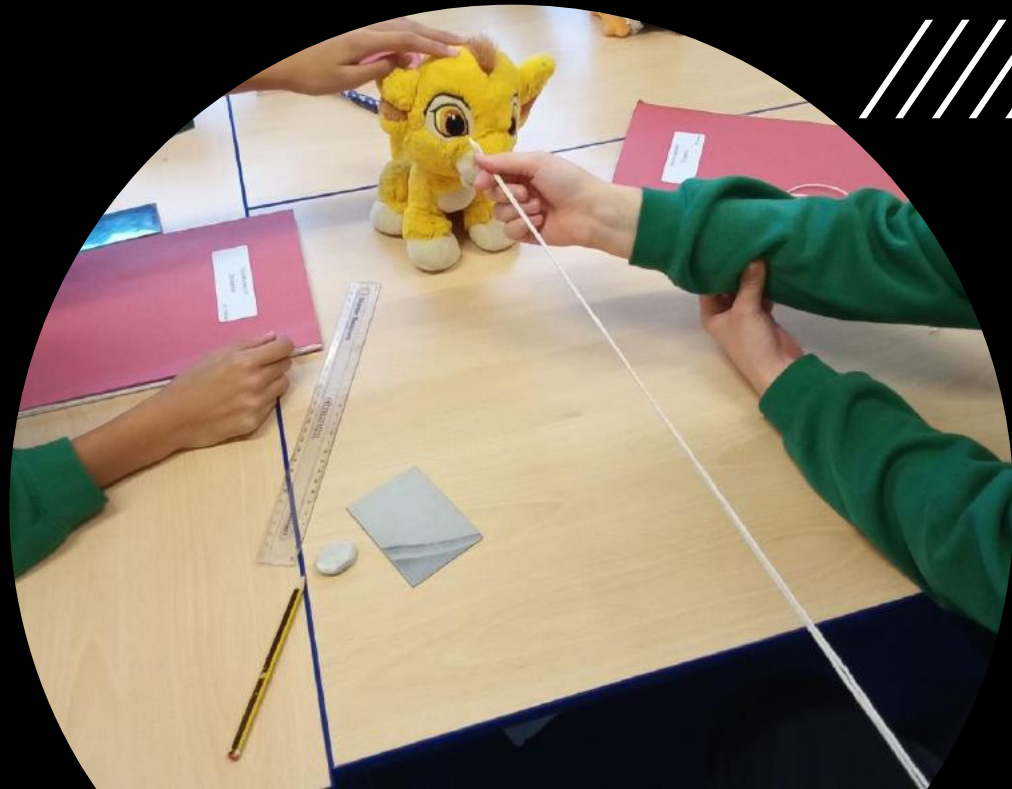
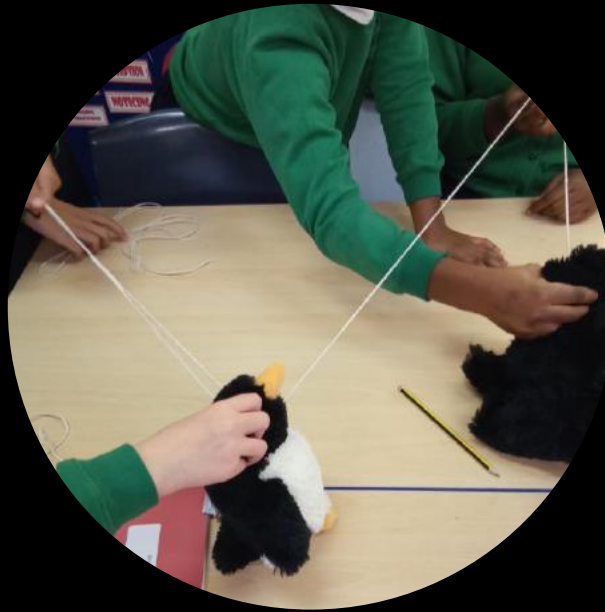


On Tuesday day Year 4 pupils were consolidating the passing skills they have built up over the past half term.

They have learned how effective a chest pass could be in Netball, Basketball or Bench ball. Great sportsmanship was later observed in 5-a-side games.

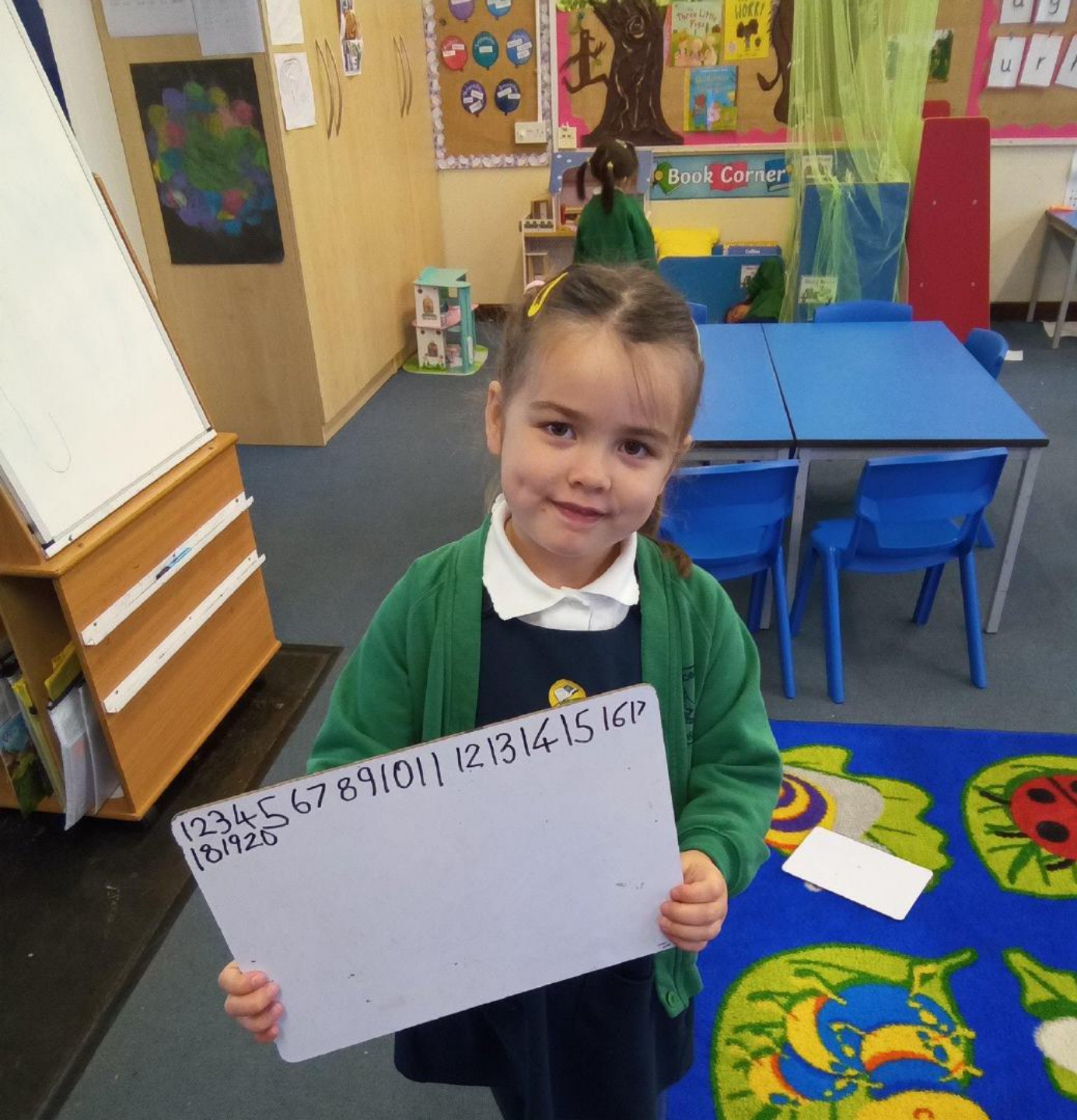


Year 6 have explored how we can see objects using toys and string to represent rays of light travelling from a light source and into the eye.

The children in Reception observed the changing seasons this week and created these beautiful autumn tree paintings, mixing red and yellow to make orange.

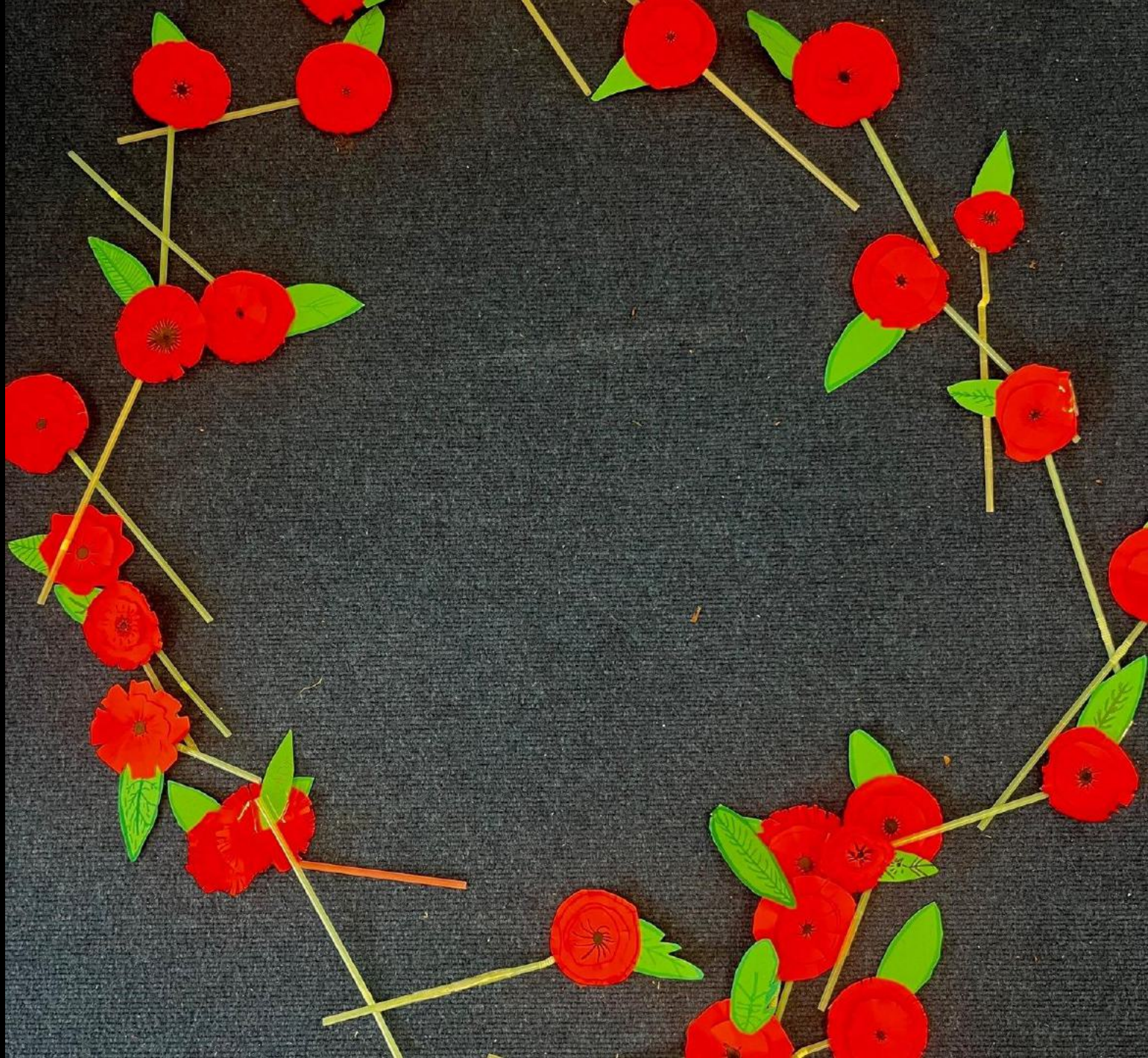
