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Class Information Letter **Year 4 Spring 2024**

Welcome back to school after the Christmas break and thank you for ensuring your child was well prepared for the beginning of the new term. We were very pleased to see them, and they are all settling back into our established routines in Year 4. Here are just a few gentle reminders we would like to bring to your attention again.

Behaviour and Rewards

Our school uses the Hertfordshire Steps approach which supports a therapeutic ethos, early intervention and professional responses to complex, challenging or high-risk behaviours. We have developed three universal school rules which each class has spent time exploring and these are:

- Be ready
- Be safe
- Be respectful

In Year 4 Bonifacio, children are rewarded with positive praise and table points which can earn the table extra playtime on a Friday. We will also choose a 'Star of the week' which will receive a certificate. Behaviour that exceeds our expectations will now be rewarded with a 'Wow' Award which you will receive in the post. This marks impeccable behaviour from a child based on our three school rules. **PLEASE NOTE THAT TOYS ARE NOT PERMITTED IN SCHOOL UNLESS AGREED WITH A MEMBER OF STAFF AND LINKS TO A SPECIFIC NEED.**

Home Learning

Home learning tasks will be set using Purple Mash for Spellings and TT Rockstars for times tables. Please see the home learning book for a breakdown of tasks. Our Google Classroom is accessible via the following link: <https://classroom.google.com/> All children will be provided with their own log ins and passwords which will be in their reading record books. If your child needs a reminder, please contact us.

Reading continues to be an important focus and we are keen that the children read as much as possible, both out loud to an adult and silently to themselves. The class page on the school website has links to recommended reading books for our class. As the children progress with their reading it becomes more important to question them about the text they are reading, the types of grammar and punctuation in the sentences and the authors choice of vocabulary. As far as possible, please ensure that your child reads at home four times a week to develop both their reading and comprehension skills.



General information:

Water Bottle & snacks: All children are encouraged to drink plenty of water during the day, therefore, please supply your child with a refillable sports top water bottle; this must **ONLY** contain water. Many children also bring a fruit or vegetable snack to eat at morning break. The only jewellery permitted in school is one small pair of ear studs (please remove for PE days), and an inexpensive watch. Long hair must be tied back during school hours.

PE and Swimming kit

Please ensure pupils are dressed in the correct and appropriate PE kit on our PE days (Tuesdays). Pupils should be able to do PE indoors or outdoors on this day and therefore require suitable kit linked to the weather forecast. Also, please ensure that pupils have their swimming kit in school on a Wednesday. Many pupils have missed sessions for various reasons and should only be if a child has a condition, such as an ear infection, where a doctor has advised for the pupil not to go into the water. This is also part of the curriculum and need to be assessed on a consistent basis.

Plimsolls and indoor shoes: All pupils must have a pair of well-fitted indoor shoes in school. Please ensure all clothing and personal items are named.

Pick up procedures – keeping everyone safe.

Thank you for your continued compliance and patience for the safe arrival and leaving procedures at school. Also, please ensure you are punctual with regards to pick up times.
