




Year One were very excited about their STEM workshop on materials. There was lots to explore and we particularly enjoyed testing the materials to see how much light shone through.






This week, the children in Reception explored the number 7.

This week in Reception, the children have observed what would happen to the Gingerbread Man if he got wet. They have designed and tested boats to help him to cross the river safely.

































Year 2 scientists at work enjoying learning about the properties of materials, thanks to the STEM science workshop

Everybody did really well and had fun!!!




Year 2 have been learning about Jesus' miracle of feeding five thousand people with only five loaves and two fish.




The Reception children have been enjoying learning through play in the outdoor area.











## Child initiated learning in Reception

























Year 5 learning to write music for our Djembe.





















Multiplying and dividing by 10 using a Place Value grid in Year 4

4DA drafting and editing their written work.








In Year 1 English lessons we have been writing sentences to retell the beginning, middle and end of the story 'Pet Potato.'

Mrs. Lawlor is extremely proud of all the hard work and fantastic writing!
















Watch Year 3 singing this beautiful song to celebrate Candlemas on Friday, remembering that Jesus is the light of the world.


