

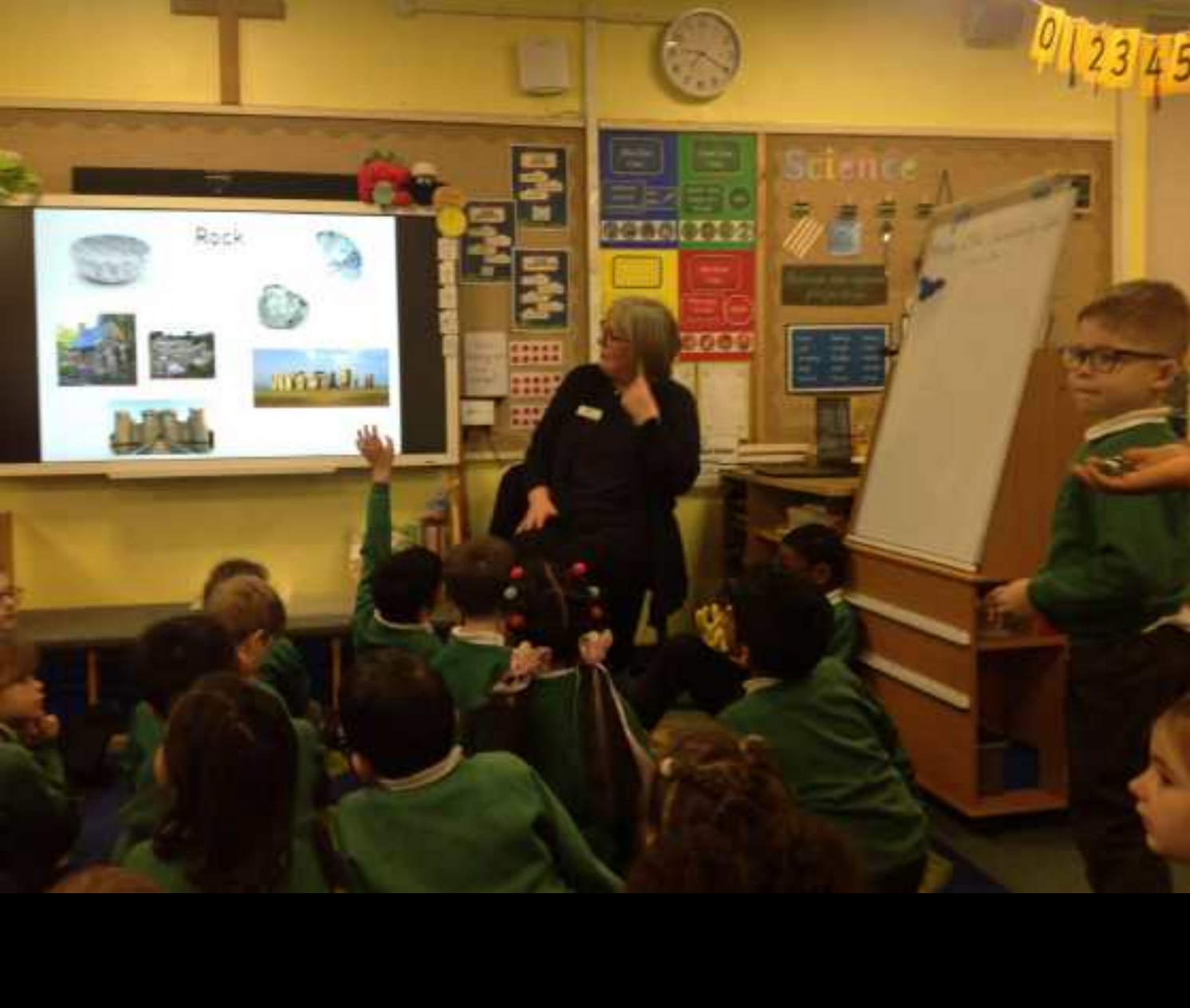


PUPIL POST

Year One were very excited about their STEM workshop on materials. There was lots to explore and we particularly enjoyed testing the materials to see how much light shone through.

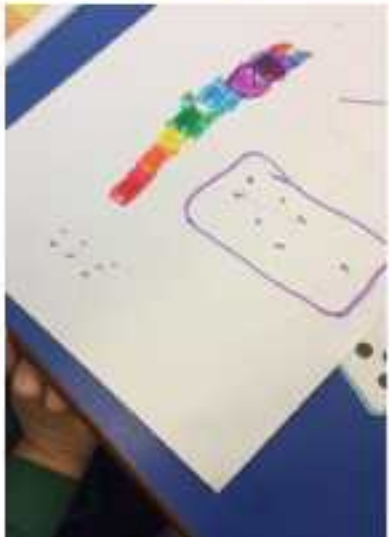

Take a look at what we found out.



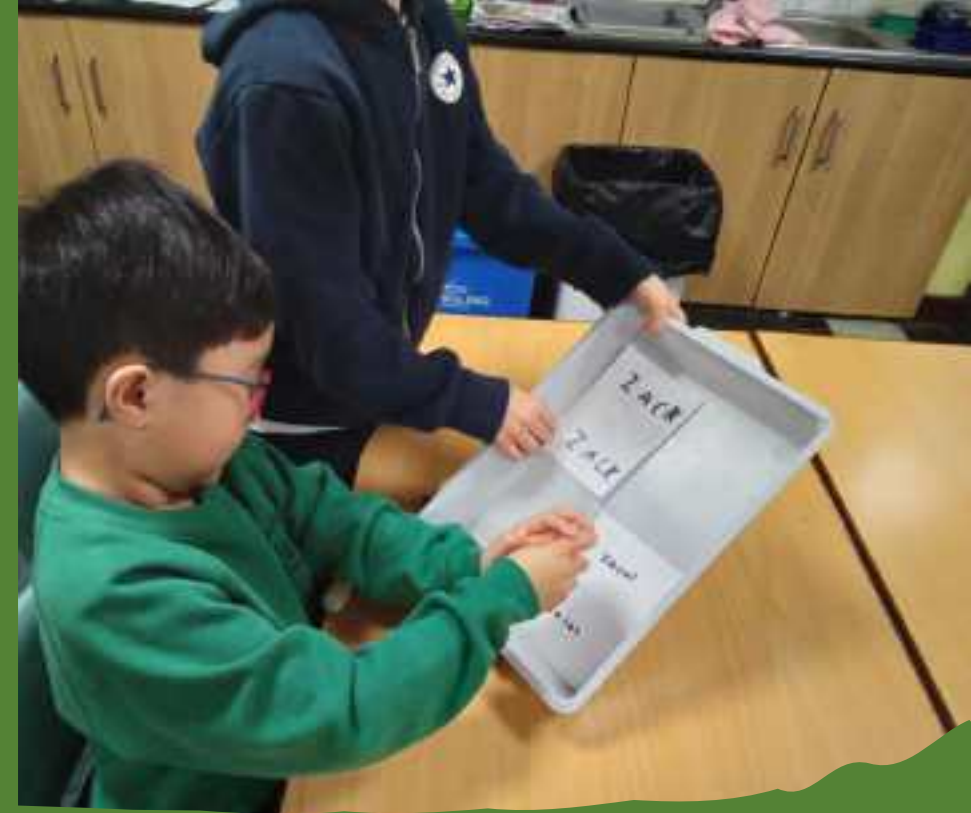


4DA proved that a solid such as flour doesn't take up all the space in a container by pouring in water.

This week in Reception, the children have observed what would happen to the Gingerbread Man if he got wet. They have designed and tested boats to help him to cross the river safely.



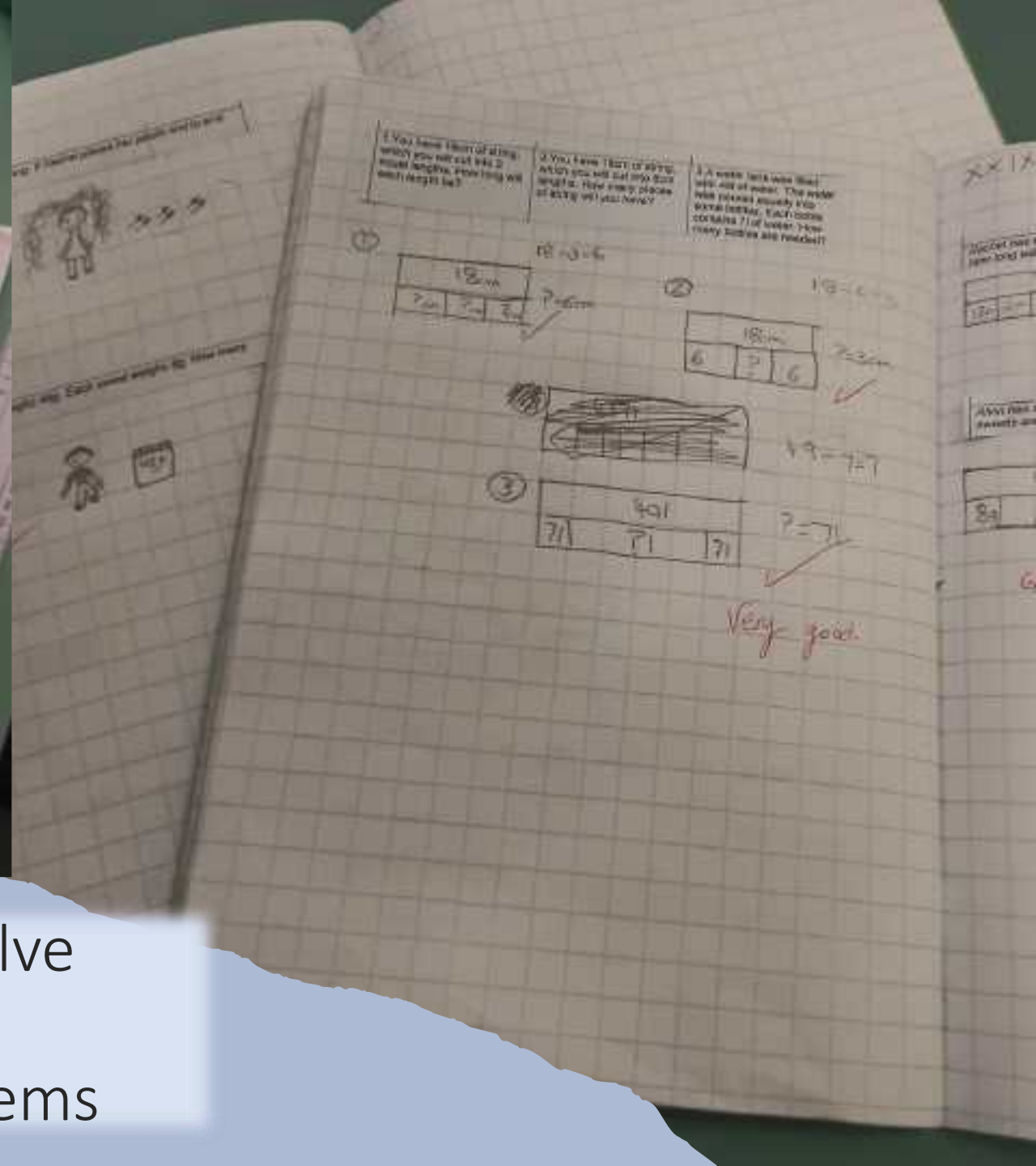
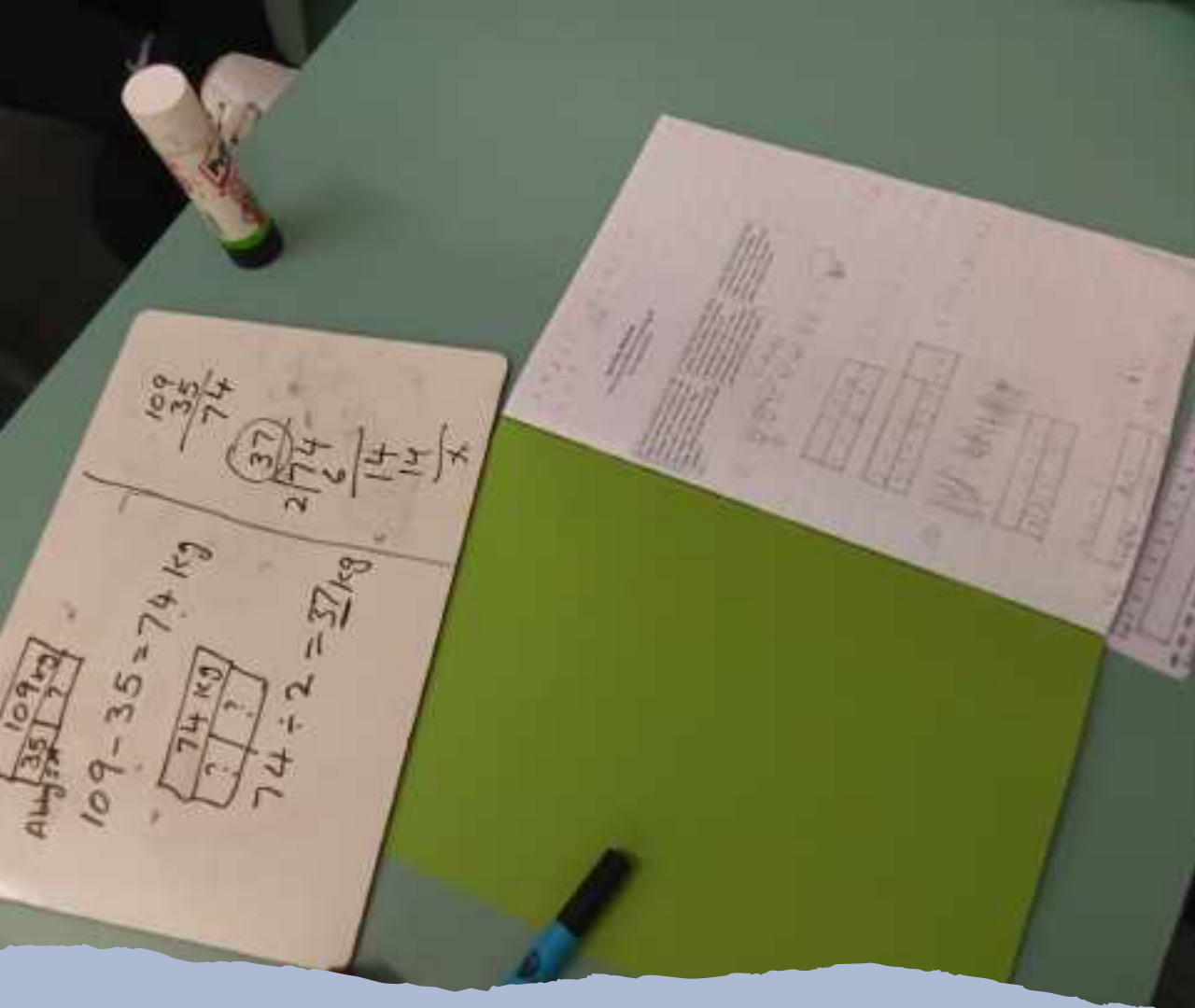




Year 2 also had a wonderful morning with the STEM workshop. The class learnt about the properties of different materials, including how to waterproof a material.

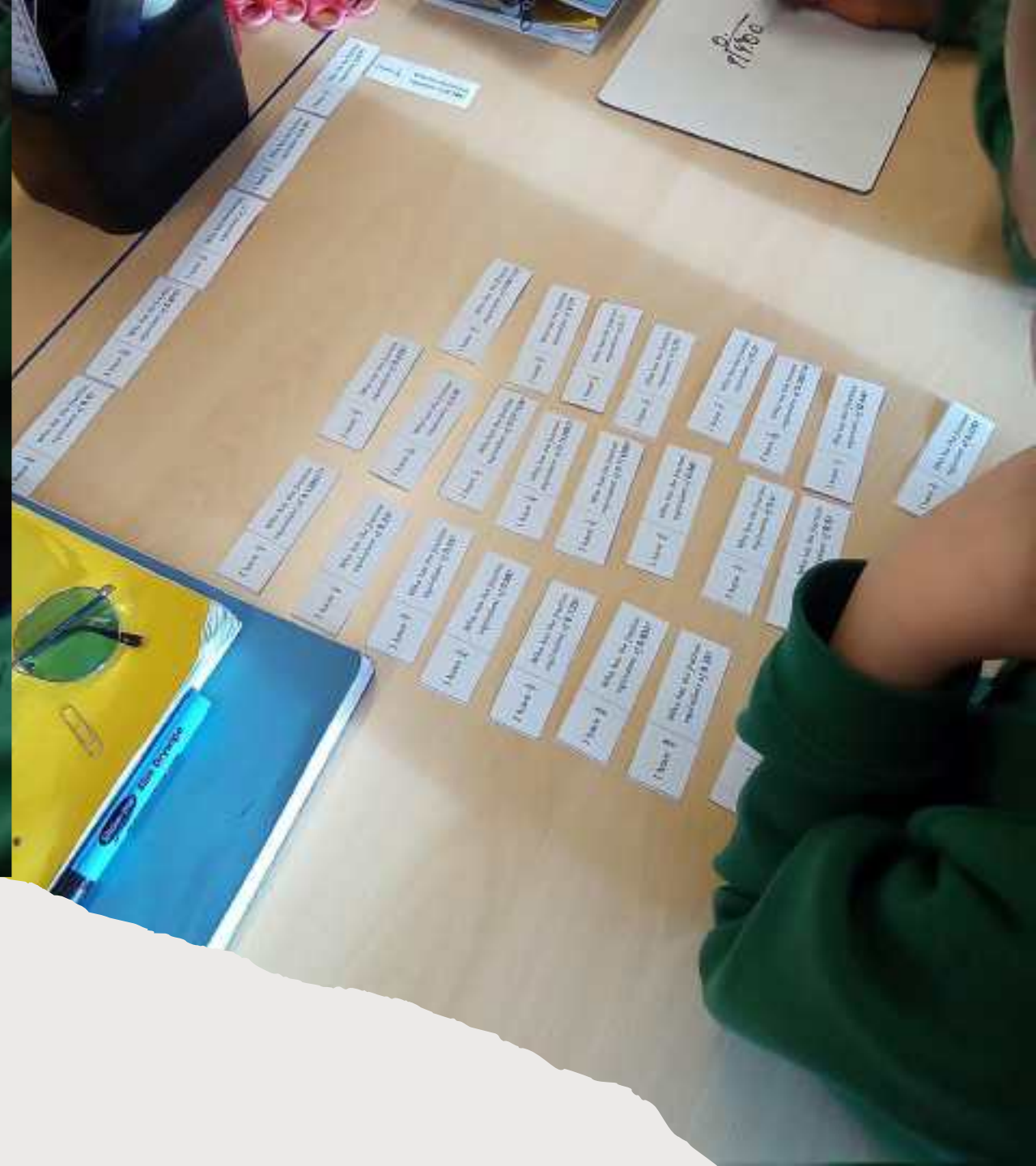
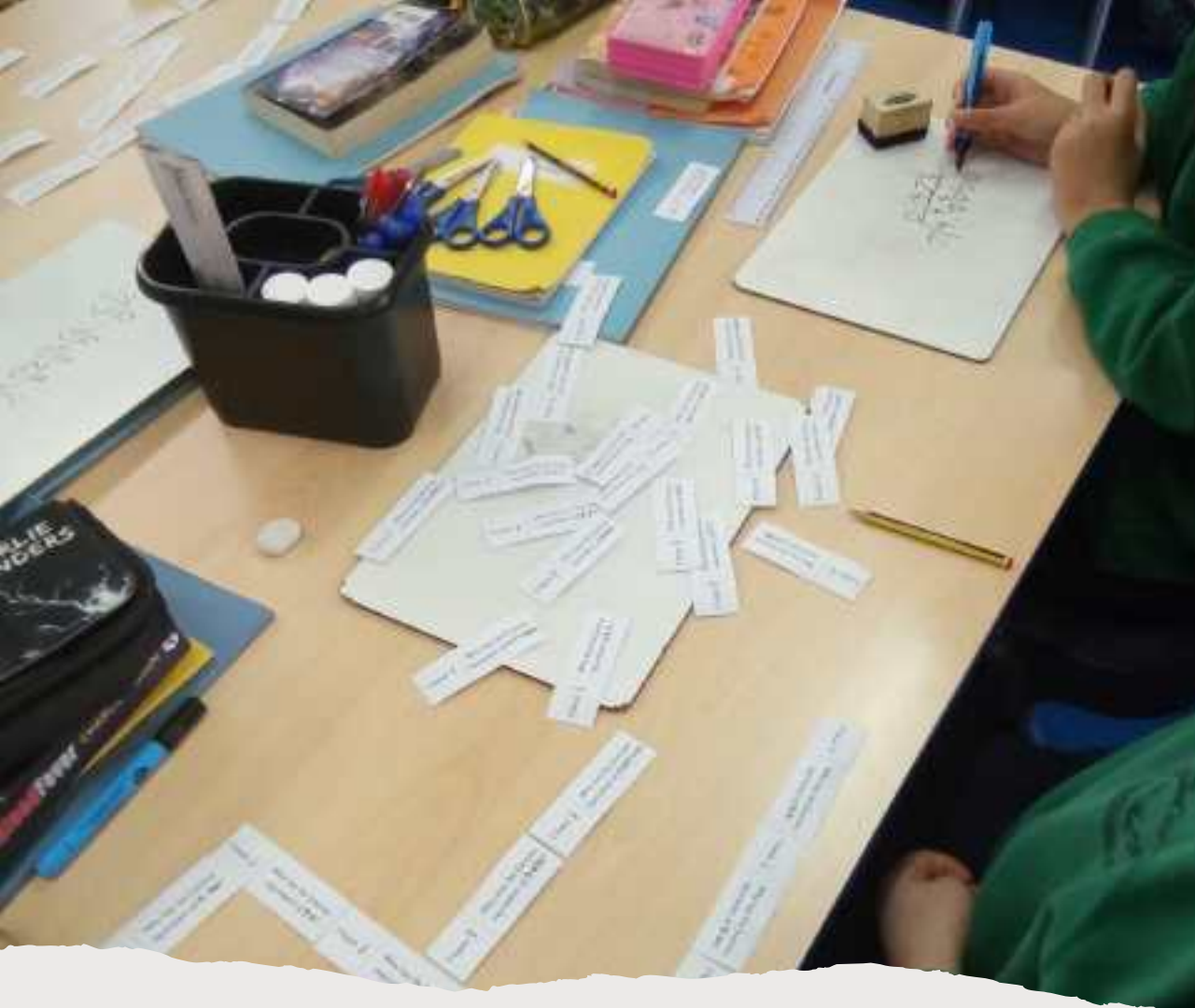


Year One have had fun learning about Baptism and seeing the many special mementos shared by our families.

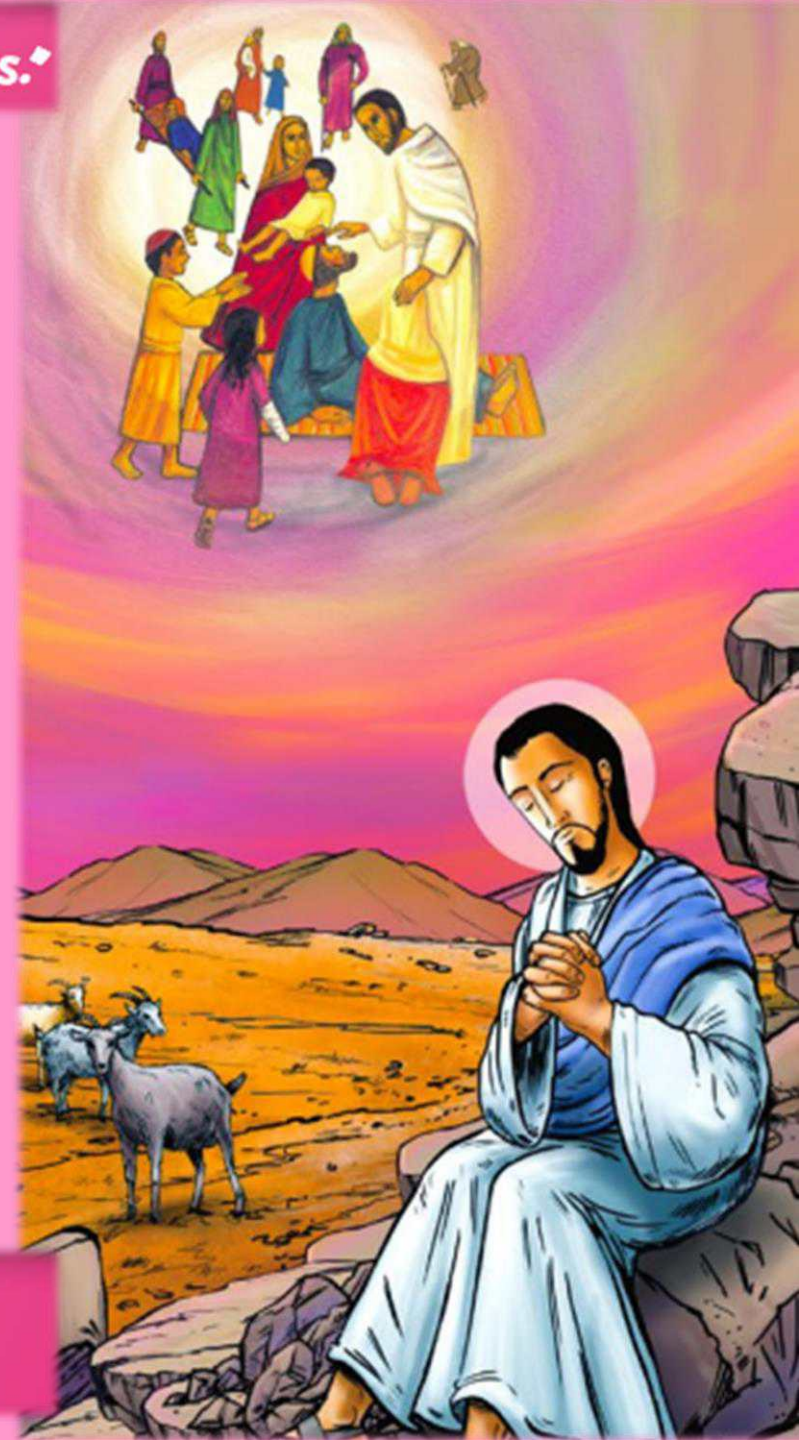
