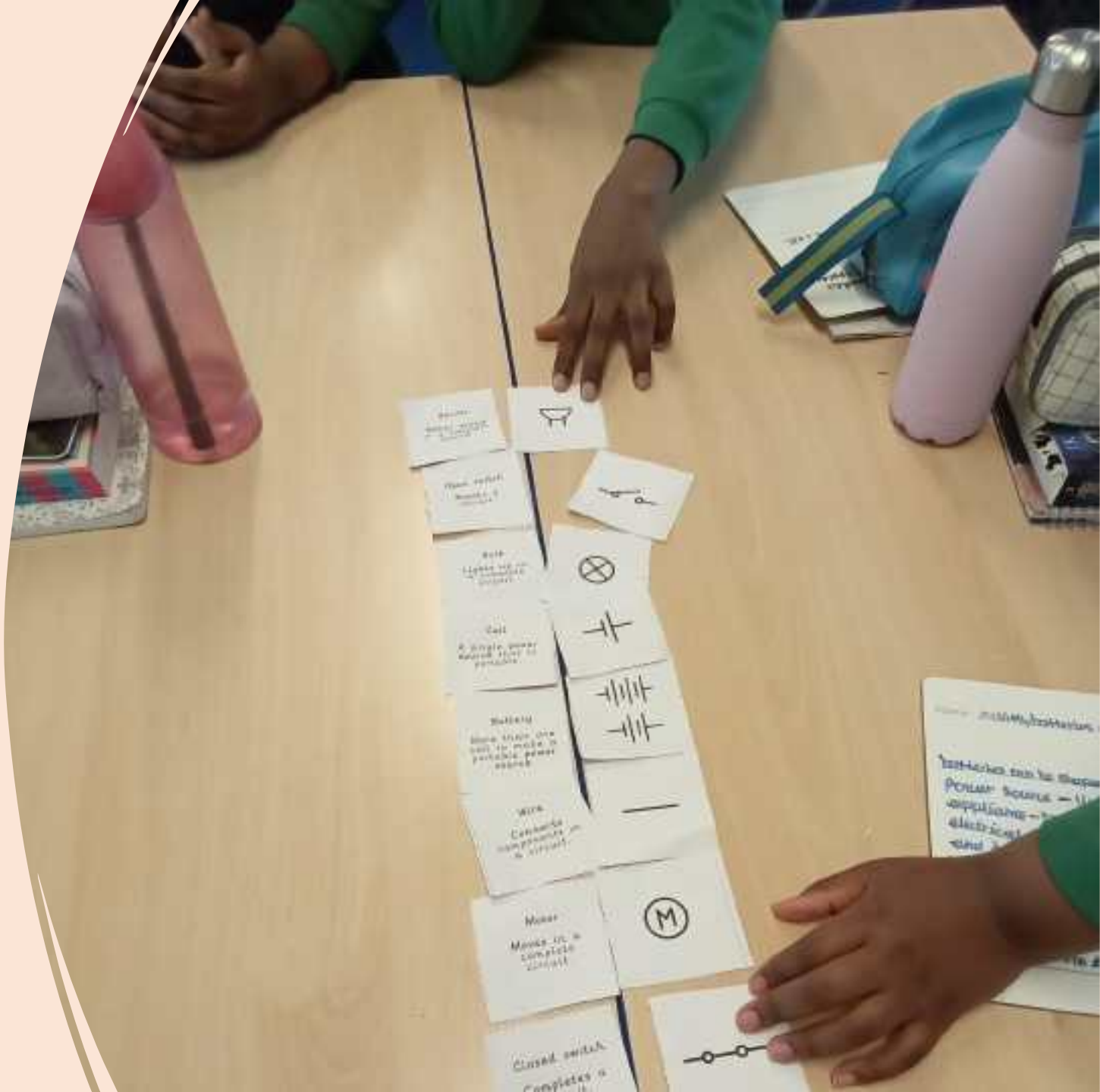

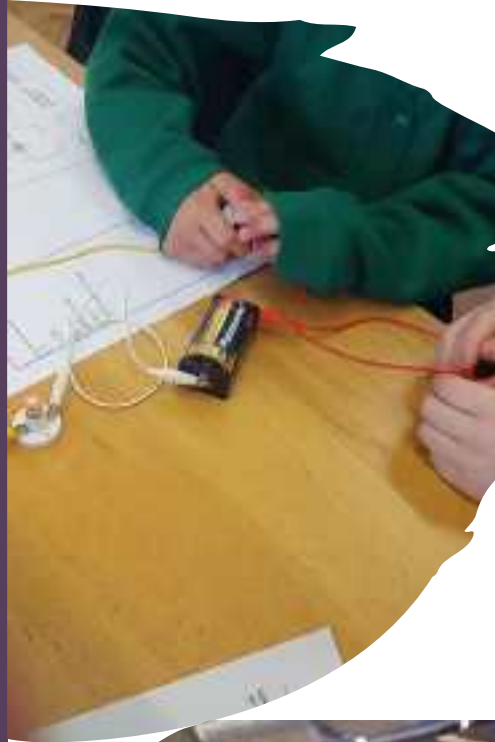

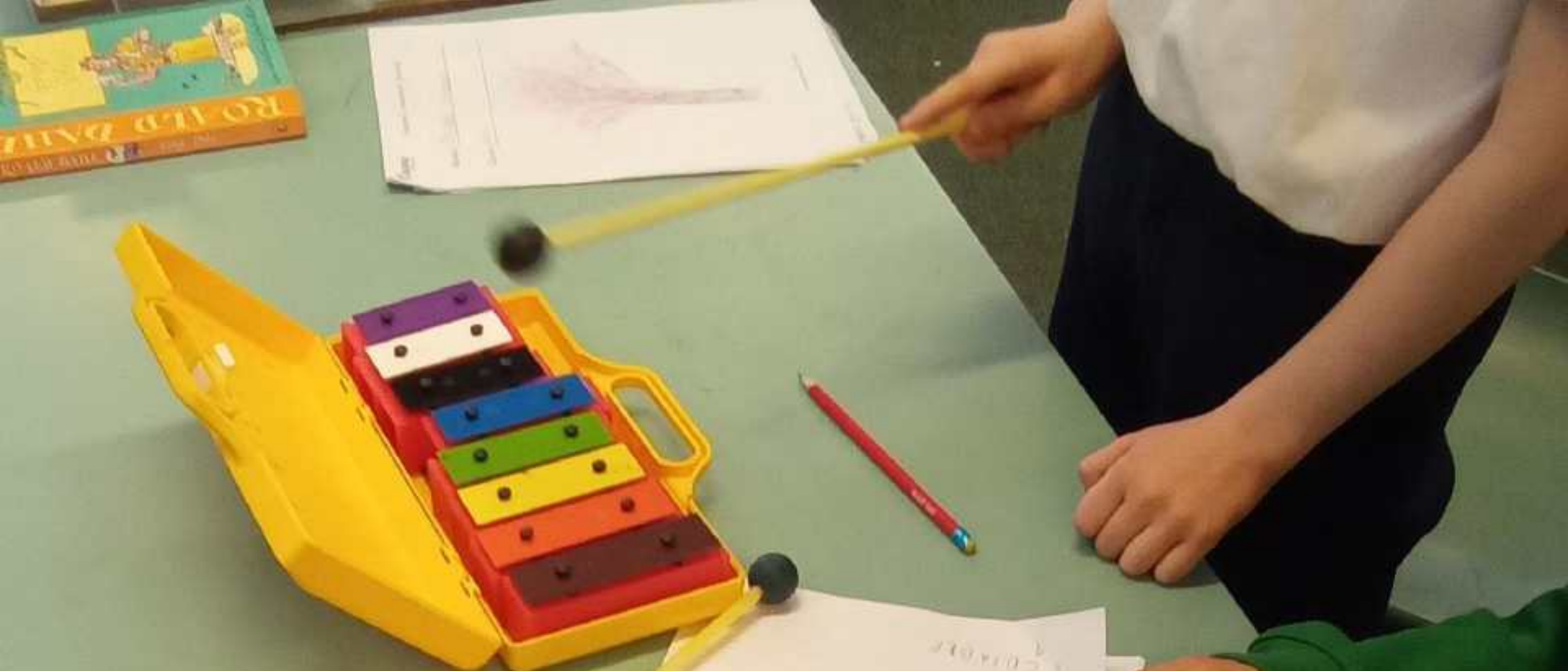




The children in Reception enjoyed exploring their new garden centre role play and started to think about their new topic

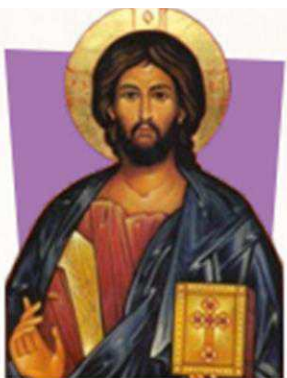
All plants priced at £2.50

A Word from
Pope Francis

"Dear young people, may you always live the faith with enthusiasm."



Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple there he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and money changers sitting at their counters. Now the Temple Jesus was talking about was his own body. And later when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered what he had told them.
