

We have learned a new letter, 'o'; had a PE session with Mr. Jennings; made 'Creation' pictures and produced collections of 3 objects.
































Year 5 started their Clarinet journey on Tuesday!



They had great fun learning to play the clarinet. We are looking forward to their concert at Christmas.














This week the Nursery children received an invitation to visit 'The Red Shed' to meet Freda the tortoise. We also said hello to a retired headteacher called Margaret.





Year 5 started a link with the CIEC PROJECT.

We separated a solid and liquid by using filtration. We used 4 filters to see which filter produced the clearest water.


























Nursery children have been enjoying the story 'Owl Babies'. We have also been watching a BBC clip of two owlets hatching and growing.




























It's been a busy week in Reception.

They have enjoyed exploring and learning in the outdoor area this week, despite the wet weather!










Year 3 getting ready for our St Vincent de Paul feast day Mass on Friday.






Year 5 Teresa has been learning about the life and mission of Saint Vincent de Paul.



Year One enjoyed celebrating the many different countries in our community.


We talked about belonging and communities.


A Word from Pope Francis \*Let us allow God to fill our hearts with his goodness. A good example brings about so much good. Goodness always tends to spread.\*
