










Y6 Shakespeare were busy enjoying their rounding games on Monday morning in their maths lesson!

Some very strategic thinking was going on to make the greatest value number.









Year 1 reflected on God's creation and worked together to produce a frieze of land and water animals.





















This week we enjoyed and explored God's wonderful world. Do you know that when we close our eyes, it heightens your hearing?


















Y6 Shakespeare have been listening to and learning about the hymn, "When I needed a neighbour".


We linked this to Scripture and looked at ways in which Jesus showed love to all people, regardless of their ethnicity or beliefs.




People were bringing little children to be with Jesus. The disciples turned them away, but when Jesus saw this he was annoyed and said to them, "Let the little children
