The children in nursery enjoyed a game of Traffic Lights.


They followed simple rules based on colours and made groups of three and four when the light turned red. Lots of fun!




















### The Nursery were busy on Tuesday.













This week, our Reception children explored the magic of music! They listened to pieces with different tempos and let their creativity flow, painting along to the rhythm.






















Nursery children on their winter wellies walk.
















Our Reception children have been exploring number bonds to 5, using 5 little speckled frogs to help them!

### They had a fantastic time baking biscuits.





















































Year 2 enjoyed investigating how objects move.

They made linkages in their DT lesson this week.




Making images with tangrams in Year 1.

Mr. Kevin Bonavia, urging him to help!







## In Nursery we have been learning about the word HOPE.
































They enjoyed painting the emblem for the Jubilee year of Hope and having a visit from Fr. Robert!!


