










Year 1 composing numbers from 6 to 10 using 5 and tens frames.

We had to work collaboratively as a group and it even involved us being deer.







Ash Wednesday in the Nursery preparing our Lenten Promise Tree. Lent time is purple time-a time to wait for lesus.




Nursery children are continuing to explore their environment and practise their skills. (Can you count to ten before you leave the wobble board?) "I can count to ten!"

A Word from "Lent is a 'powerful' season, a turning point that can foster change in Pope Francis each of us. Let us deny ourselves something every day to help others."




