










Year 4DA were trying to sequence correctly the story of Goldilocks and the three bears in French as one of their activities.













Saint Joseph - Loving Father










This week we celebrated the feast of St Joseph.

A Word from Pope Francis


"Lent helps us fight against any of our faults. We all can improve and change for the better."
