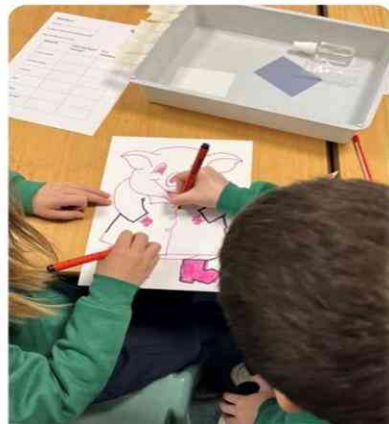

make them waterproof.



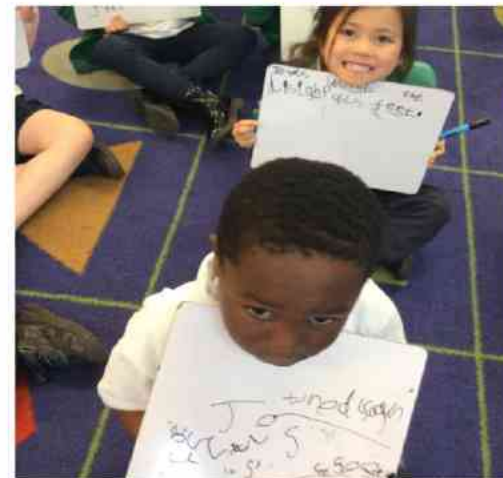
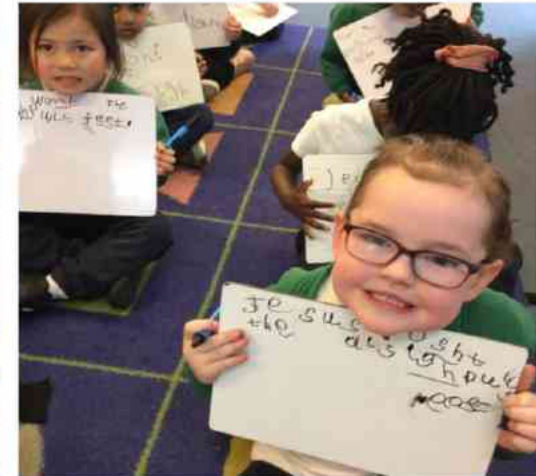
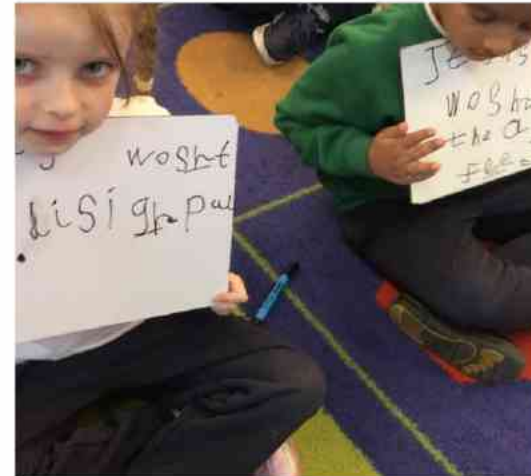
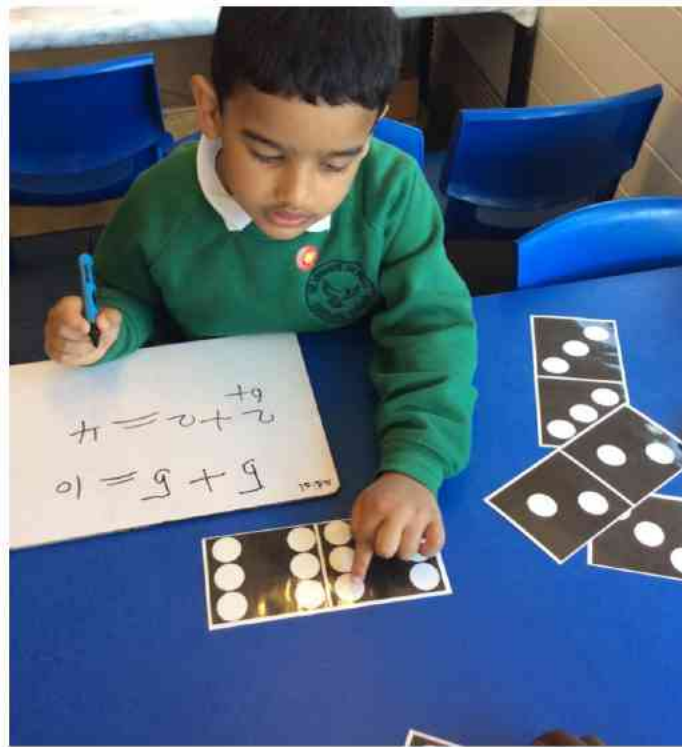

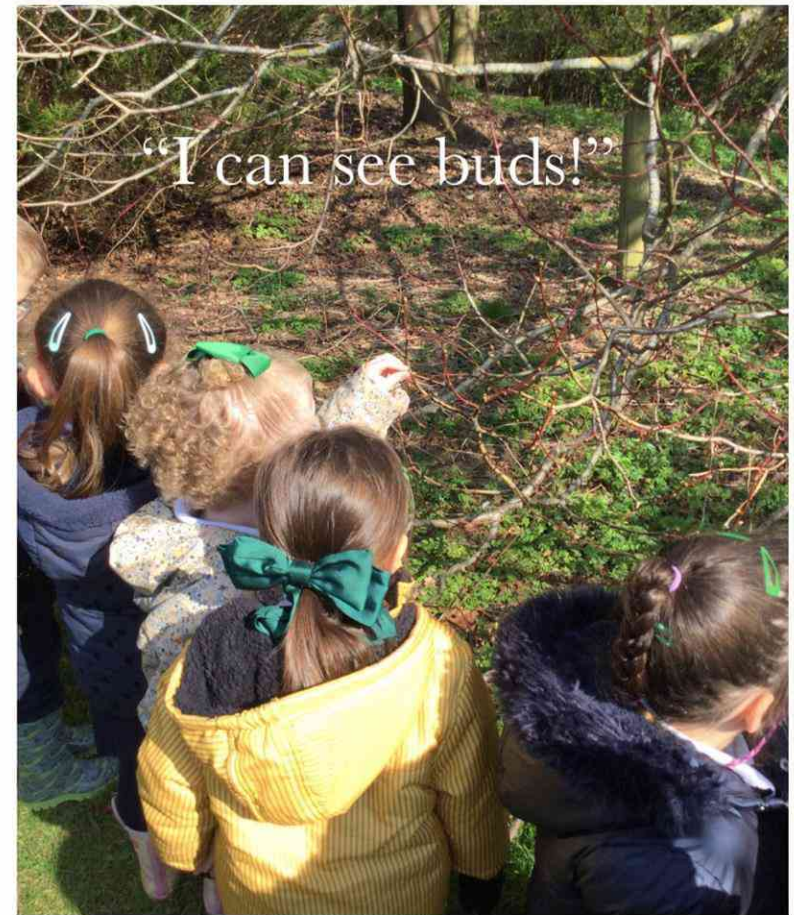
The children in Reception have been doing some great learning this week.



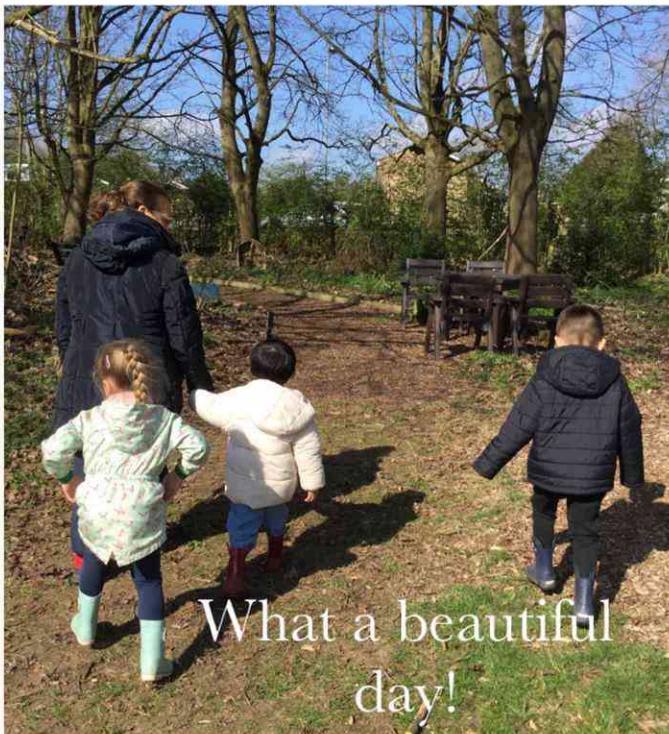
Reception children exploring odd and even numbers through the number blocks!



What a beautiful day for a wellie walk on Wednesday morning ... and even more glorious in the afternoon!



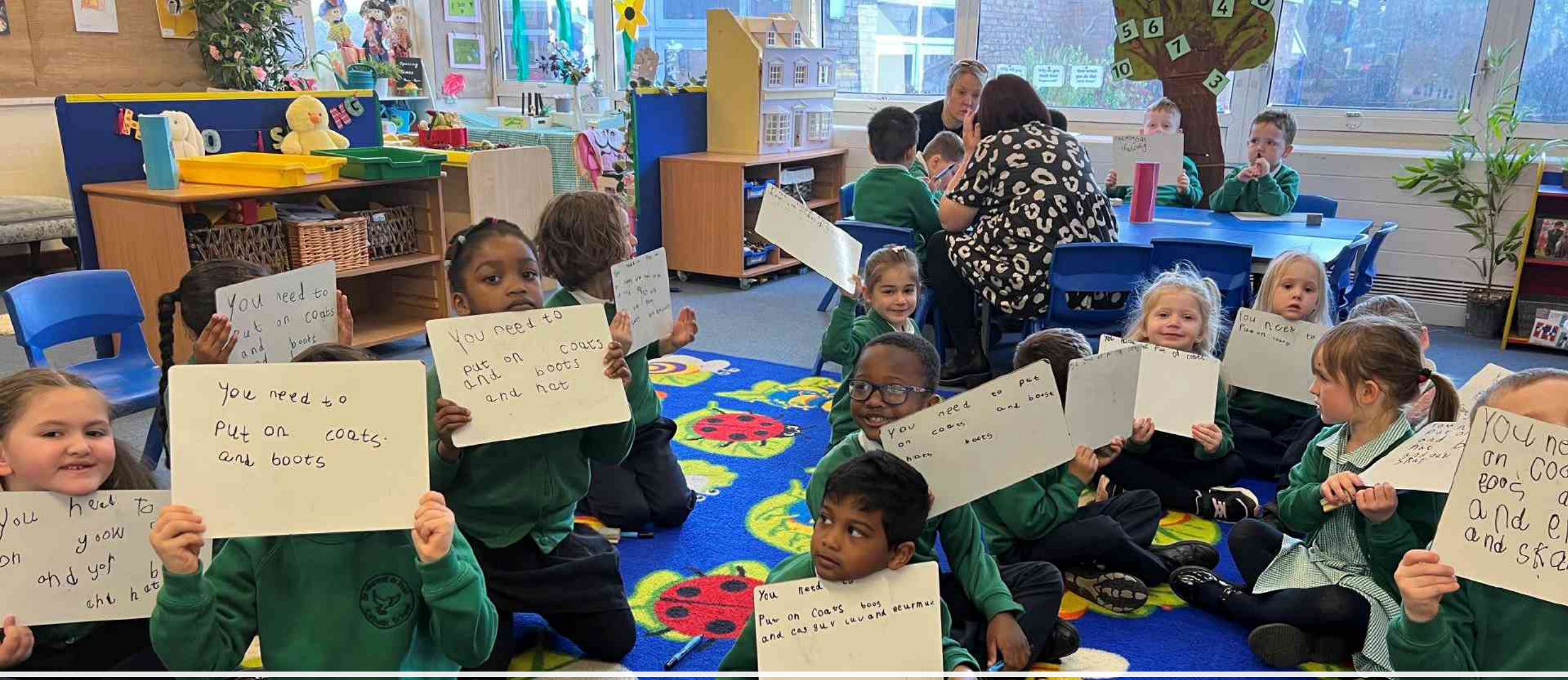




We were invited to visit the Red Shed garden, where we sang 'Happy Birthday' to a lady named Dee.

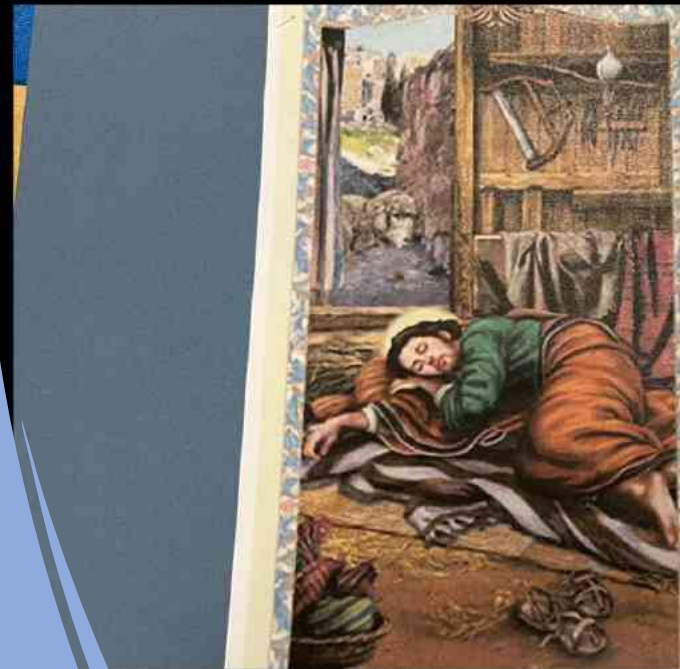
In PSHE,
