

Back in the classroom on Tuesday, the Reception children were hard at work, exploring, playing, writing and sorting.


























# Lots of energy in Nursery class! Watch here:

































Year One is beginning our new science topic, an introduction to plants.






They took part in mindfulness, outdoor play, listening to music, and made their own prayer beads - learning fun ways to care for their wellbeing.

























Year 6 had a great time at tag rugby on Friday morning.




In Science, Year 4 were grouping different vertebrates and invertebrates.








