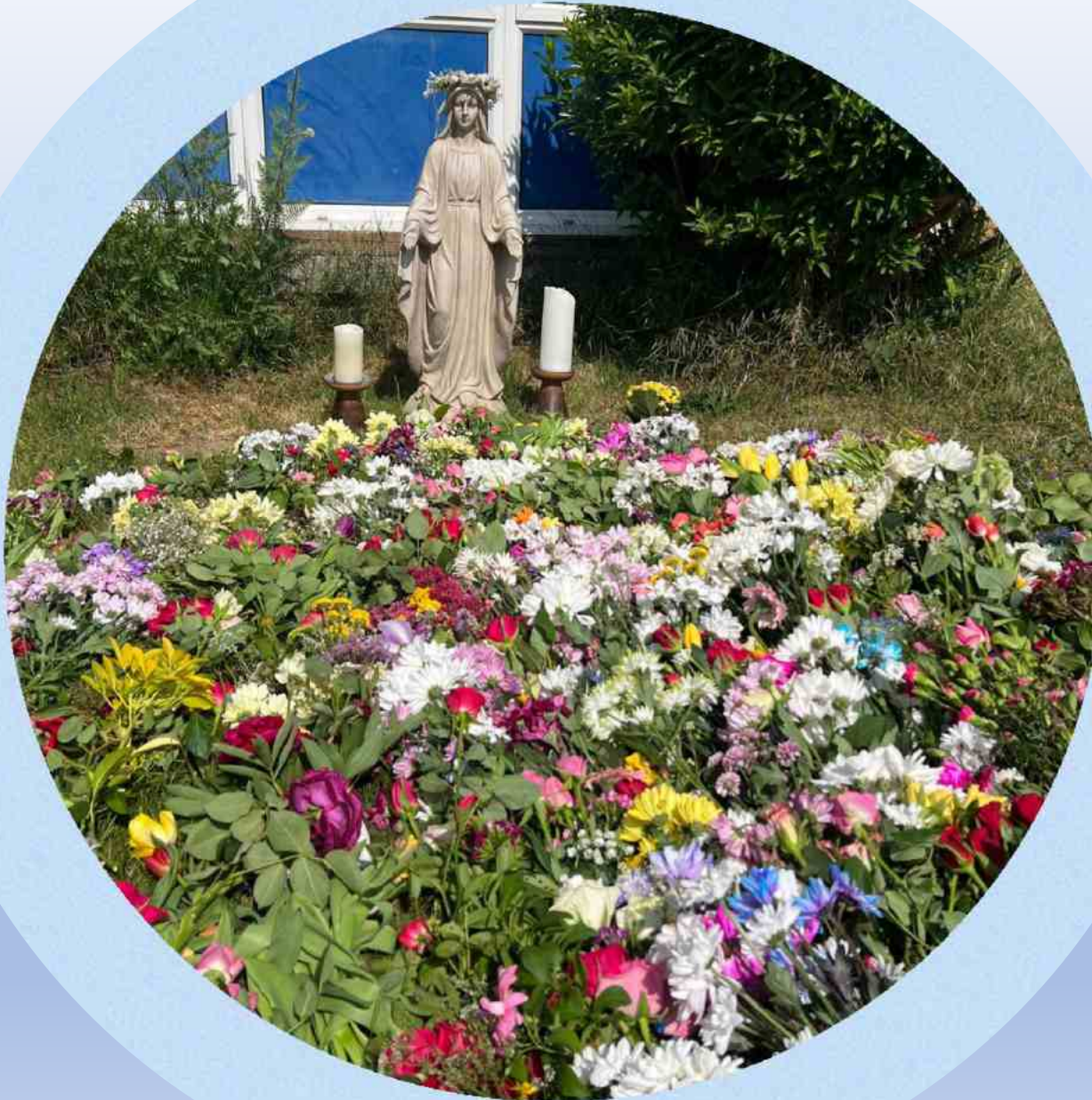

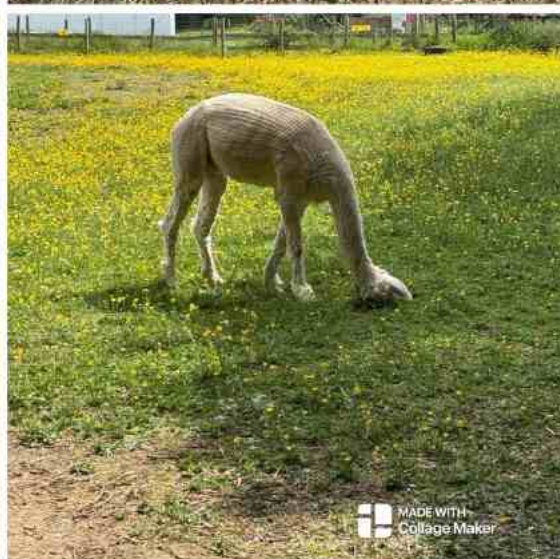

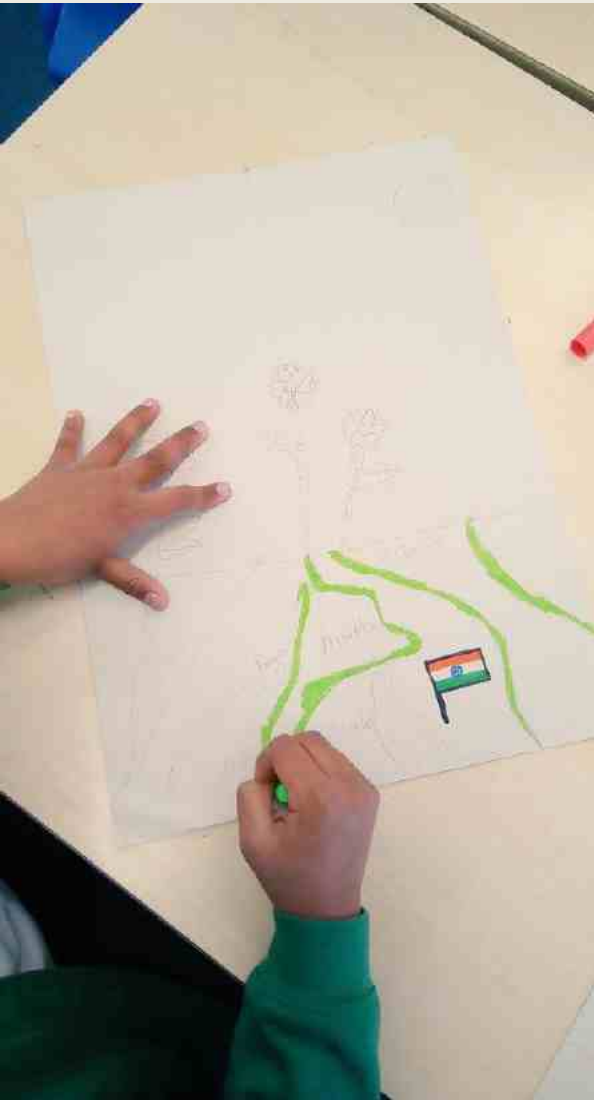


Y6SC had a great time in their rowing session with FITKIDZ.

They were learning the skills of rowing by playing a fish game before testing how far they could row in a minute!



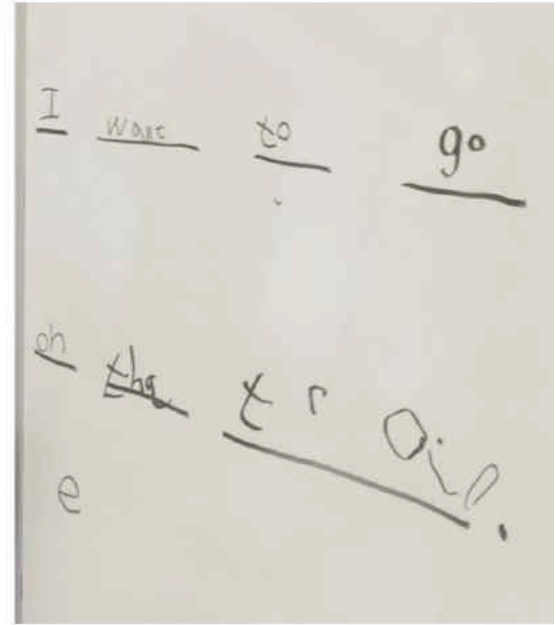
As part of children's mental health week, Year 3 have been learning about themselves, reflecting on the roots of their identity and what helps them grow.

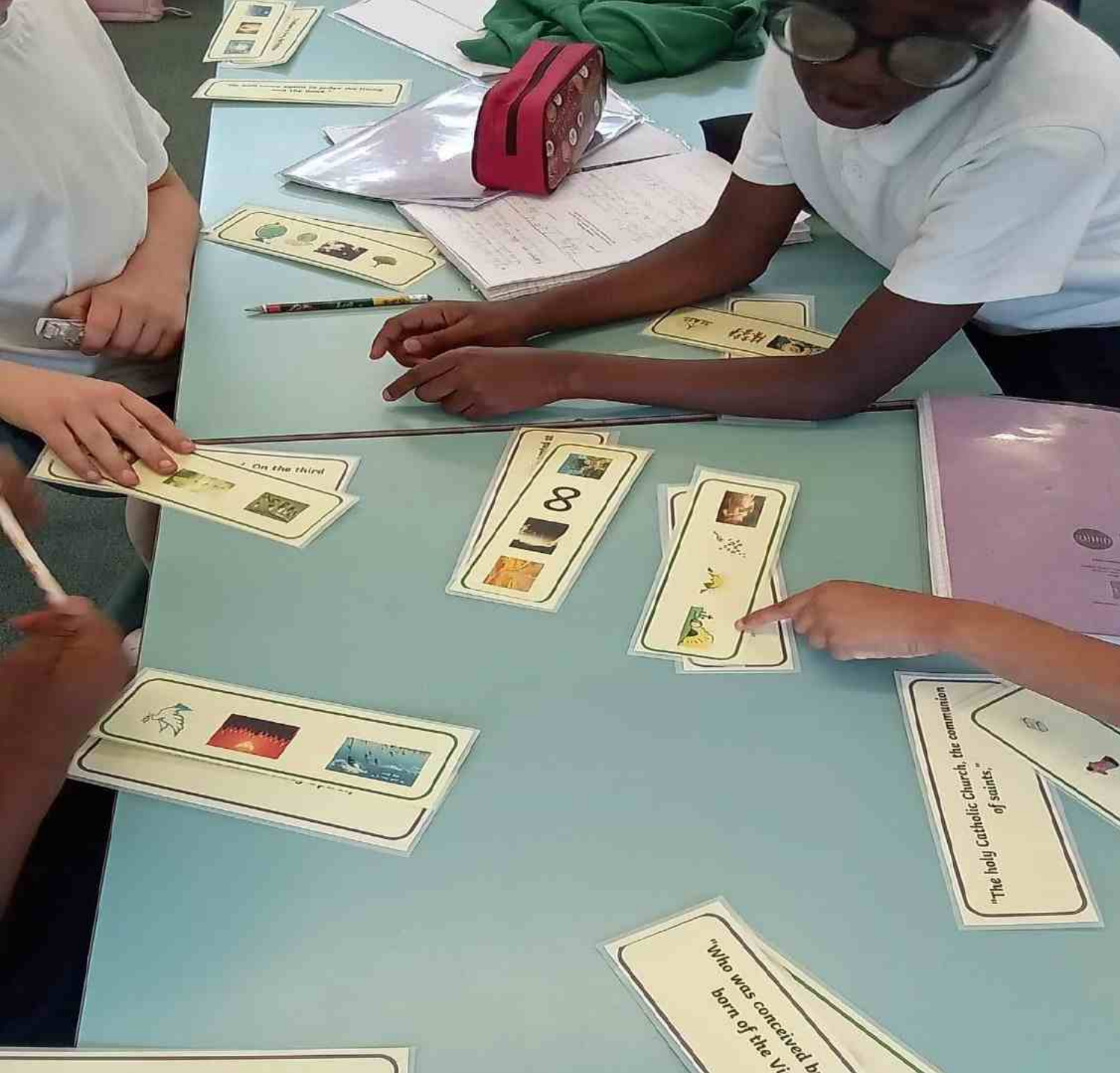




Y6MF had a transition workshop and did some drama to explore different scenarios







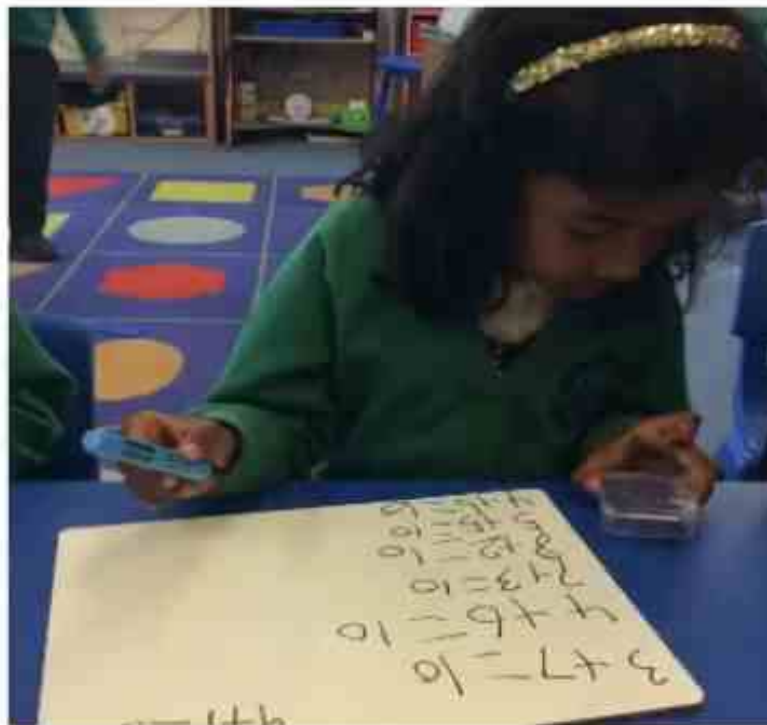
Year 4DA were learning about The Apostles Creed and linked statements from The Creed to what they symbolise for us as Catholics.

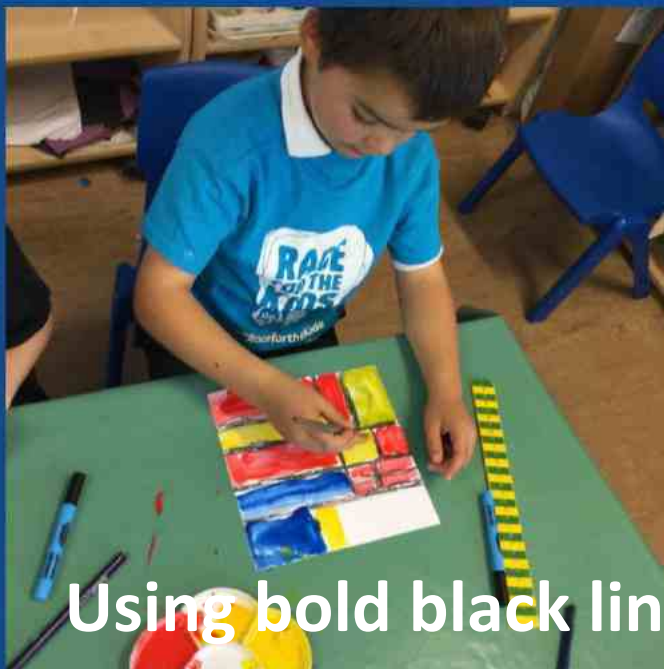

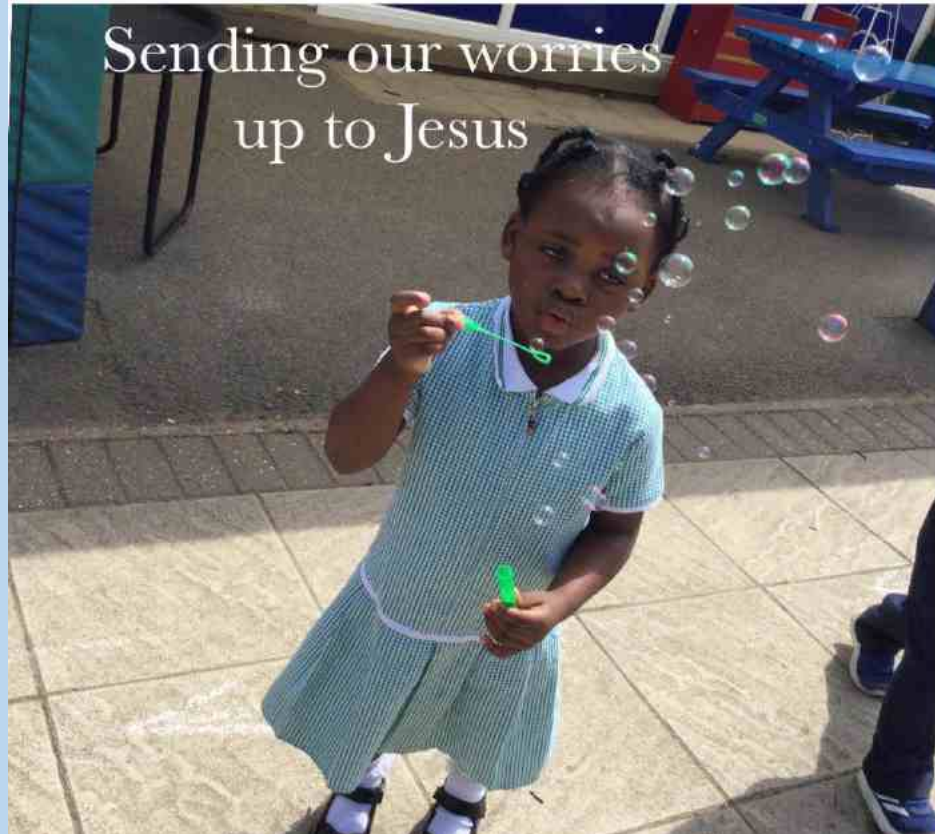

Year 6 had a great time at tag rugby on Friday morning.

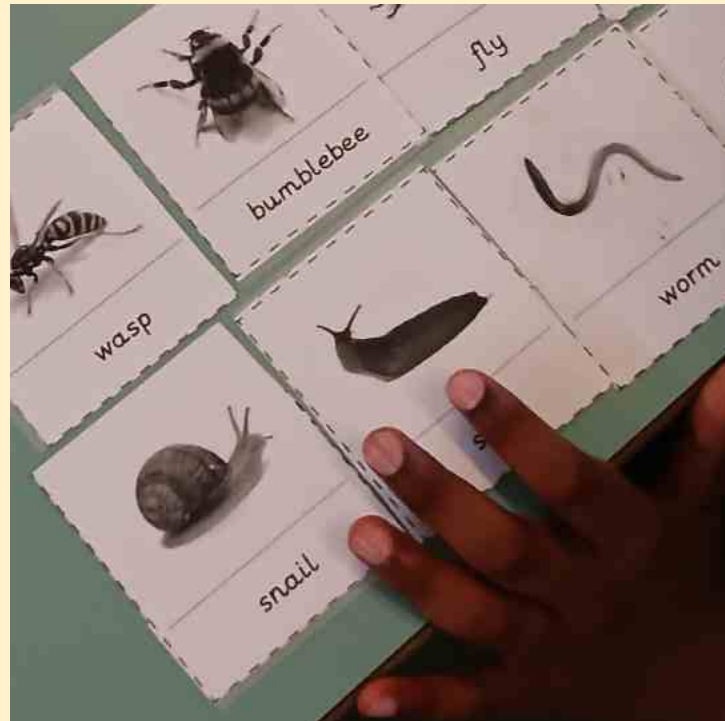
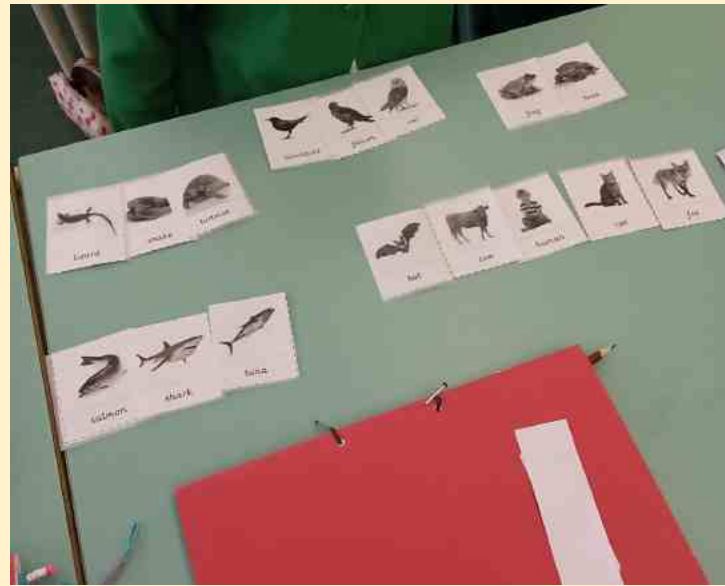


**Year One had a great time learning cricket skills.

In Science, Year 4 were grouping different vertebrates and invertebrates.

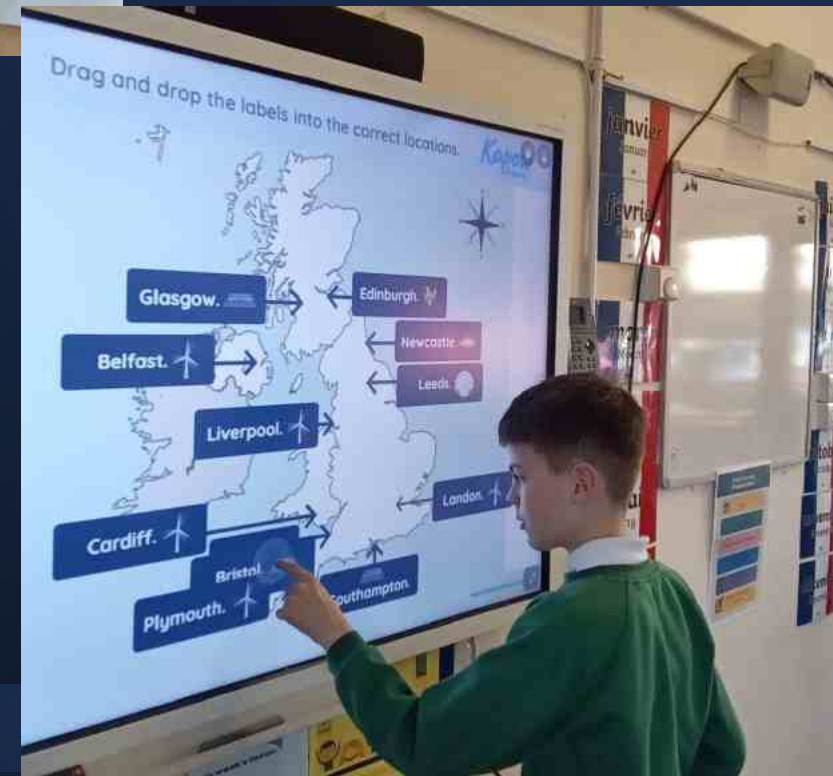

"Let's promote friendship and respect between people of different religious traditions in order to build a world of peace." Pope Francis

Jesus said to his disciples, "Those who love me will listen to my words and keep them, and my Father will love them, and we shall come to them and make our home with them. Those who do not love me do not keep my words. And my word is not my own: it is the word of the Father who sent me. I have said these things to you while still with you; but the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all the things I have said to you. Peace I leave to you, my own peace I give to you, a peace the world cannot give, this is my gift to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid. I am going away, and shall return. I am going to the Father."
