We tried on helmets, sat in their car, beeped the horn & listened to the sirens!



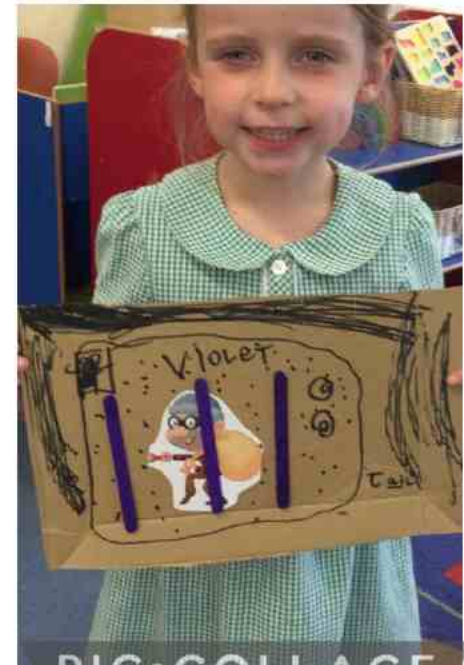

It's been fun, and we have learnt so much about God's wonderful world.

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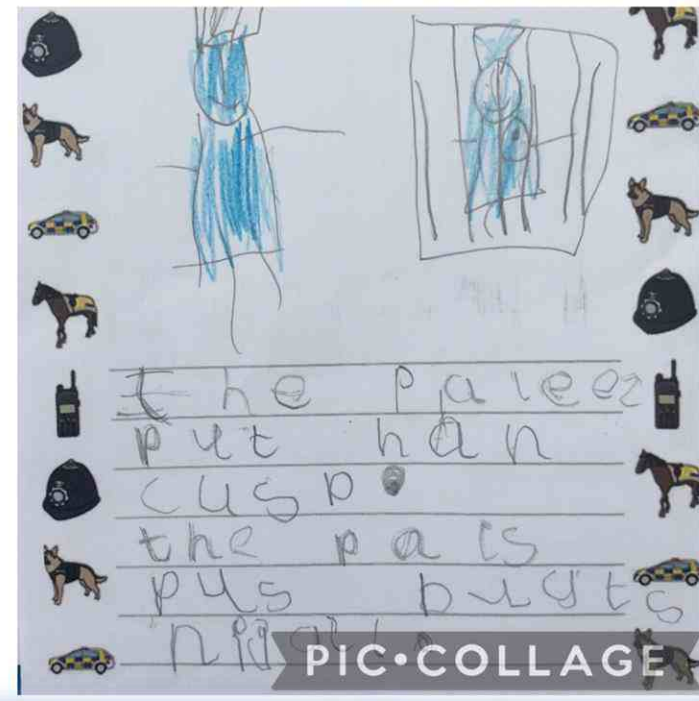
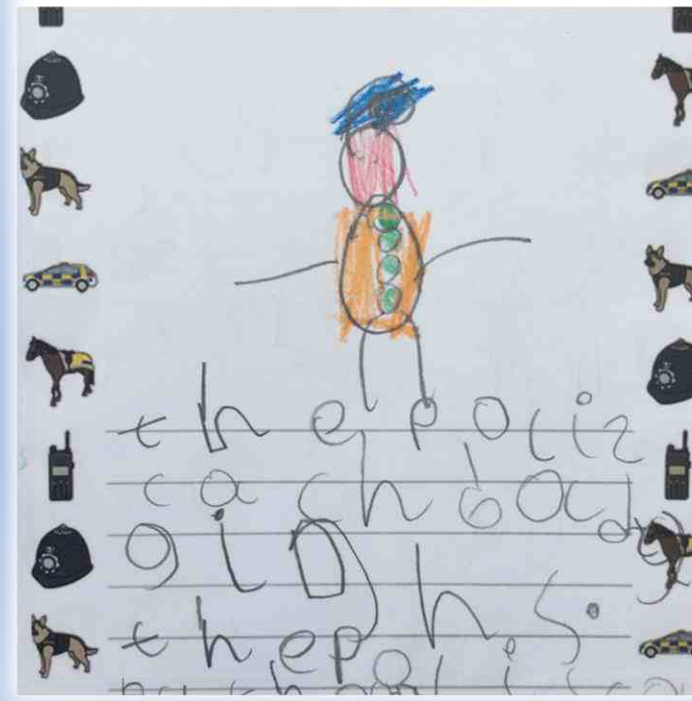
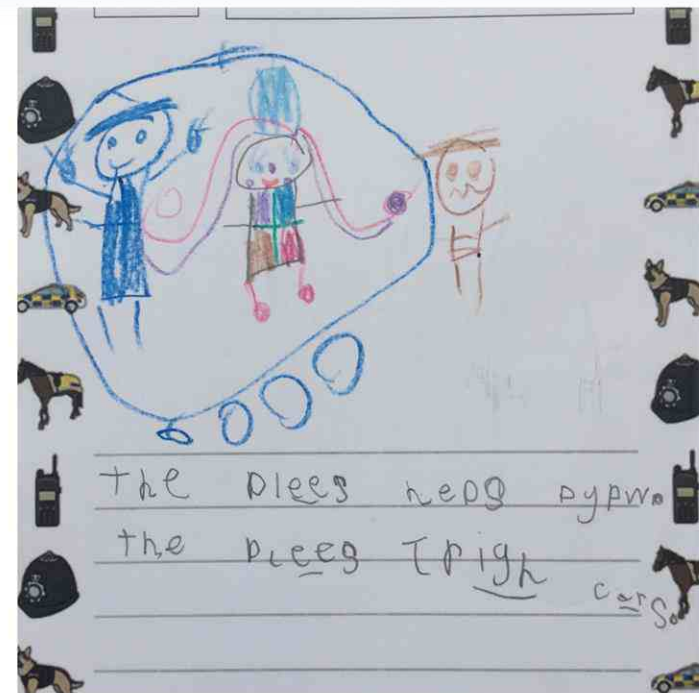
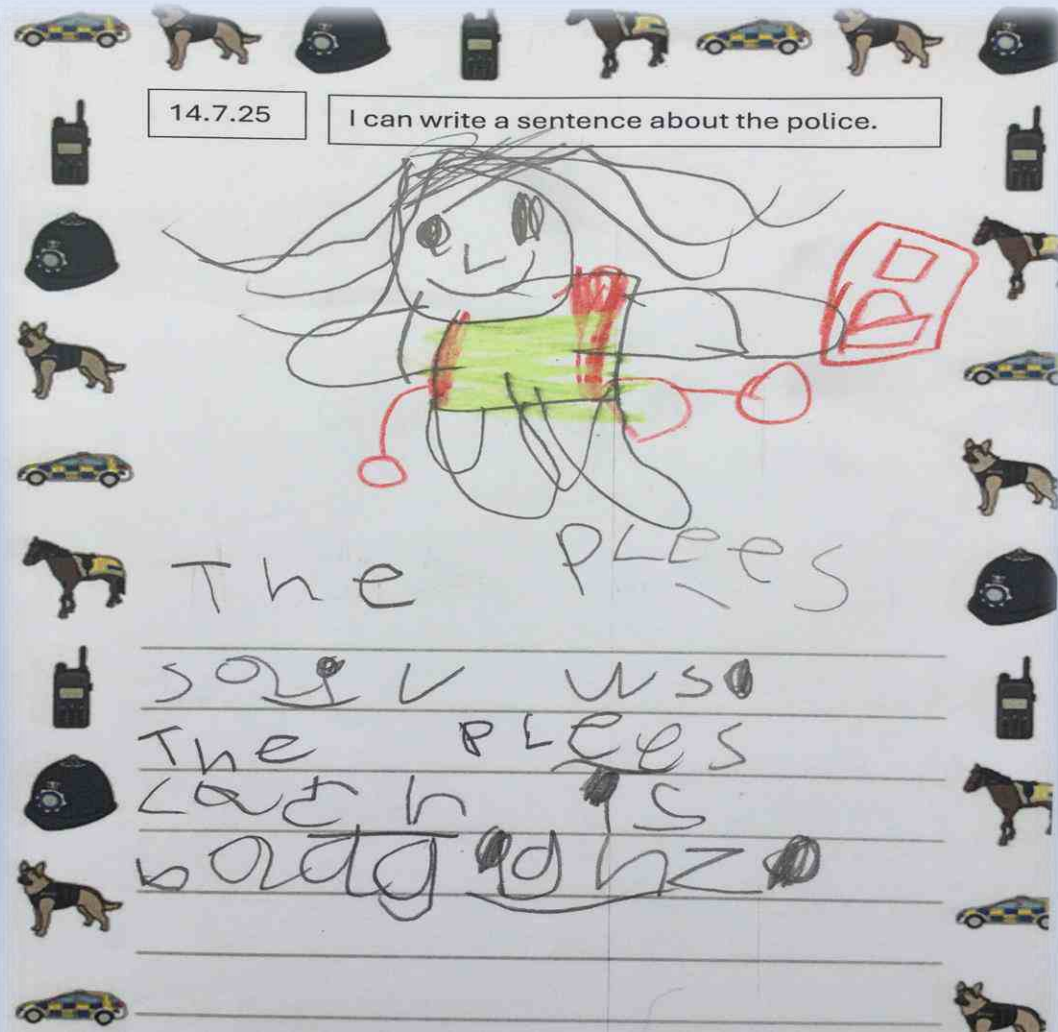

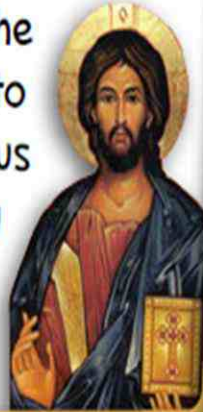




Please read and reflect together upon this week's gospel. The theme is **LISTENING**

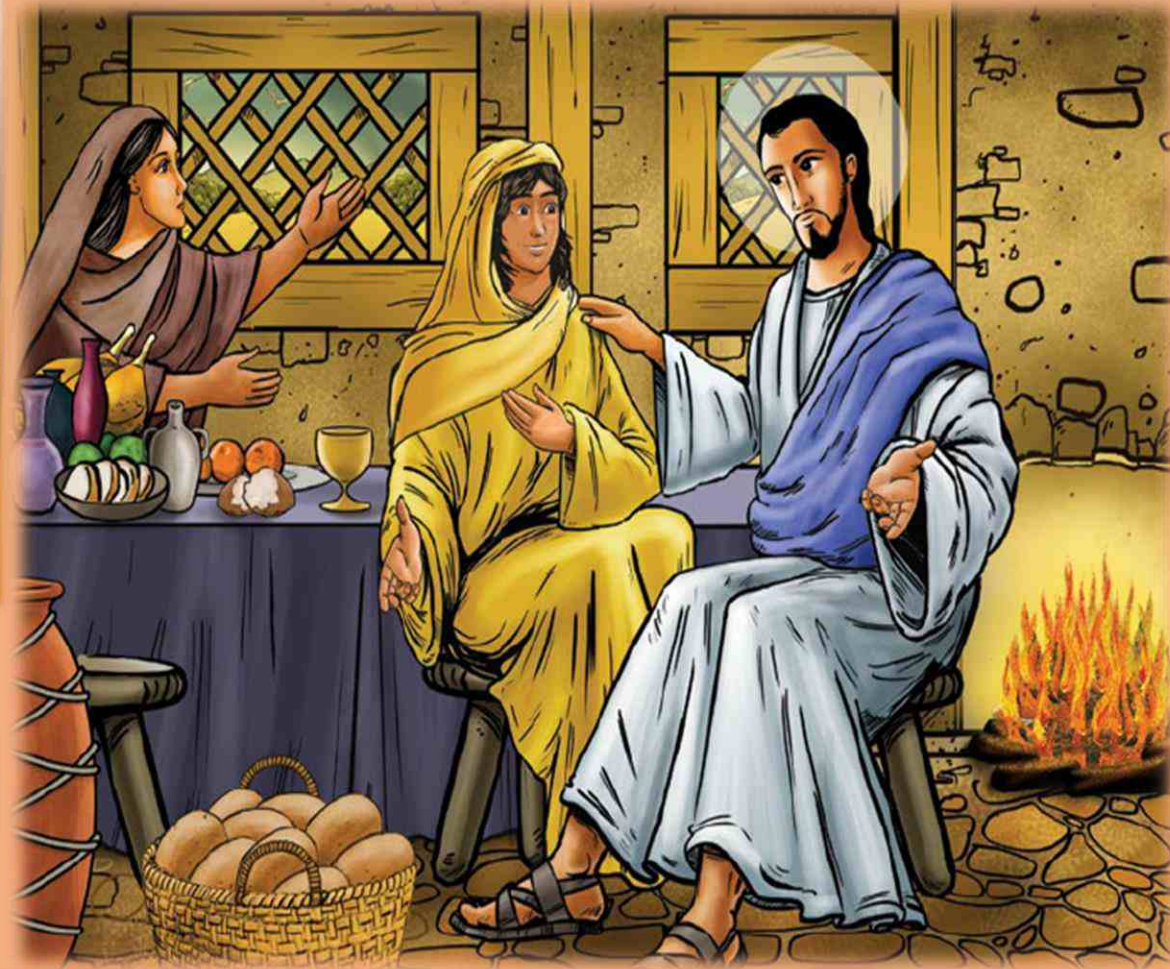
**"Before we speak, it is necessary for us to listen. God speaks in the silence of the heart."** *St Teresa of Calcutta (Mother Teresa)*
