

Reception classes enjoyed walking around the school on their pilgrimage. They came up with many ideas on how to show kindness and compassion.















Year 1 have been exploring equal, more than and less than in Maths


Year One have been learning about fewer than, more than and equal to. Challenge, what can you make using an equal number to this? The children were shown a model with 8 bricks.

## Please read and reflect together upon this week's gospel. The theme is
