


Our junior children learnt about keeping safe.

Another fabulous gymnastics lesson in year 3. Jumping and twisting.





















































Y5 Agnesi have been learning about the young King David and created their own stories to represent the skills David showed as a leader.























Y5 Agnesi have enjoyed their first few Geography lessons on The Alps.

This week in Nursery we have been learning the Christmas story and retelling the story with our peers. We have practised our cutting skills making puppets and angels.






Advent begins four Sundays before Christmas Day and ends on Christmas Eve.
