

On Wednesday 9th May 2018 the JTAS, Mr White and Mrs Sherry and about 50 children and families were greeted by a very happy Buster, the Active and Safer Travel's team's mascot. The parents were pleasantly surprised how quick it was to get to school. "It is a great way for the children to improve their fitness and enjoy the walk and time with their friends". "Walking to school really does make a difference as children are healthier and more prepared for the day ahead' say school staff. The Junior Travel Ambassadors know it also helps improve air quality and reduce the incidents of breathing related illness. During the Christmas holiday their Air Quality testing kits showed a large (11.9 micrograms per cubic metre) difference between the results from the church car park (28.1µg/m³) and the footpath along the back of the school (16.2 µg/m³). That was in the school holidays when there was far less traffic. We found out that the European legal limit is an average of 40µg/m³. On a school day we wonder what the levels breathed in by people would be on Bedwell Crescent?

Reception pupils charmed everyone with their assembly on Friday. They talked about how they had

changed over time and grown in their skills from when they were tiny babies to now as clever pupils who can run, dance, read and ride bikes. We all loved the story of Titch and the Follow Me song.
