




In Y4 Michelangelo, we have been working on use of descriptive language in our writing this week. We would like to share this piece by someone in our class...




Year 5 Agnesi enjoying practical science, testing for the solubility of materials on Thursday this week.










Building on from our last maths lesson, Year 1 began to make numbers to 30 using tens and ones. We were so clever at this we whizzed through our independent work!



Year Six Shakespeare have been investigating sequences in Maths this week...





"I made a worm!"








THE GOSPEL IN CHURCH Sunday 22nd November 2020



Jesus said to his disciples, "When the Son of Man comes in majesty, all people will be gathered before him. He will separate them as a shepherd separates sheep from goats, and will place the sheep on his right hand and the goats on his left. And he will say to those on

his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father, inherit the Kingdom which has been prepared for you.
