


Nursery children were willing to have a go with a dough press. They were very involved and used problem solving skills.

He started at 11.45. What time did he finish?”*






In our Wednesday Word assembly, we thought about St Joseph (whose feast day is on Saturday) and ended with a jig for St Patrick (feast day on Thursday).

There are some things that just wouldn't be possible in a normal full school assembly!




**Science week and the theme, Growth.**

Y3 investigated possible values for the letters in this calculation then used our grounds as an outdoor gym as part of science week.








We have learned so much in Science week including discovering which creatures live or visit the trees in our grounds.






Look who led story time for their friends in Reception, including some lively actions!






Year One children enjoyed observing and drawing these beautiful daffodils during child initiated learning.
