


Exploring what happened when you mix colours.

Amazing knowledge shown by Y4 Michelangelo about healthy foods.


They learnt a lot about the balance of the “Eat Well” plate but will be looking at the “hidden” sugars, salts and fats in the future.





Great excitement in Reception on the arrival of our caterpillars.



