In Science, Year 4 were proving that air is everywhere.

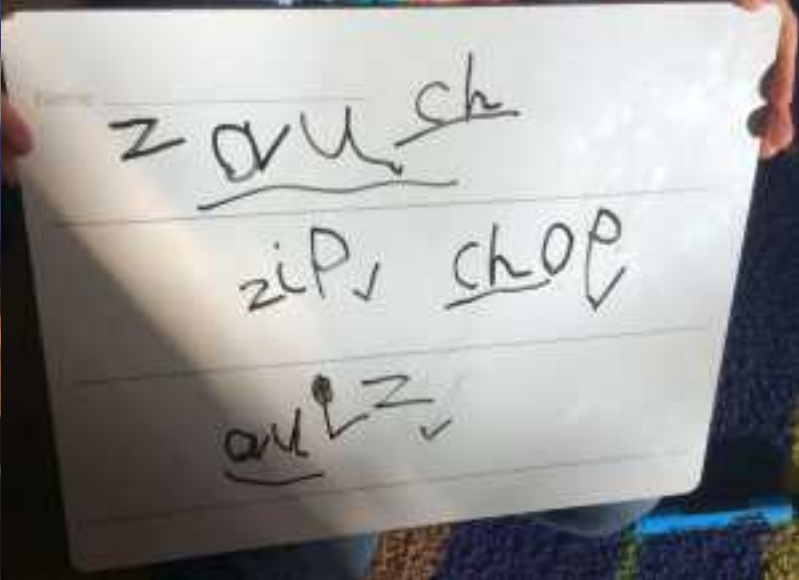
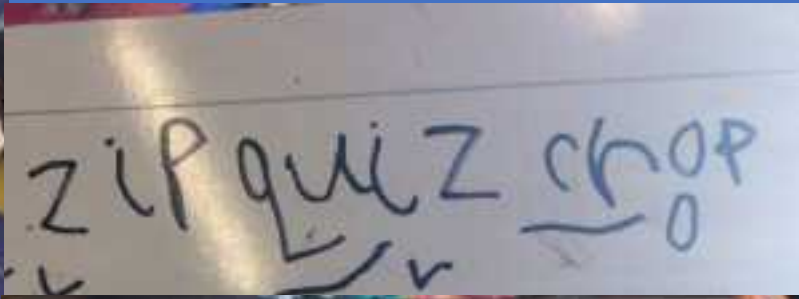
We poured water into a jug of sand and saw the air escaping.

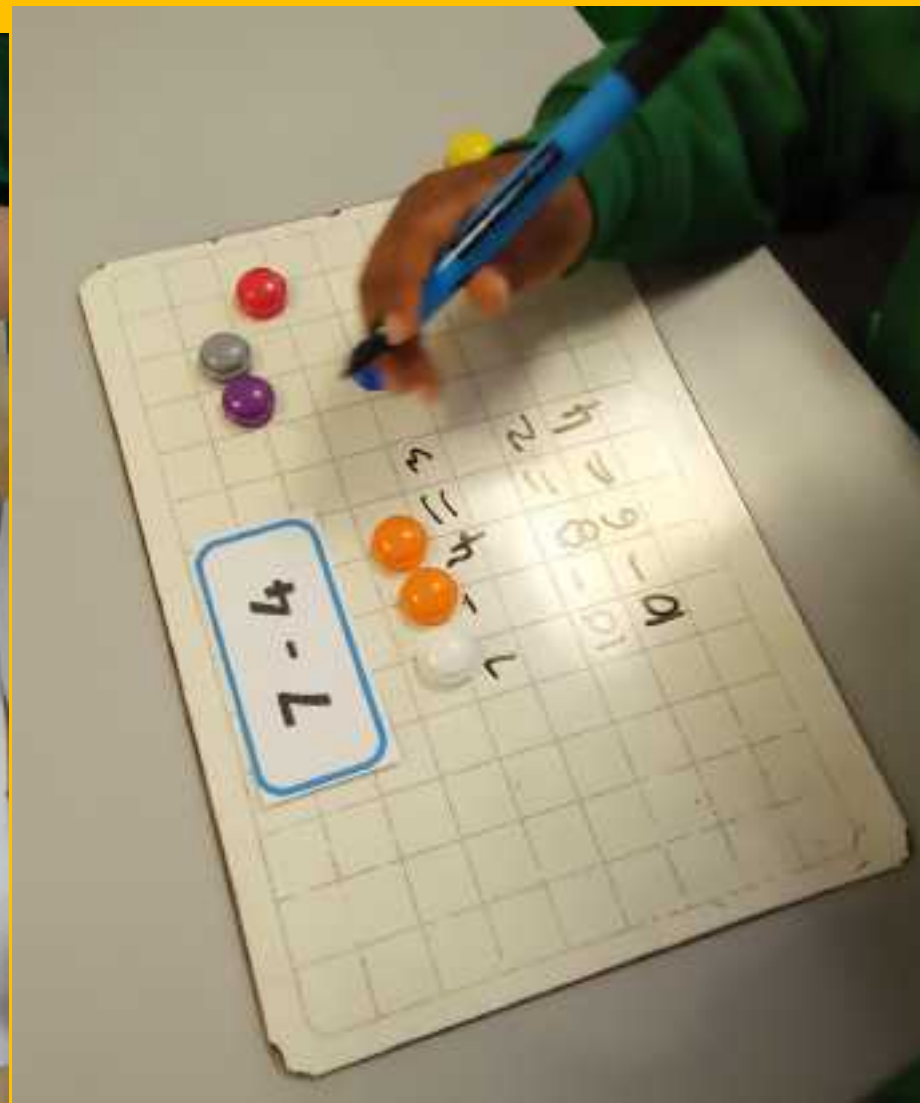
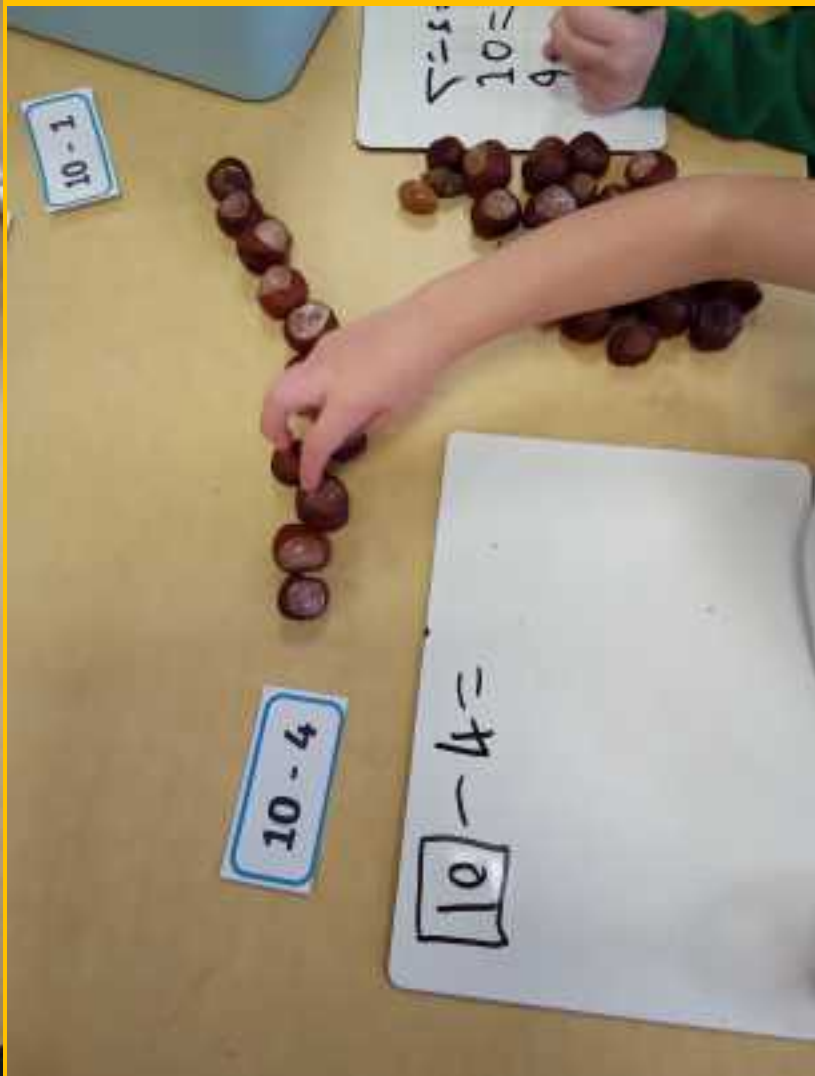

I'm a Little Hedgehog Song

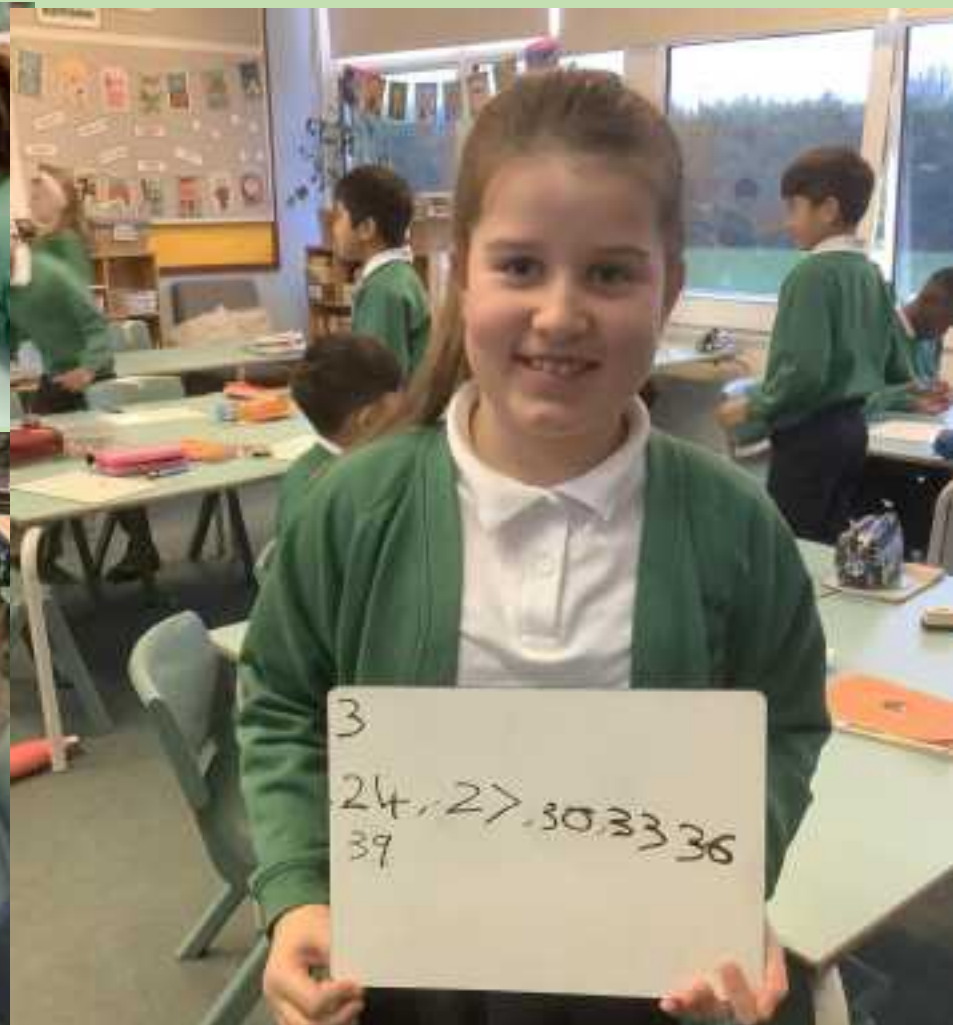
(Sung to the tune of 'I'm a Little Teapot')

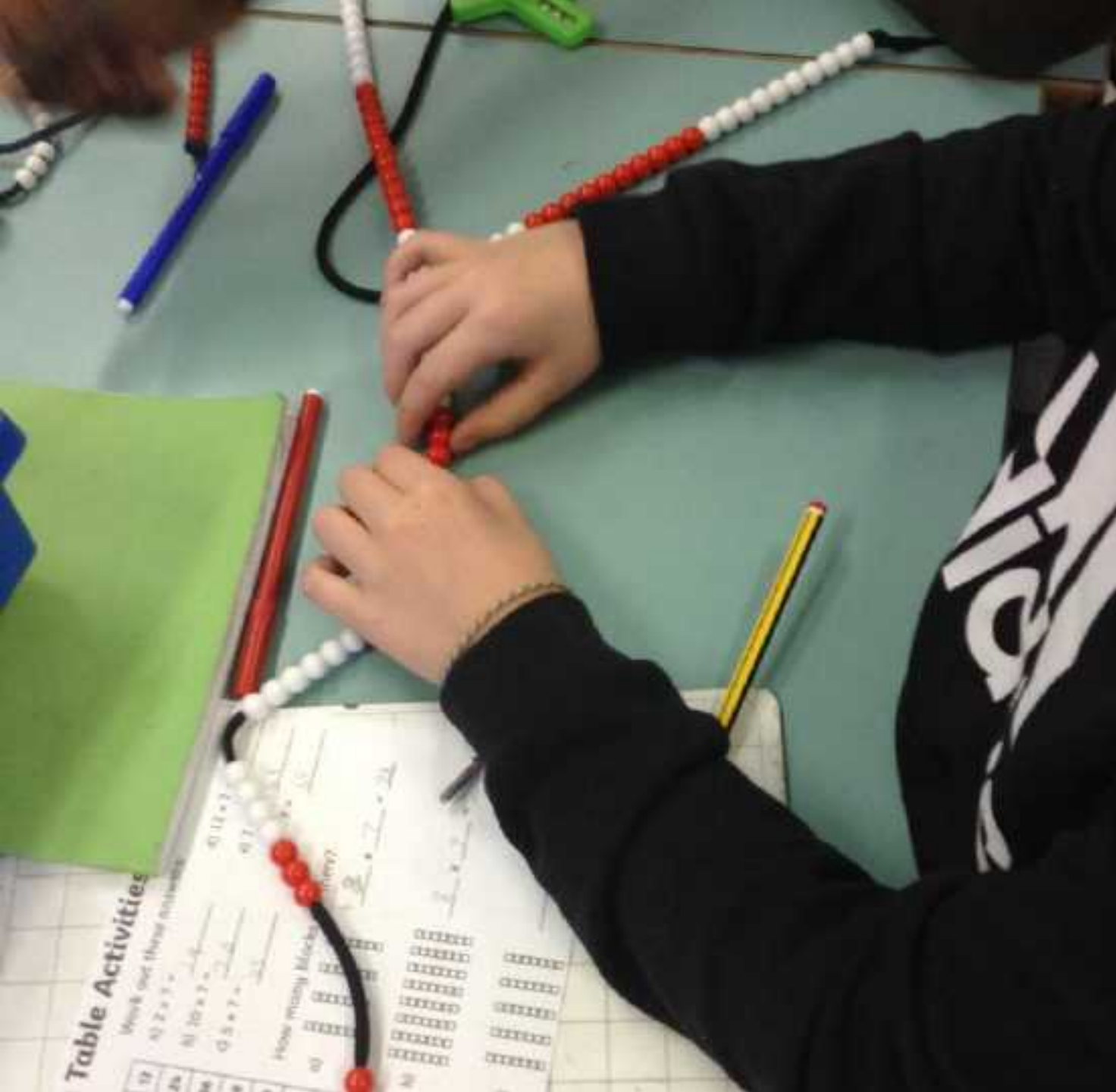
I'm a little hedgehog,

Sunday 20th November 2022



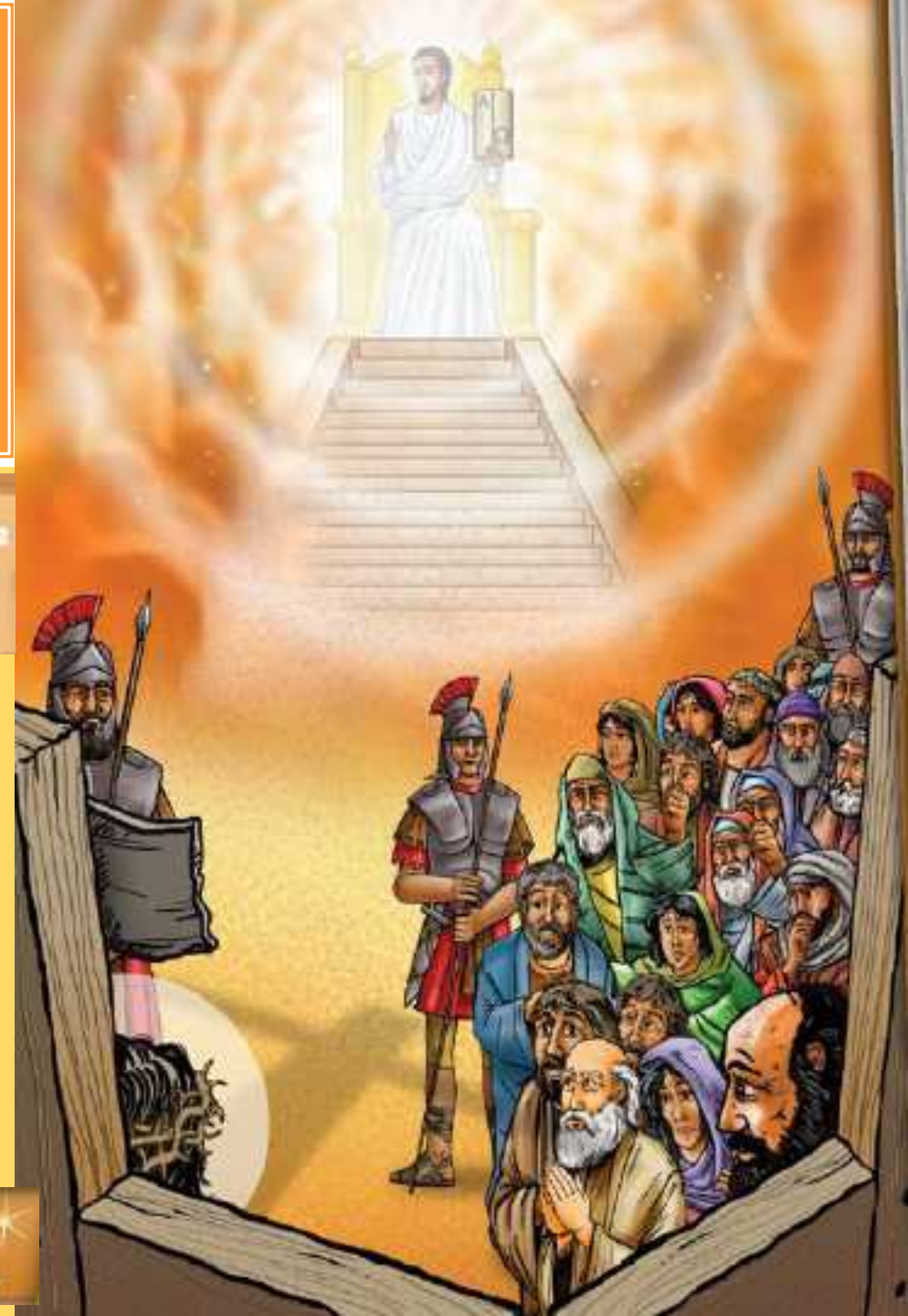
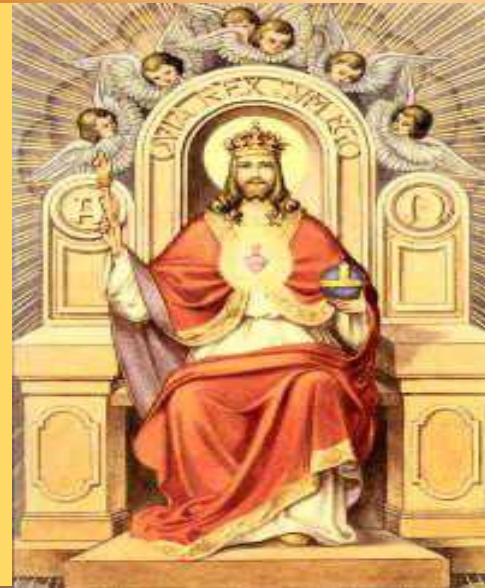
