Our new team have managed to raise much needed funds for the school and have helped to build community at the same time. It is very much appreciated, as is your support of their events. This week has been particularly tricky with the heat but I would like to say a huge thank you to everyone for your cooperation when school arrangements had to change at short notice on Tuesday. The staff team were very grateful of your cooperation with temperatures in the building peaking at 38 degrees at time. We all welcomed the cooler temperatures today which allowed us to gather outside for our farewell assembly.

The entire staff team, including our Governing Body, have done an amazing job over this past year and have gone above and beyond in their approach to absolutely everything. ### **Next Year**

Already the staff team are looking forward to plans for next year. We hope to have our calendar of school events ready for you before the end of the holidays so that everyone can begin to plan their year. We have a number of exciting plans for the year ahead which include a 'Great Representation' diversity project that we have been invited to be a part of; a choral music project being led by the Diocese (a choral director has been appointed for our school); a re-invigoration of our maths curriculum; a refreshing of our Early years Foundation Stage Provision; some exciting new sports clubs; and much, much more! It will be a busy year! During the summer period two classrooms are being decorated and recarpeted and a major fencing project (90% funded £50K) is taking place which will enhance our internal security. We continue to engage with the Diocese in a project to replace the roof in both buildings (90% funded - £600K) – this has now been delayed and will probably not start until we return to school. Both funded projects mean that the school needs to find 10% towards them (£65K). Thank you for your generous donations to the School Building Fund which enable us to commit to such projects.

Children from Year 3 made their First Holy Communion across the parishes in Stevenage and Knebworth this term. It was lovely to be able to see all of the children together for a celebration Mass at St Joseph's last week. Parents joined us for Mass and afterwards for a presentation the Hall. When the children returned to school in their beautiful outfits, the whole school came out to greet and clap them. It was an emotional occasion!

### **Changes to next year's INSET day plans**

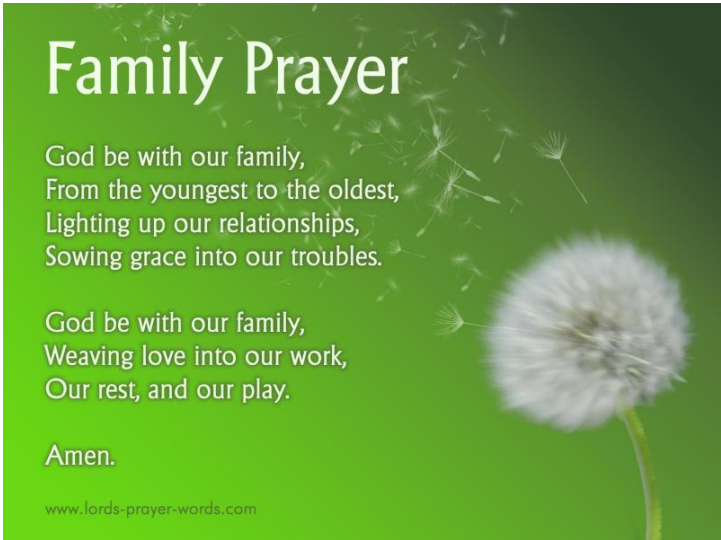
### **Changes to the school day**

As schools are required to plan towards a minimum amount of hours we have needed to review our procedures at the end of the day. Our current 'soft end' to the day has resulted in most parents picking up at 3.00pm and this has reduced available teaching time. In order to increase our teaching time by 1 ¼ hours per week we need to revert to an end-of-day time of 3.15pm, from Year 1 to Year 6. We will be reviewing the end time for Early Years Foundation Stage during the Autumn term. We may also need to alter our start time at some point next year in order to meet the forthcoming statutory requirements. I will keep you informed of any potential changes.
