Dear parents and carers

Welcome back to school after the half term break. I do hope that you have all enjoyed time with families and friends over the half term and that everyone is now ready to engage with an exciting half term of learning before we break for Easter. It will be a busy half term but I know that our children will rise to the challenge as always and will immerse themselves in their learning and relationships.

Parent Consultations

Our second parent consultations of the year are planned for Monday 27th & Tuesday 28th February 2023 and will be an in-person event again. Ash Wednesday – the start of LENT

This Wednesday marks the start of our Lenten preparations. KS2 children will be attending Mass at St Joseph's at 11 am and everyone is welcome to join us. The EYFS and KS1 children will receive their ashes in a special liturgy in school on the same day. Ash Wednesday is traditionally a day when Catholics abstain from eating meat and as such our Herts Catering menu will be altered this week to enable pupils to mark this special day in a traditional way.

Lent is always a very special time of preparation in school and to help each other in these essential preparations we have produced some documents to guide families. These should help you understand the preparations taking place in school and how these can be complimented at home. I hope that you find them useful.

Throughout Lent, we have three giving projects that we hope you and your children will be able to help us with:

- Food Bank Friday will return! Please leave items in the trolley outside St Joseph's workshop that we can share with the St Vincent de Paul Society to support local families.
- Children will be sent home with a CAFOD penny box. Maybe they could complete jobs at home for a small fee to support overseas sustainable aid projects.
- Easter raffle tickets will be on sale during the last few weeks of term. Pupils can buy tickets that might earn them an Easter treat donated by the staff team. Funds raised will support Father Kakuba's Kanyike Project in Uganda









In school, throughout Lent, children will also be working on demonstrating key aspects of Catholic Social Teaching in their daily lives. Each class has chosen an area to focus on from the following list and will be engaging in practical projects which support this during and beyond Lent:



Singing

Following the debut performance of our school choir during the Christmas in Song event, we are delighted that they have been invited to sing at the 6pm Mass at Westminster Cathedral on 11th March with friends from St Philip Howard School, Hatfield. In addition to this, our Y5 choir will be singing as part of the Herts Gala Choir at the Royal Albert Hall after Easter.

Academies – DOWAT

As I have explained in previous newsletters, we have been actively engaging with the Cardinal's wish for all Catholic schools to join a Catholic Academy Trust by 2025. We have been directed towards DOWAT (Diocese of Westminster Academy Trust) which will be familiar to many of you as it is the trust that St John Henry Newman School belong to.

We are currently engaged in a process of 'due diligence' and expect the Diocese to approve our 'joining in principle' imminently. At the point that this is agreed, we then have to apply to the Regional Commissioner for Schools, who would consider the move on behalf of the Department for Education. At this point we would be required to enter into a formal consultation process with parents, staff & other interested parties.

The more that we engage with the process of due diligence, the more that Governors, Senior Leaders and I can see the benefit of this for our school. I look forward to sharing these benefits with you all once I am able to, in the Summer term hopefully. Great Representation Project

In December's newsletter, I mentioned our involvement in the Herts for Learning's Great Representation Project. This project has linked us up in partnership with four other schools to explore how we can encourage a greater sense of belonging through work, race and diversity. Unfortunately, our parent meeting in relation to this was cancelled in January due to staffing issues – we hope to be able to rearrange this before we break for Easter. We encourage as many members of our community to join this rescheduled meeting as possible as we are keen to seek the views of all groups in our beautiful diverse community. World Book Day – Thursday 2nd March 2023

As part of our drive to maintain, promote and engage pupil interest in reading, the school is celebrating World Book Day on Thursday 2nd March. Following previous successes on this day, your child is invited to come to school dressed as their favourite character from any book. Dressing up is an optional choice and to avoid any extra cost involved, we suggest using everyday items of clothing or recycling previous outfits to create your character. During this week, the children will be participating in lots of exciting activities and can bring in their favourite book from home to share with their class.

As a further exciting challenge over the course of this half term - pupils are encouraged to decorate a stone with a book theme. They may choose to paint their favourite character from a story or write the title of a loved book on the pebble. Any creative book related design is encouraged and welcomed; the possibilities are endless! These can be brought into school at any point before Easter and will be used to create displays within the classroom and around the school.

Please continue to encourage the love of books by reading with your children whenever you can. Now might also be a time to join the library if your child doesn't already have a membership.
