

It has been a busy and fruthir half term — thank you for all that you have done in partnership with the staff team to make this half term so successful and exciting. Your children, as always, have been a credit to you and this had been commented on by various visitors to the school.

In September Caroline Luck, a Herts for Learning EYFS (Early Years Foundation Stage) Advisor, visited as we seek to ensure that our provision is the very best that it can be. Caroline gave us much to flink about but commented on how well the children in Nursery and Recuption had settled into new routines and how their relationships and behaviour were something to be proud of. Caroline has three further visits with us this year and we look forward to making using of her many great ideas.







In October we were visited by Sarah Jane Forguson, a Hents for Learning Advisor, commissioned by Herts County Council to get a flavour of wellbeing in actools across Heritordehire. Seach Jane acknowledged the mainy issues that we, like other actions are dealing with an resident to wellbeing but was "blown away" by the provision that we have in place for all pupils. She described our children as being wrapped in a carefully consistered protective bubble, that allowed them to develop the necessary independent skills enabling them to thrive and to deal with the issues of everyday life." Sarah Jane suggested that we should be held up as an example of best practice locally in the promotion of positive wellbeing and mental health. The children were great embassadors for the school on this visit as they coulded her around the site, pointing out the things that helded.

Next week we look forward to welcoming two RE Advisors from the Discusse of Westminster on a prehapposion advisory visit. We are looking forward to sharing with them all the arrazing work that has been completed by pupils, carefully guided by staff.
