





On Easter Saturday the tomb is sealed and the Church across the world is waiting for a new light to shine!





Year 5 investigated mark-making in their art lesson.










# A busy day of learning in Reception




























In response to **'The Enormous Potato'** retold by **Aubrey Davis,** the children are preparing seed potatoes for planting out.


#### Catholic School Inspectorate




