

Year 6 Shakespeare really enjoyed their morning in Year 3! They were helping the younger children with their Christmas crowns for our special lunch on Tuesday.










Year 1 enjoyed Christmas art activities with their Year 5 friends.

Year 4 Bonifacio has really enjoyed creating tone within a landscape. We have made some amazing scenes for our calendars!




Year 4 has also had a great time Christmas crafting with Year 2. Great Christmas trees everyone!!

Year 6 worked extremely hard to make these lovely snowflakes!






The travelling Posada Nativity has been visiting in KS1. If you would like to take it home next week please sign up. We have been so proud of our disco stars this week. Well done children!



From the Gospel of Sunday 17th December 2023 John 1:6-8. 19-28 (the 3rd Sunday of Advent, Year B)


