The children in Reception LOVED the new role play and have enjoyed playing with all of the new activities and resources, inside and out.

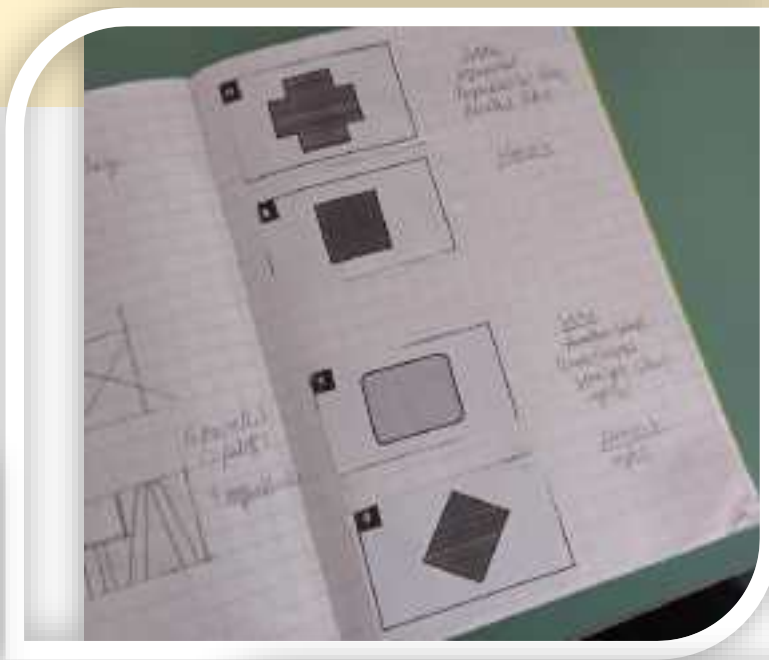

The children were writing from the perspective of a character from our class book. Miss Freitas was blown away with the high quality of work!



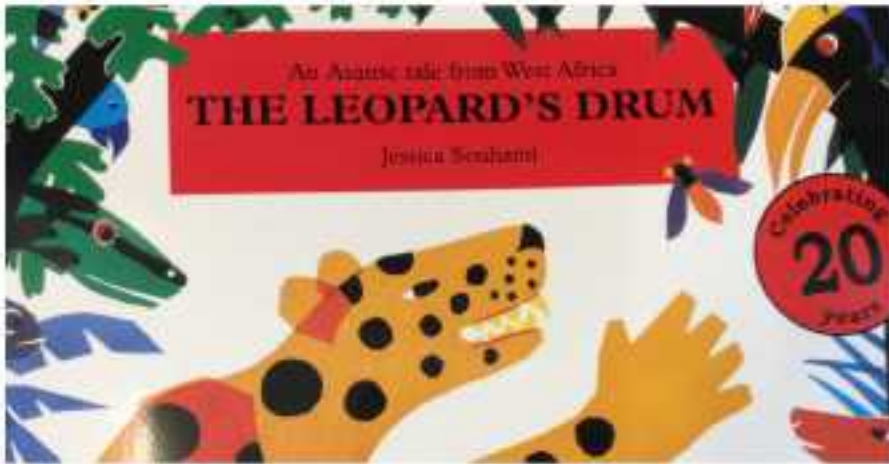
In RE, year 5 have been practising how to find parables from the Bible to help us understand what Jesus was saying to us.

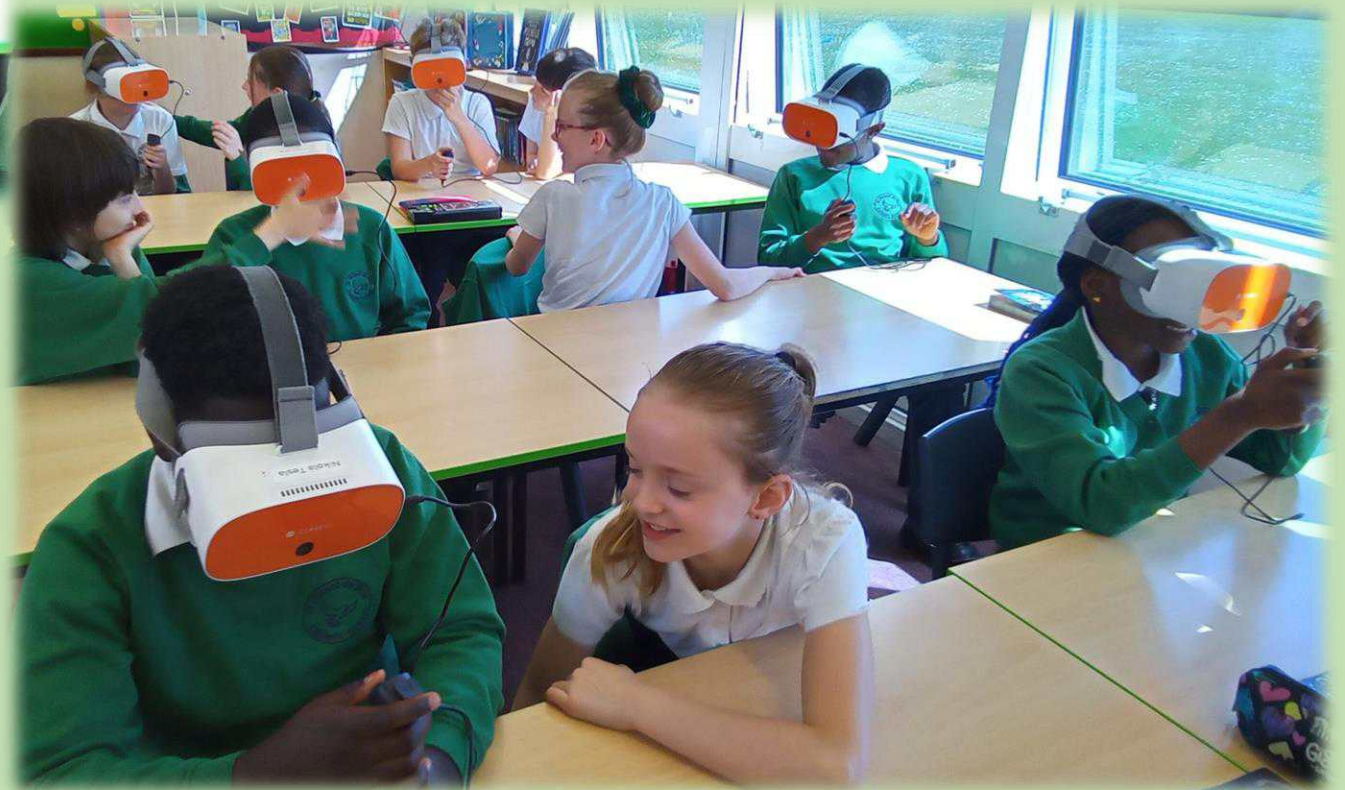
They have explored the London Underground, a Spitfire plane, Pearl Harbour and the D-Day beaches.



Year 5 also enjoyed learning about the Anglo-Saxons' life through a VR workshop. Some very excited children!

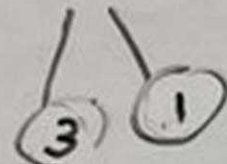

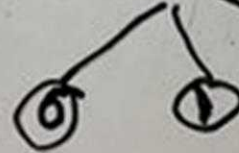

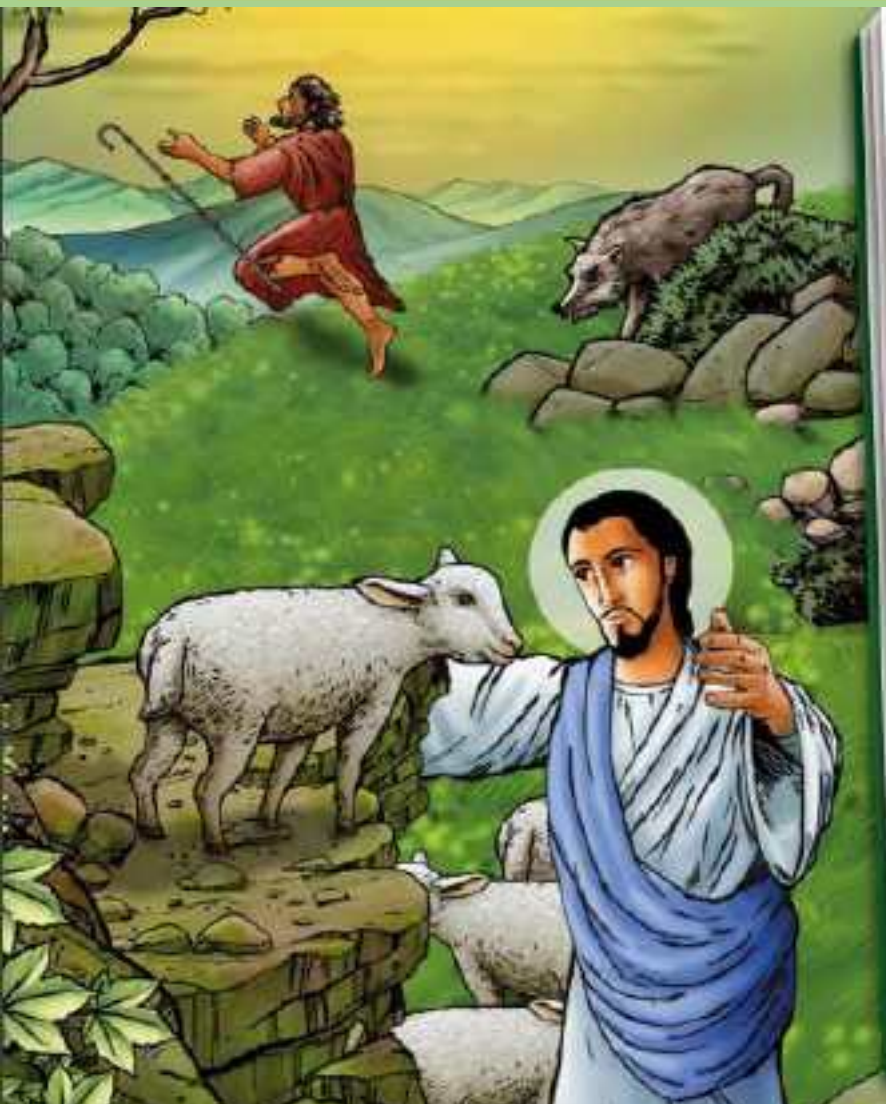

Good News for Everyone

Jesus, the Good Shepherd, wants us to place our trust in him. When we trust Jesus to lead us, just as a shepherd leads his sheep, he helps us to make the right choices. Jesus fills our lives with goodness, so that we stay close to him and do not go astray.



Please read and reflect together upon this week's gospel.

The theme is

TRUST



Jesus said, "I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep. The hired man, since he is not the shepherd and the sheep do not belong to him, abandons the sheep and runs away as soon as he sees a wolf coming, and then the wolf attacks and scatters the sheep; this is because he is only a hired man and has no concern for the sheep. I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for my sheep. The Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me; I lay it down of my own free will, and, as it is in my power to lay it down, so it is in my power to take it up again; and this is the command I have been given by my Father."
