RE

The children will hear and reflect upon our weekly scripture.

- They will learn that a church is a special place where God's people gather to pray.
- They will come to know that Sunday is a special day for the Church family who come together to celebrate.
- They come to appreciate their friendship with Jesus through baptism.
- Children will experience praying with others as a celebration.
- They will join in simple prayers and hymns.

Maths

Number

- The children will learn to recite numbers beyond 20 and will rehearse their counting skills to ensure accuracy.
- Subitise more complex arrangements.
- Consolidate understanding of the composition of 5.
- See the numbers 6 to 9 as 5 and a bit.
- To understand the magnitude of numbers, comparing the size of different numbers.
- To use a rekenrek to consolidate their understanding of number.

Shape, Space and Measures

• The children will learn to name and will begin to describe the properties of 2D and 3D shapes.

PSED

Throughout this term, we will be using our Ten:Ten scheme to explore a range of themes.

- Similarities, differences and acceptance.
- Feelings, including strategies to manage emotions.
- That God is love and that we are made in His image.
- The importance of community and responsibility.
- Jobs in the community.
- Money doesn't grow on trees.

Physical Development – Ball skills/Multi Skills

This term, the children will learn to use a range of equipment, such as rackets, hockey sticks, javelin and balls of different sizes.

Through the use of this equipment, they will develop and refine a range of skills including: throwing, catching, kicking, passing, batting, and aiming.

Reception

Phonics

The children will continue to consolidate previous learning and will become more familiar with consonant blends – bl/tr/st/sp

In addition, the children will be learning to...

- Read longer words made up of letter-sound correspondences they know: 'rabbit', 'himself', 'jumping'.
- Develop existing knowledge of common exception words.
- Re-read what they have written to check that it makes sense.
- To use their phonic knowledge as the prime approach to spelling, correctly spelling the common exception words with which they are familiar.

Reading

Write short sentences with words with known sound-letter correspondences using a capital letter and full stop

Understanding The Word

Our understanding of the world themes link closely to our CLPE texts.

- Rainforest Animals (Summer 1)
- Know similarities and differences in relation to living things.
- Makes observations of animals and plants and explain why some things occur and talks about changes.

In the Garden (Summer 2)

- Explore the natural world around them.
- Describe what they see, hear and feel whilst outside.
- Look closely at similarities, differences, patterns and changes in nature.

Expressive Arts and Design

- Art Sculpture (Summer 1)
- To explore clay and other malleable materials and their properties.
- To create a sculpture.

- To develop threading and weaving skills.
- To apply weaving skills using a range of materials.
- To use threading or sewing to design and make a bookmark.

Music

- To listen attentively to music.
- Discuss changes and patterns as a piece of music develops.
- Notice and encourage children to keep a steady beat, whilst singing and tapping their knees or dancing to music.
