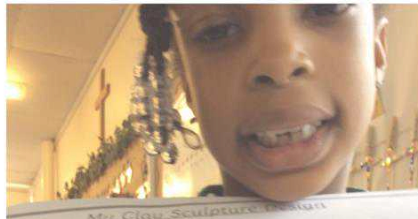

The children in Reception have enjoyed creating the animal sculptures that they designed last week using clay.

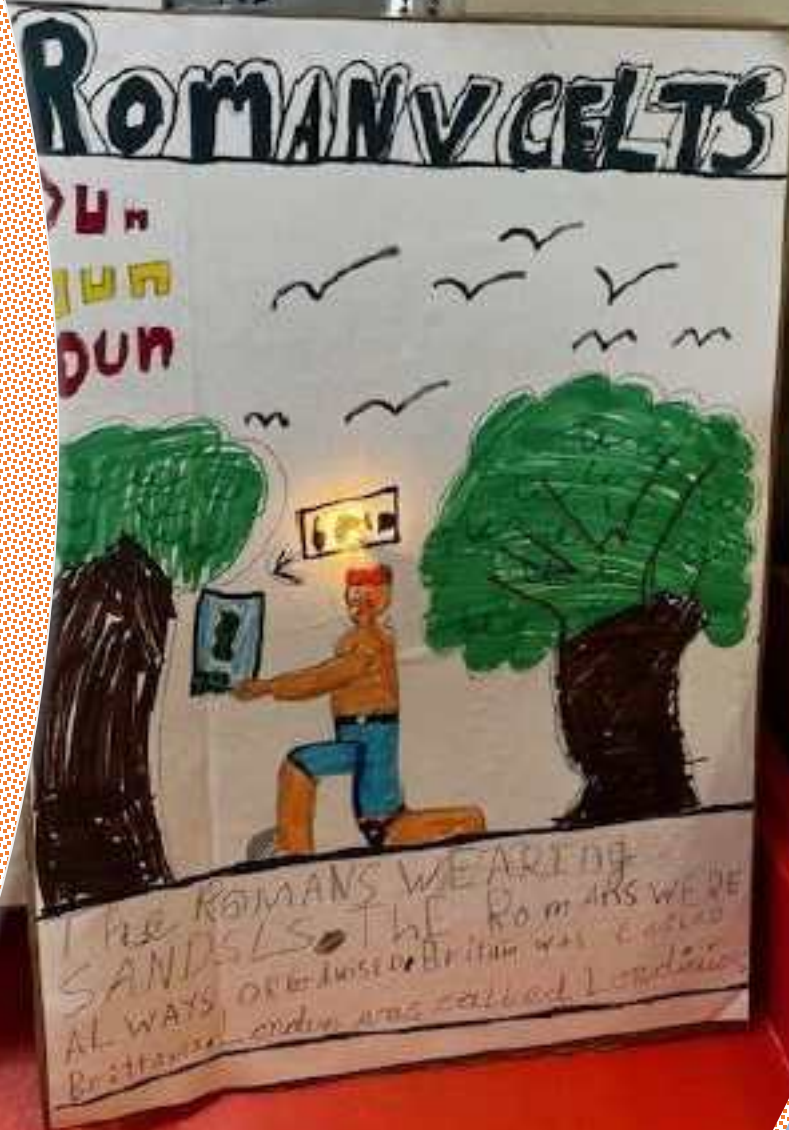


Year 3 were so excited to finish their DT electrical posters.

Year 6 have been creating relief sculptures about their primary school using literal and abstract images out of cardboard



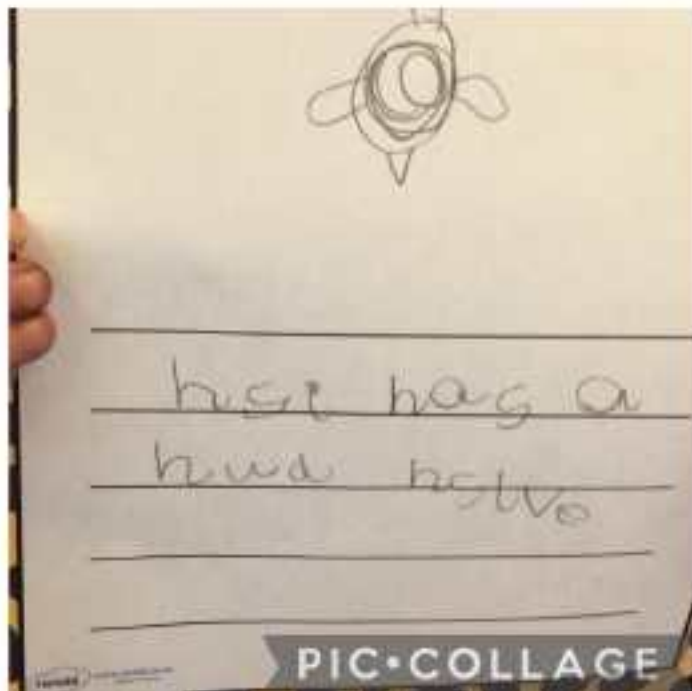
