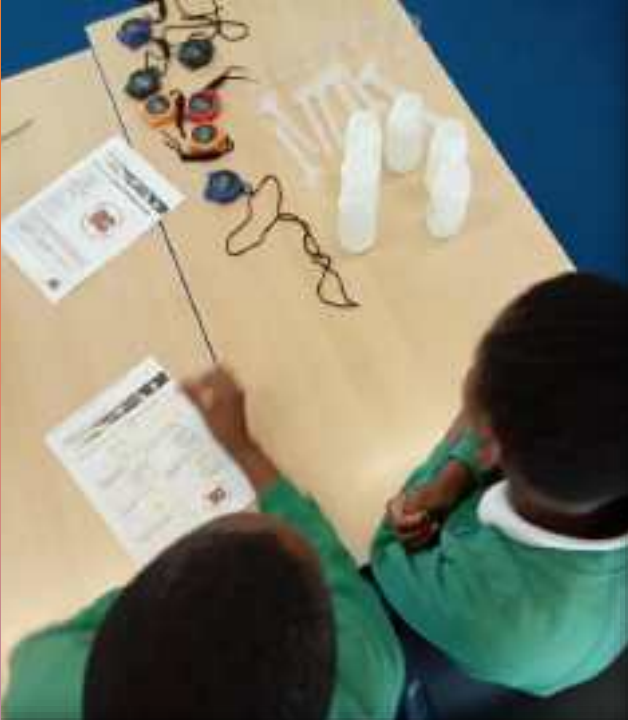
Year 5 started their Mini Police project on Tuesday.

This was the first of 4 weeks learning about important community topics including anti-social behaviour, personal, road and cyber safety, bullying, hate crime and drug awareness.

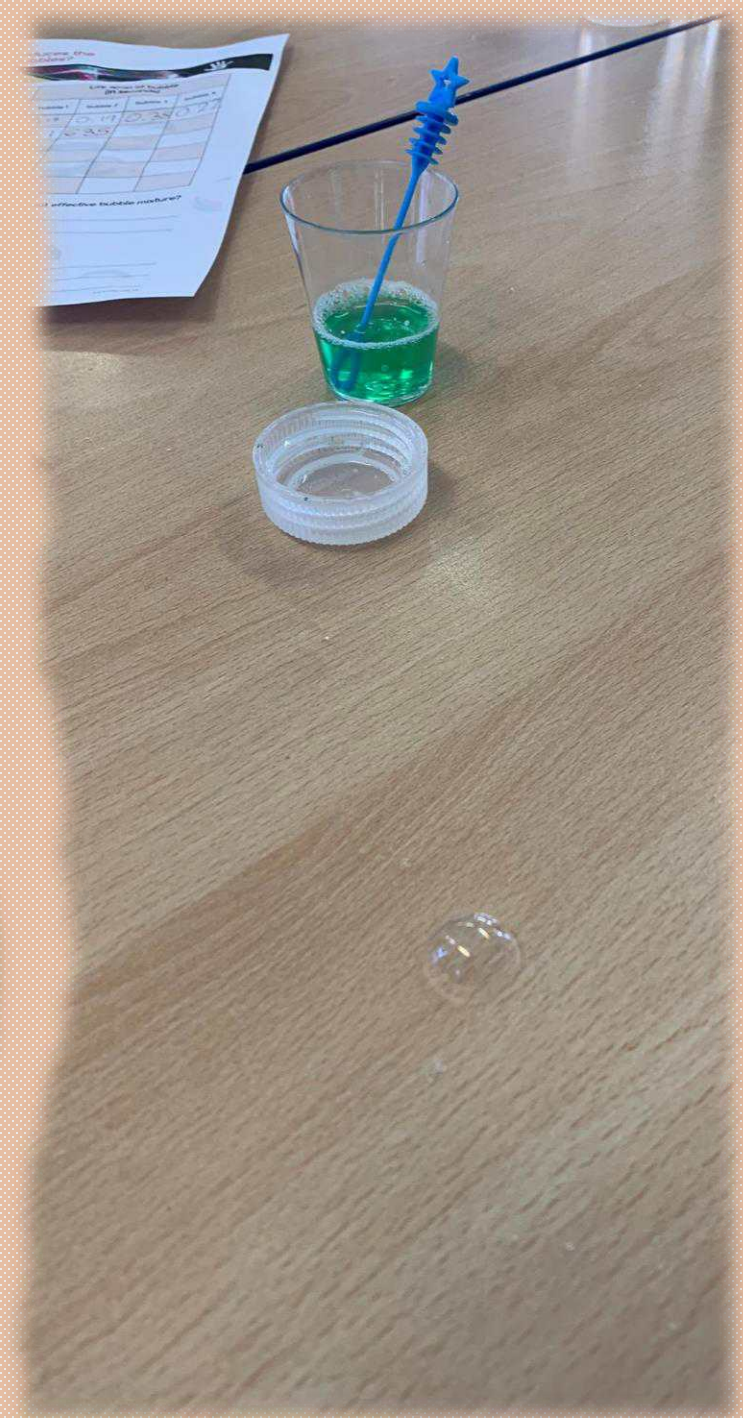
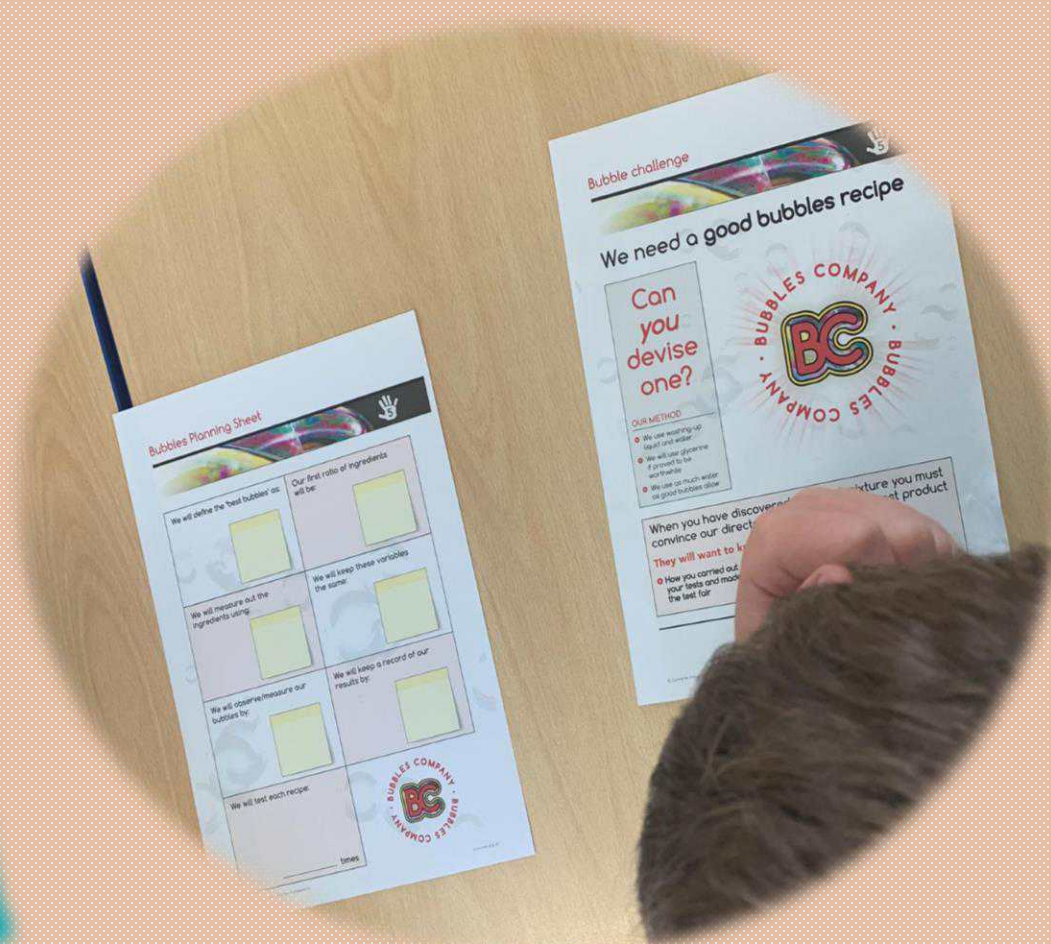
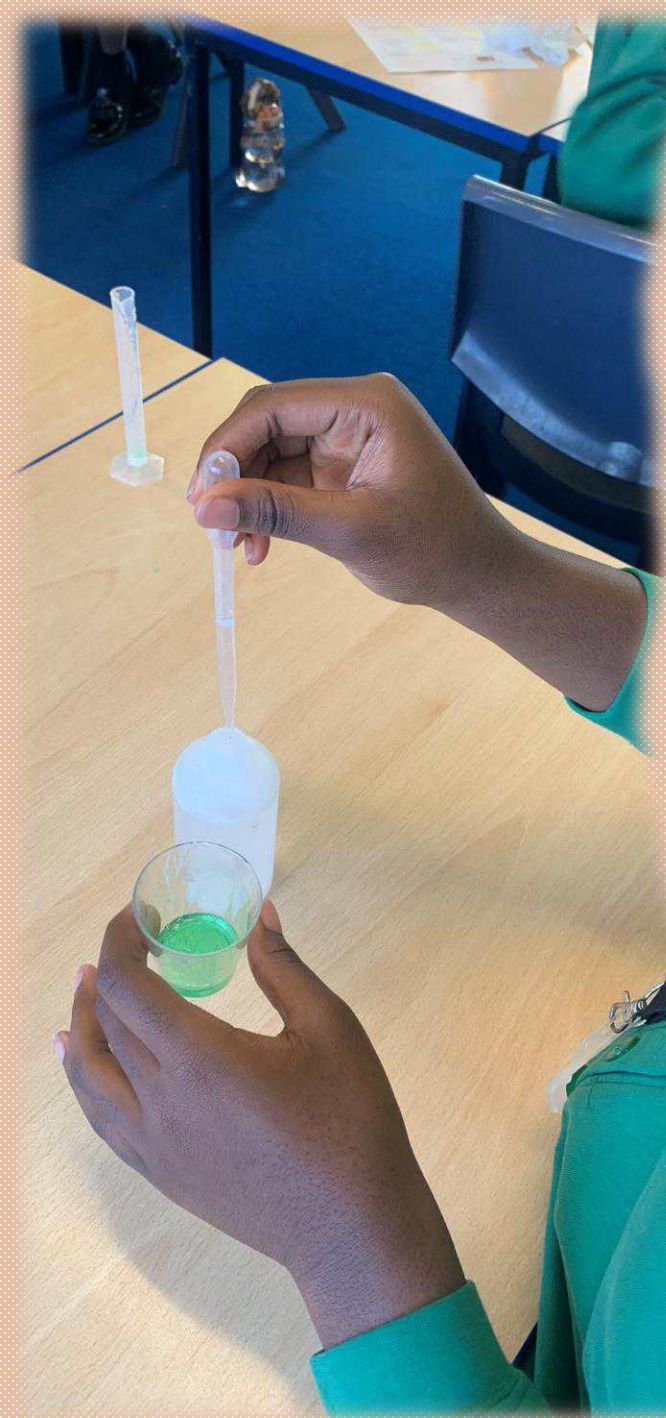




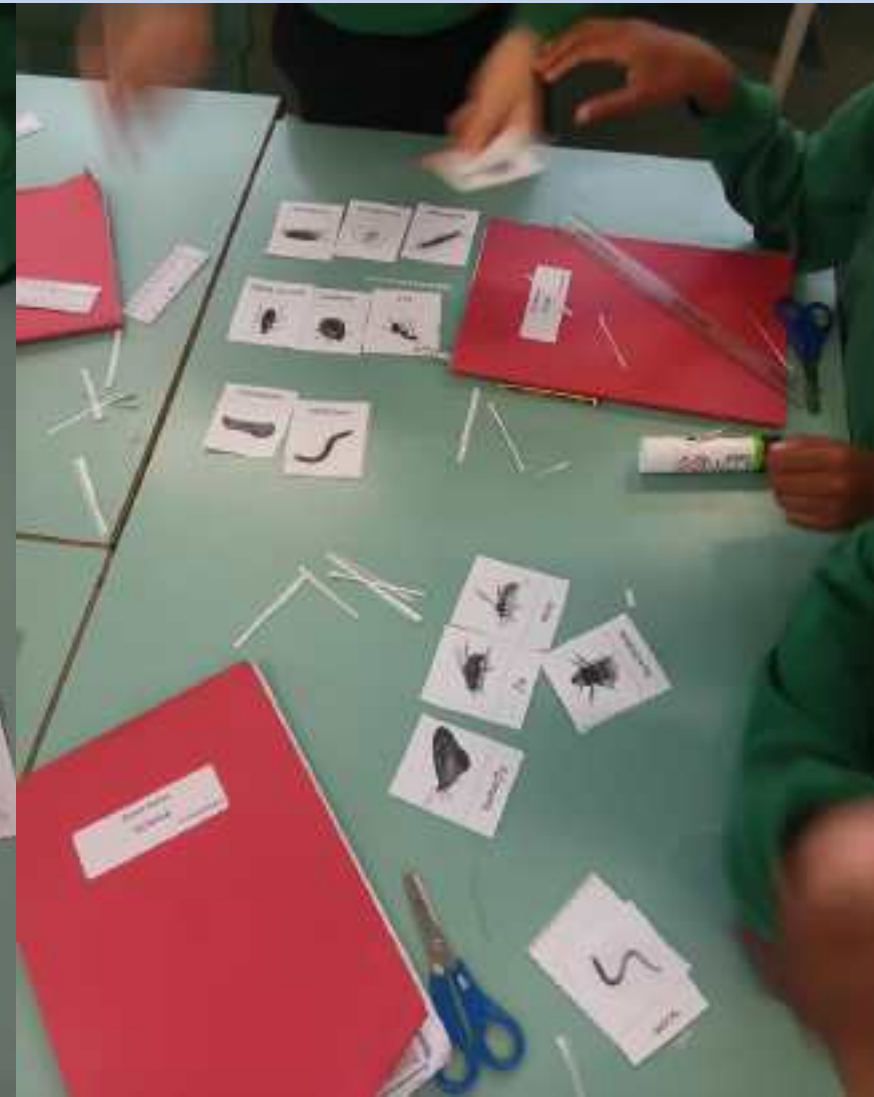
Year 6 were busy investigating bubbles in their science workshop on Wednesday morning!

Thank you to all the children for their dedication, parents for supporting and Mr. Jennings for training our title winners!



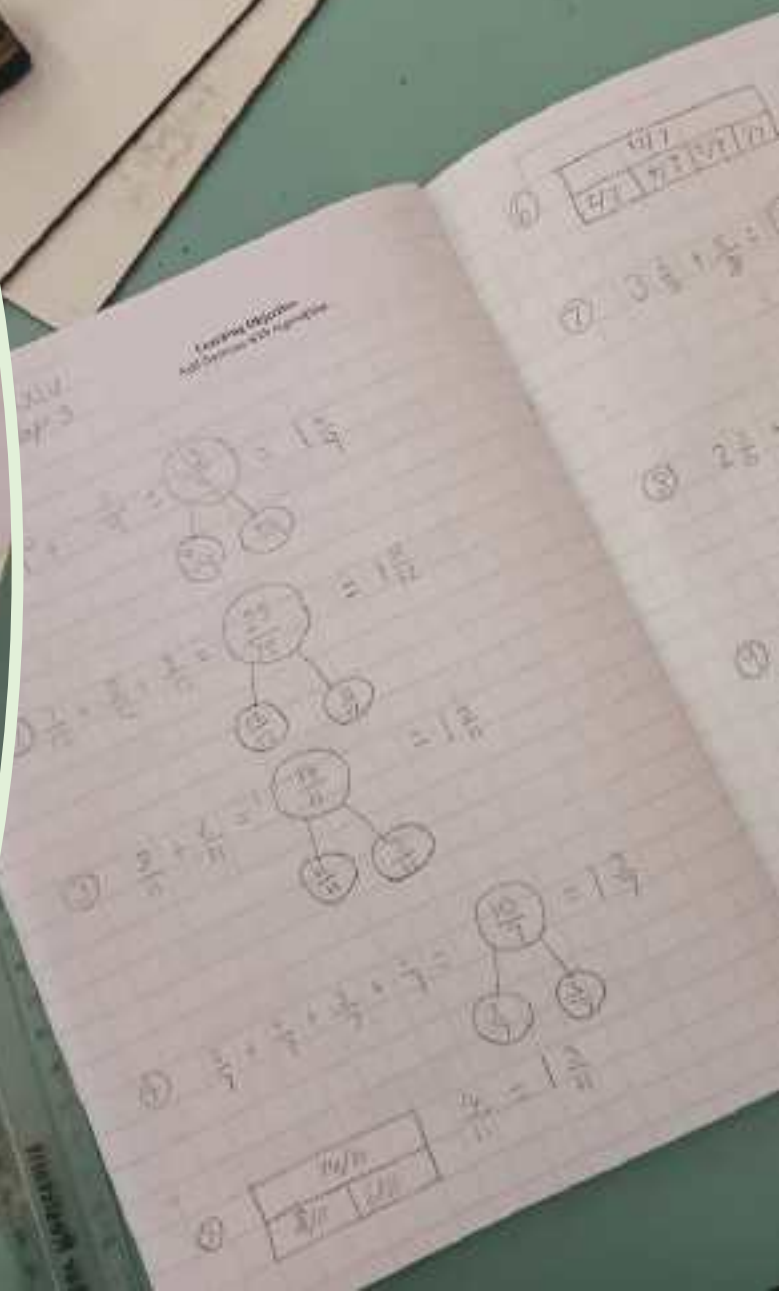
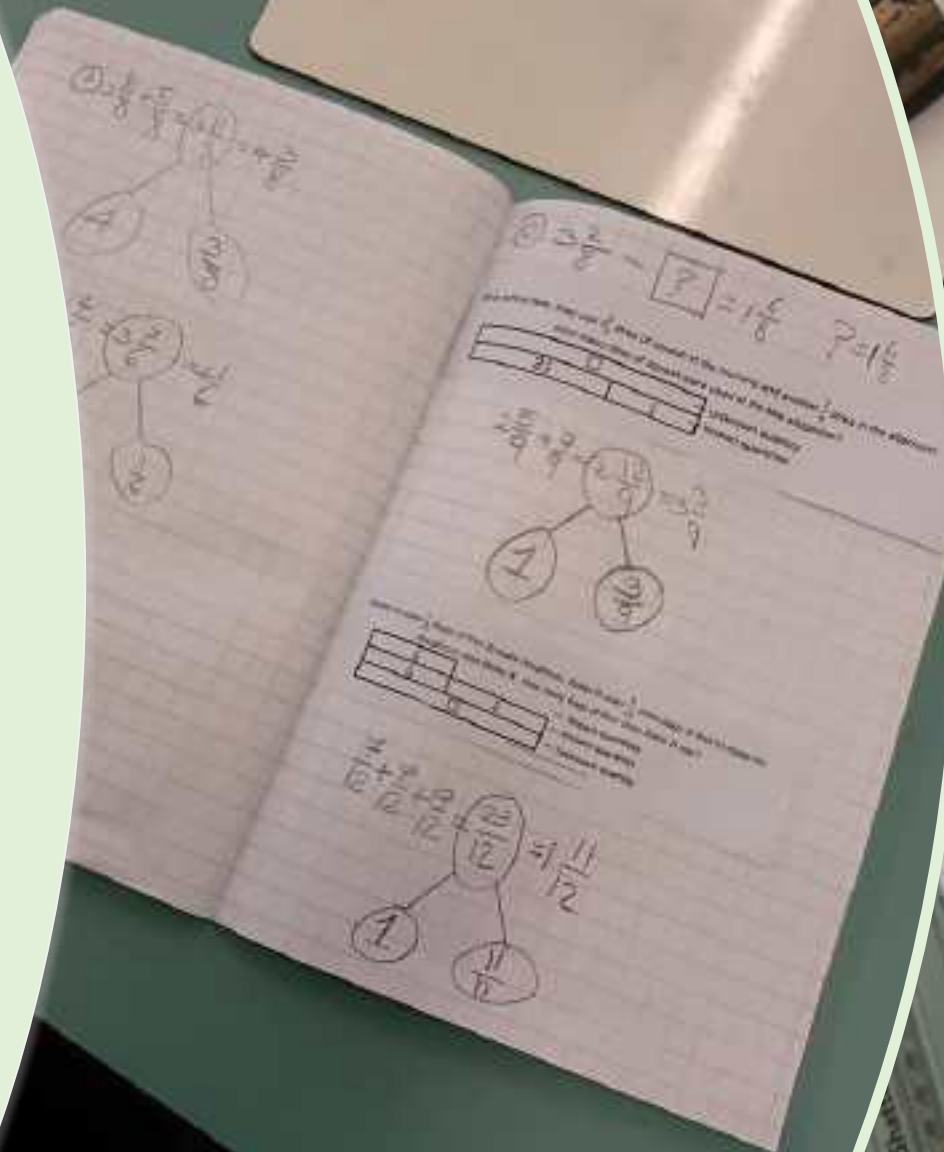

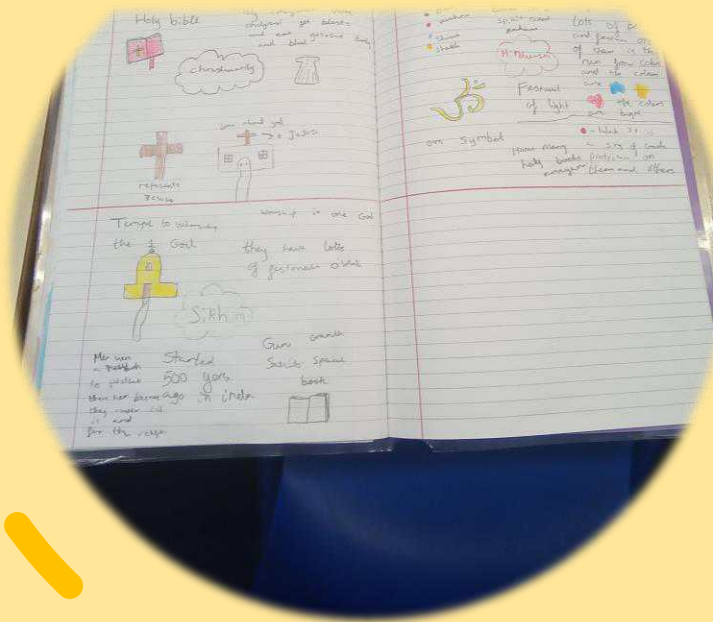

Year 3 have been learning about different faiths. We learnt about special festivals, places of worship & different Holy books. We have found it very interesting.

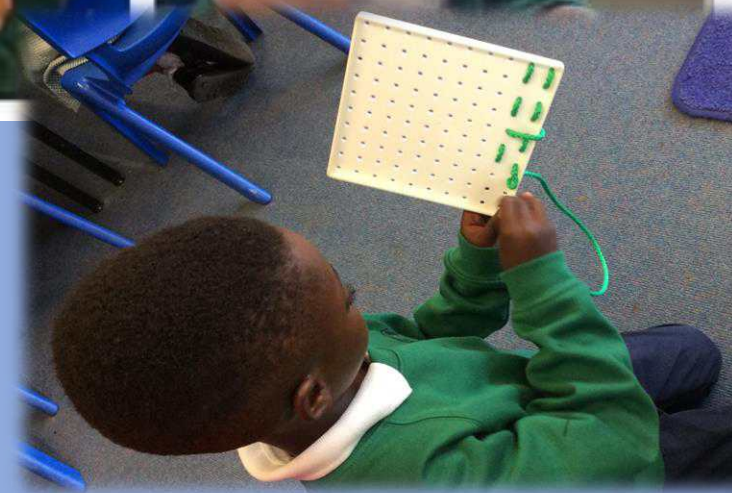
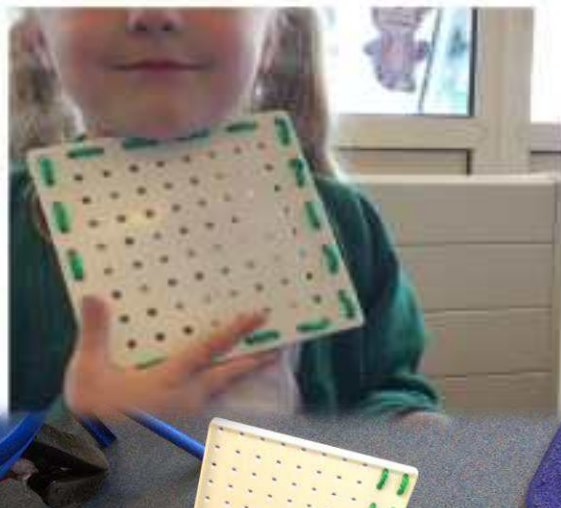




The children in Reception enjoyed having their parents in school for a stay and play session this week.

When Jesus' family heard what he was doing, they set out to take him away with them, convinced he was out of his mind. They falsely and foolishly claimed that Jesus' powers were not from God, but that he was using evil powers to heal people. Then Jesus' concerned mother and brothers arrived outside and sent in a message asking for him to come out to them. A crowd was sitting round Jesus at the time the message was passed to him, 'Your mother and brothers and sisters are outside asking for you.' Jesus replied, 'Who is my mother and who are my brothers?' And looking round at those sitting around him, he said, 'These people are also my mother and my brothers and sisters. Anyone who does the will of God is my brother or sister or mother.'
