They enjoyed exploring inside and outside







































The Nursery children during play and guided learning.

This was the first of 4 weeks learning about important community topics including anti-social behaviour, personal, road and cyber safety, bullying, hate crime and drug awareness.














Year 6 were busy investigating bubbles in their science workshop on Wednesday morning!






Year 4 classified invertebrates and vertebrates into groups in science.






Well done to our amazing netball team for another great win on Tuesday.

The children in Reception enjoyed having their parents in school for a stay and play session this week.



































In Reception, we are learning to weave and sew this half term.


