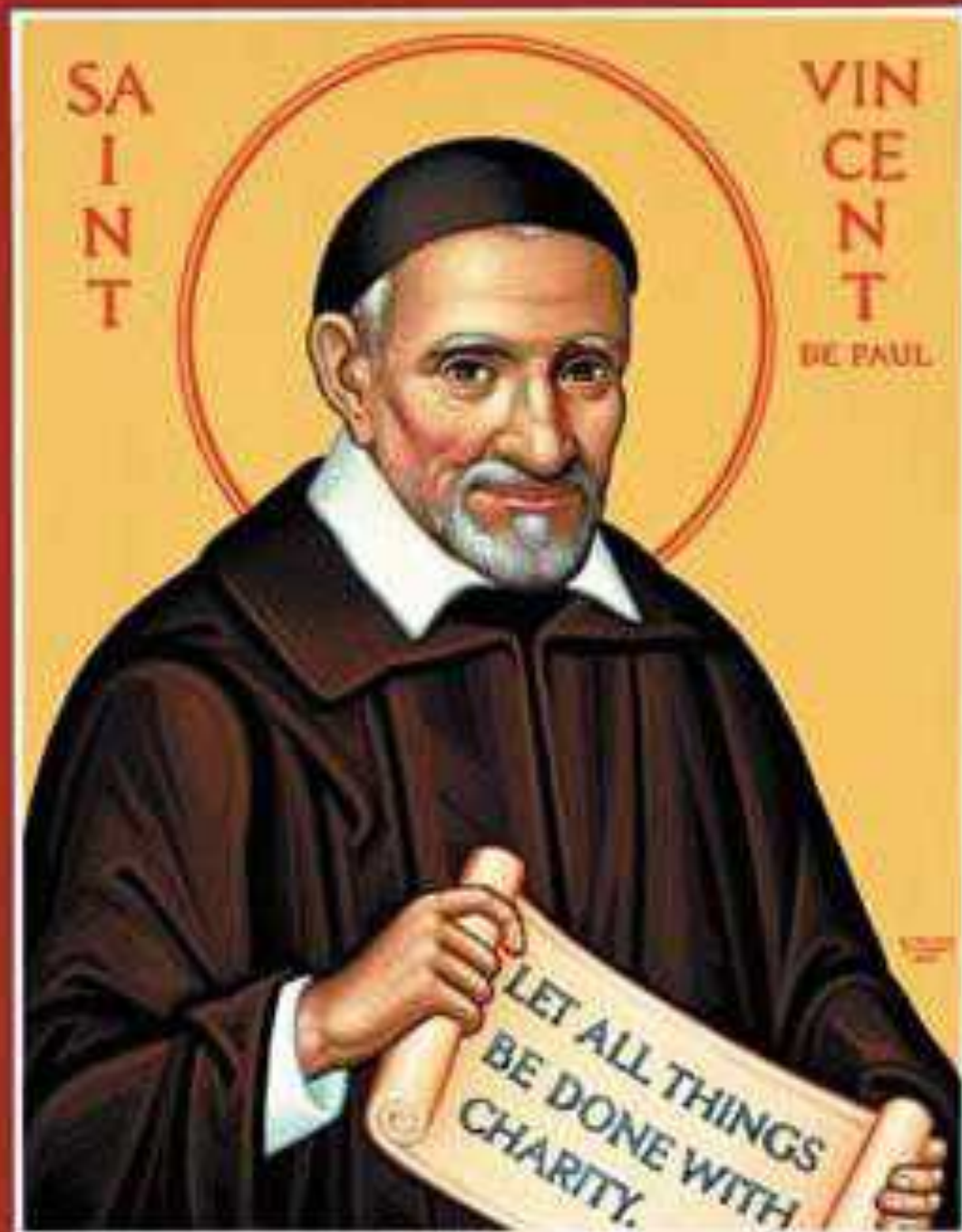

We have learned a new letter, 'o' ; had a PE session with Mr. Jennings; made 'Creation' pictures and produced collections of 3 objects.

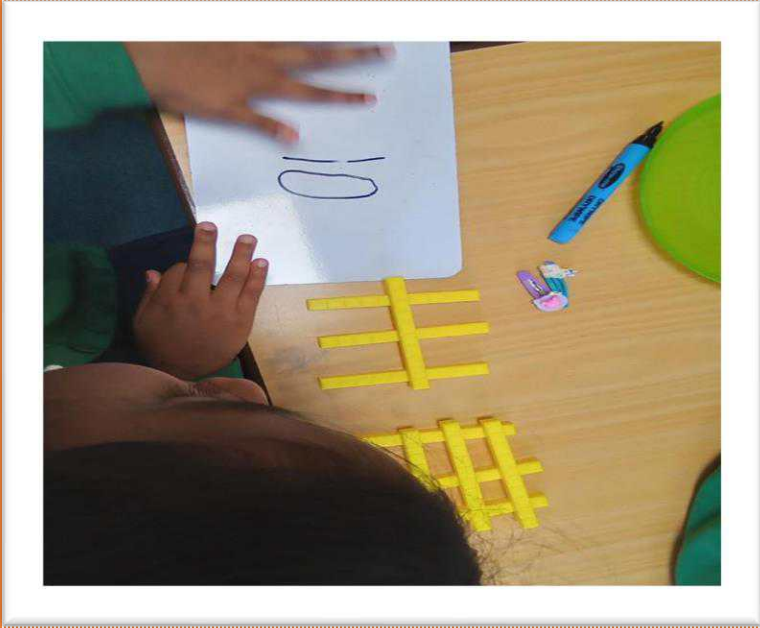






**Year 1 excitedly responding to a poem through their drawings and ideas.**

We are looking forward to their concert at Christmas.



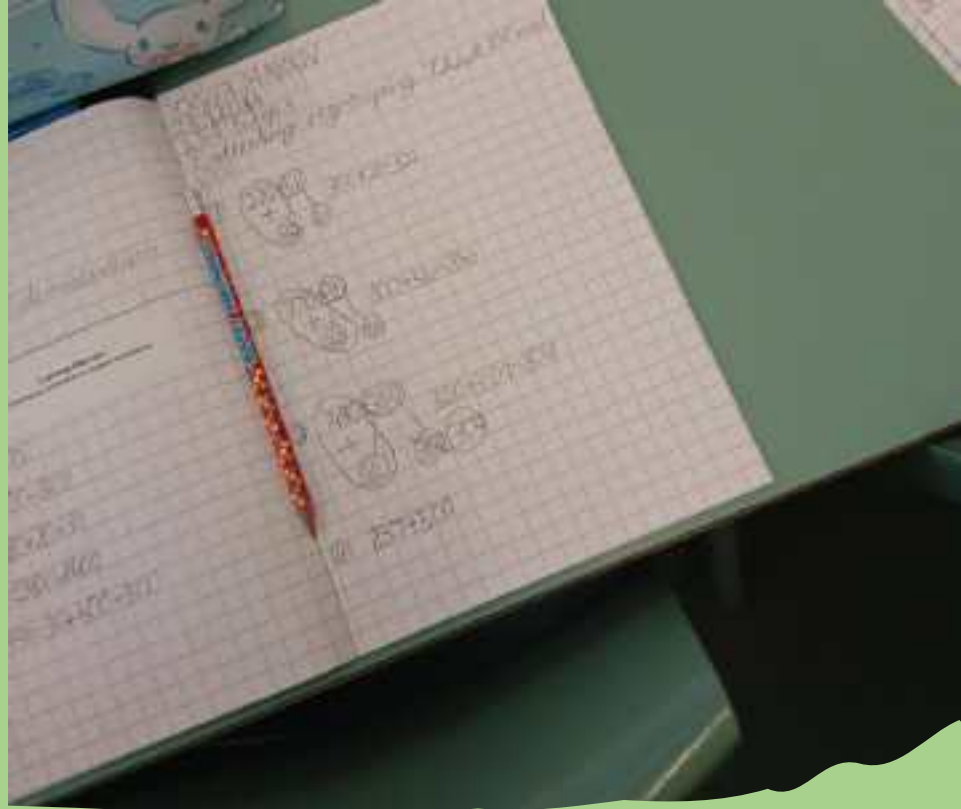
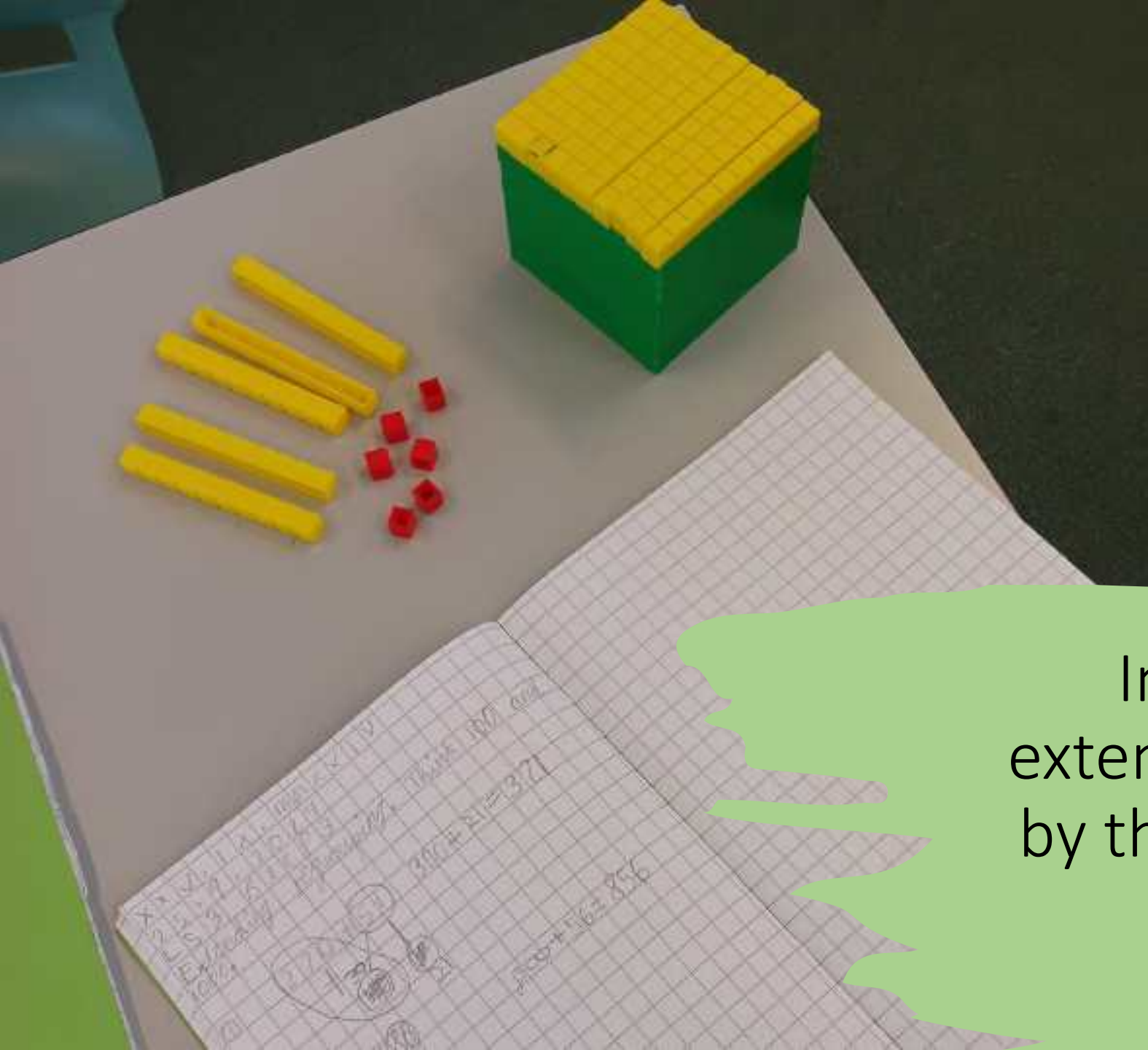




This week the Nursery children received an invitation to visit 'The Red Shed' to meet Freda the tortoise. We also said hello to a retired headteacher called Margaret.

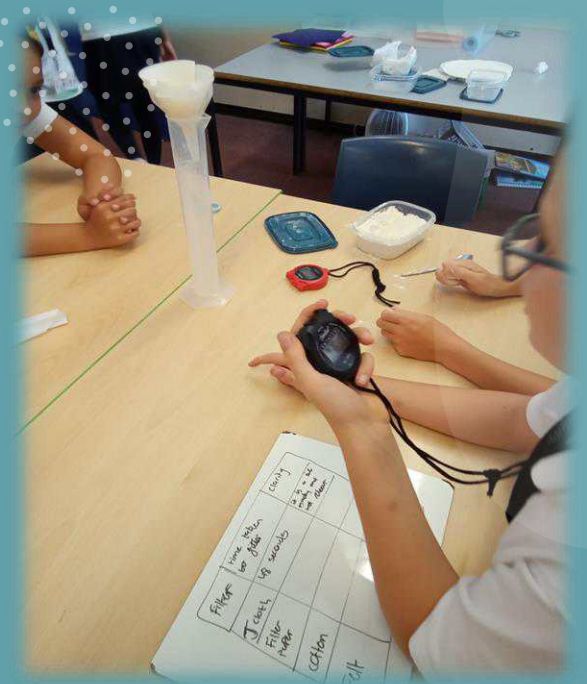


In Maths 4DA were extending their regrouping by thinking 100 and 1000.

 Stedum in Royston.

We separated a solid and liquid by using filtration.  
 We used 4 filters to see which filter produced the  
 clearest water.



Filter	time taken to filter	clarity
J cloth	48 seconds	it is a bit mucky and not clear
Filter paper	more than 5 minutes	decently clear not too clear though.
cotton	292 seconds	cloudy.
Felt	more than 5 minutes	not clear a bit mucky and cloudy.

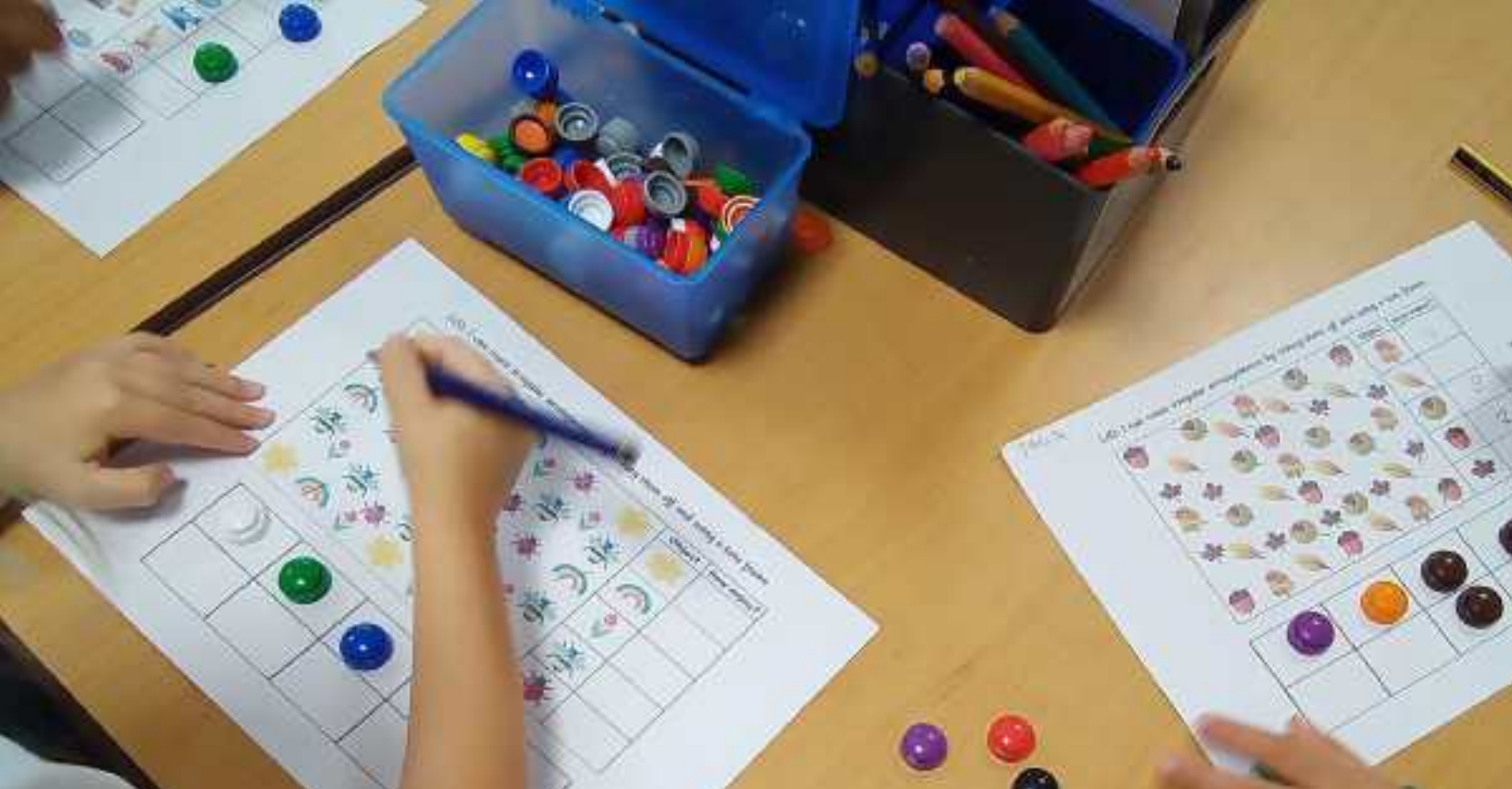




Nursery children have been enjoying the story 'Owl Babies'. We have also been watching a BBC clip of two owlets hatching and growing.

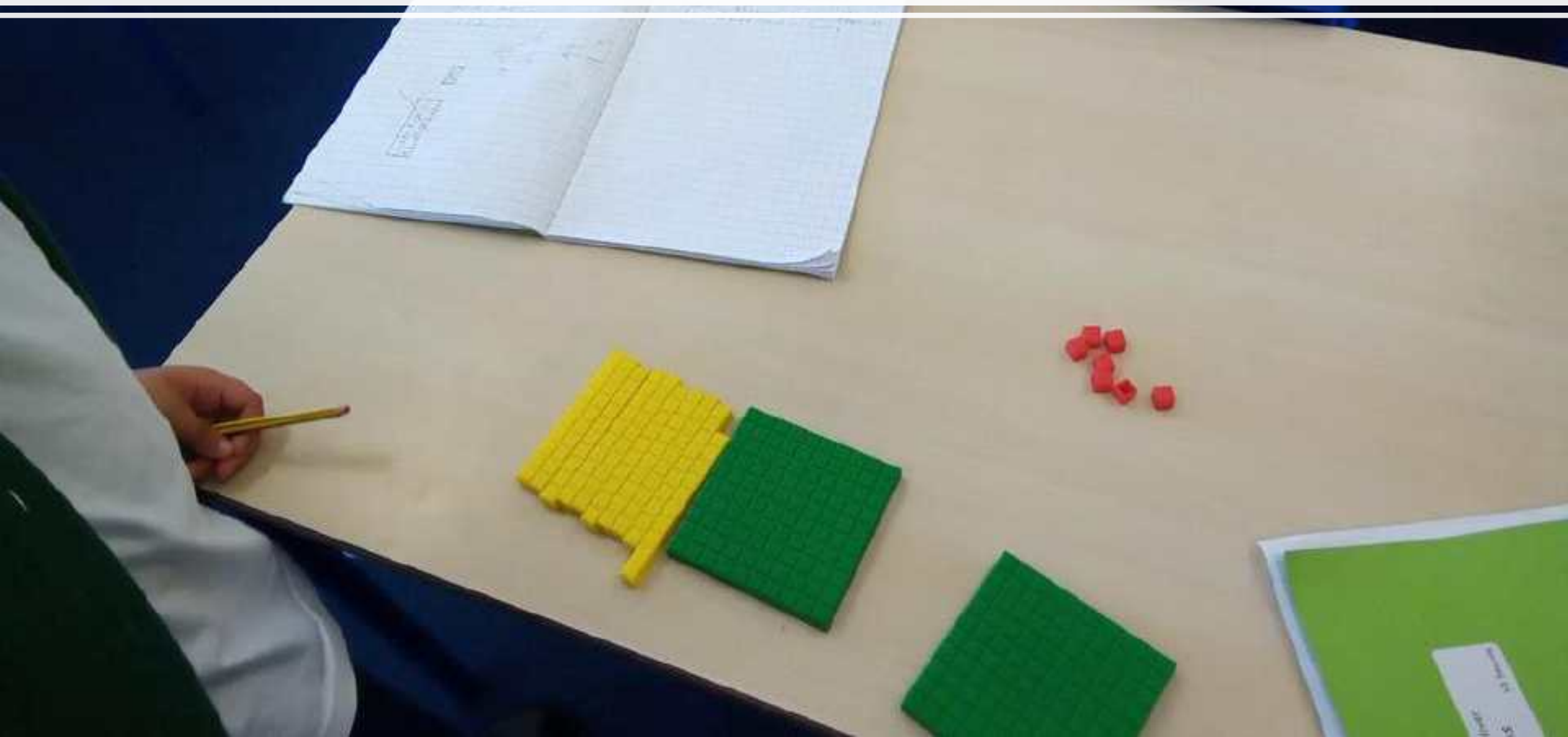


They have enjoyed exploring and learning in the outdoor area this week, despite the wet weather!





Year 3 learning how to regroup, counting back in 10s past 100.





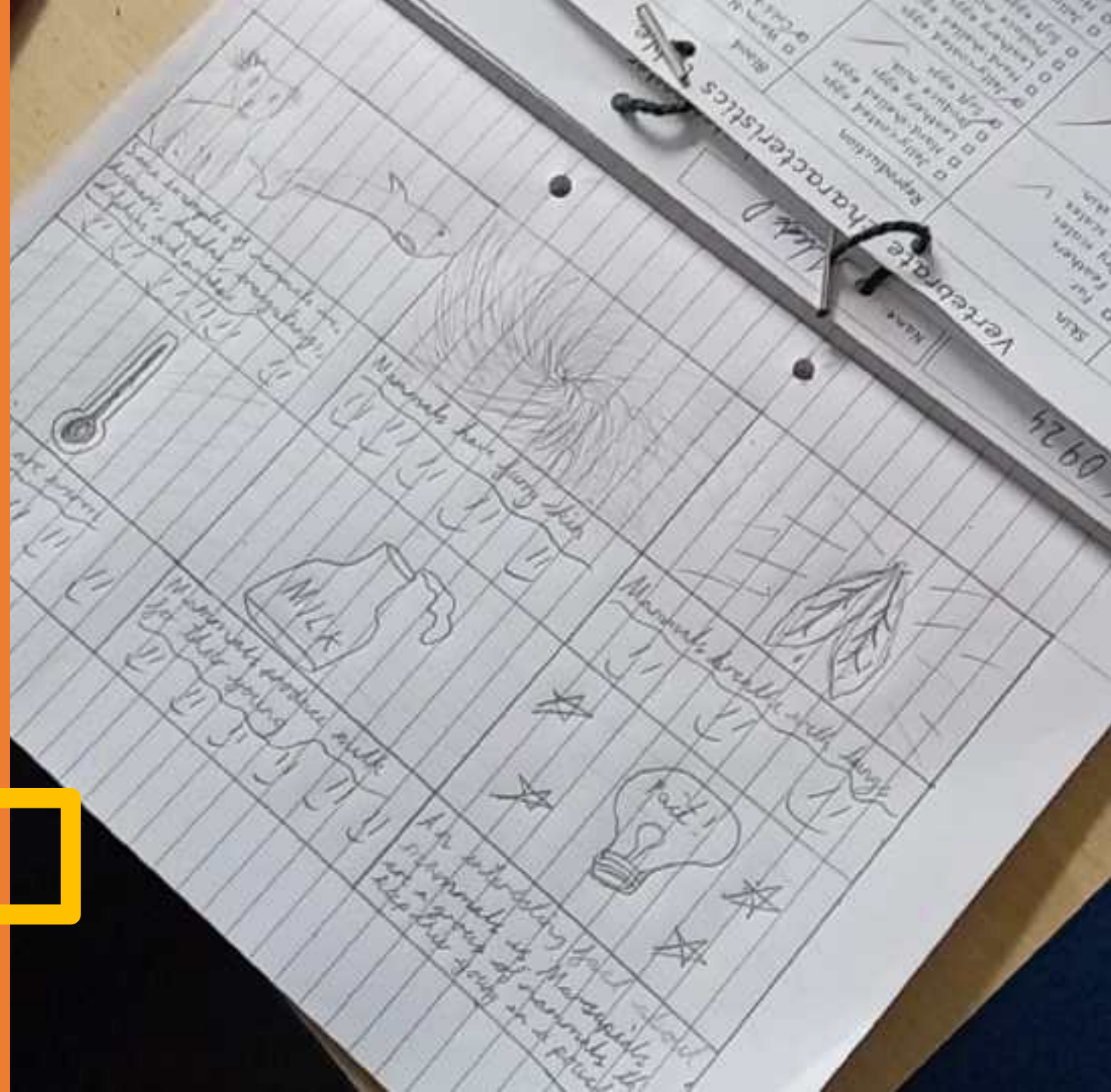

Year 3 getting ready for our St Vincent de Paul feast day Mass on Friday.





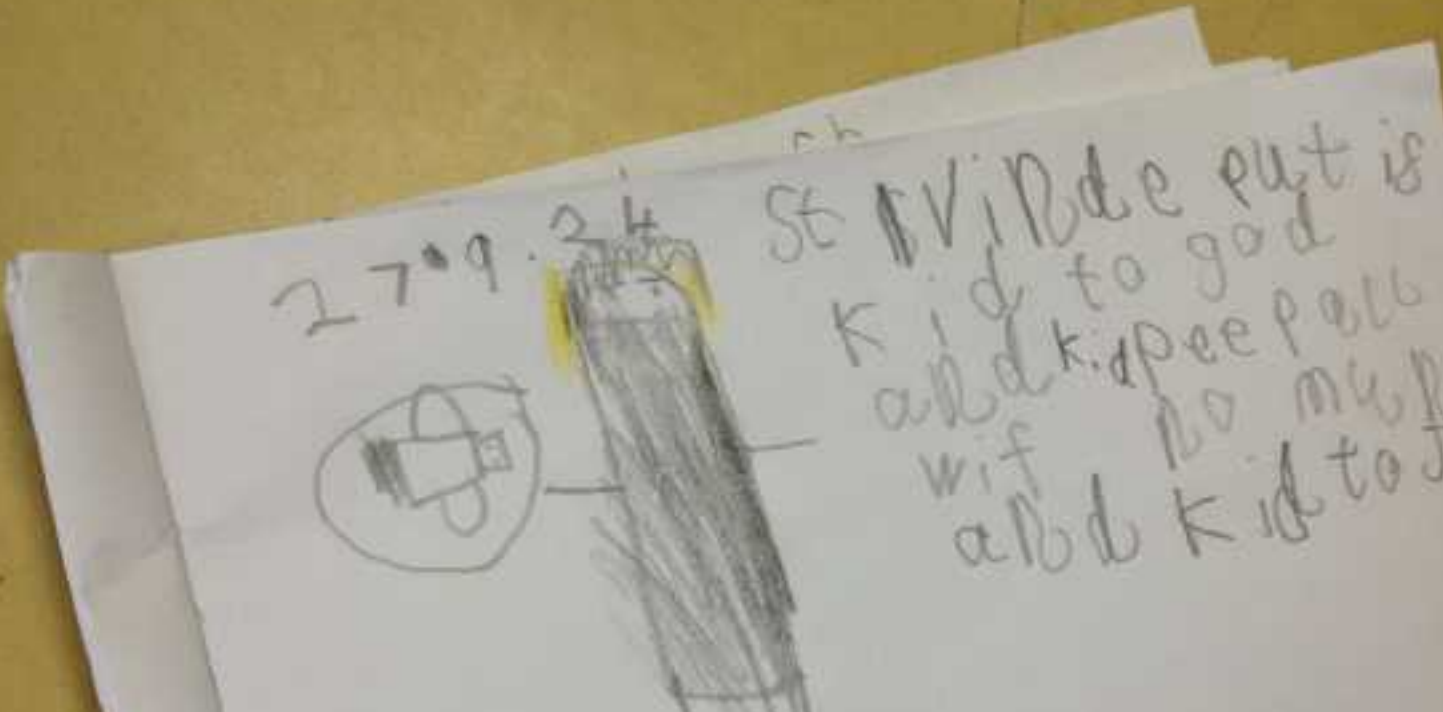
**Year 5 Teresa has been learning about the life and mission of Saint Vincent de Paul.**

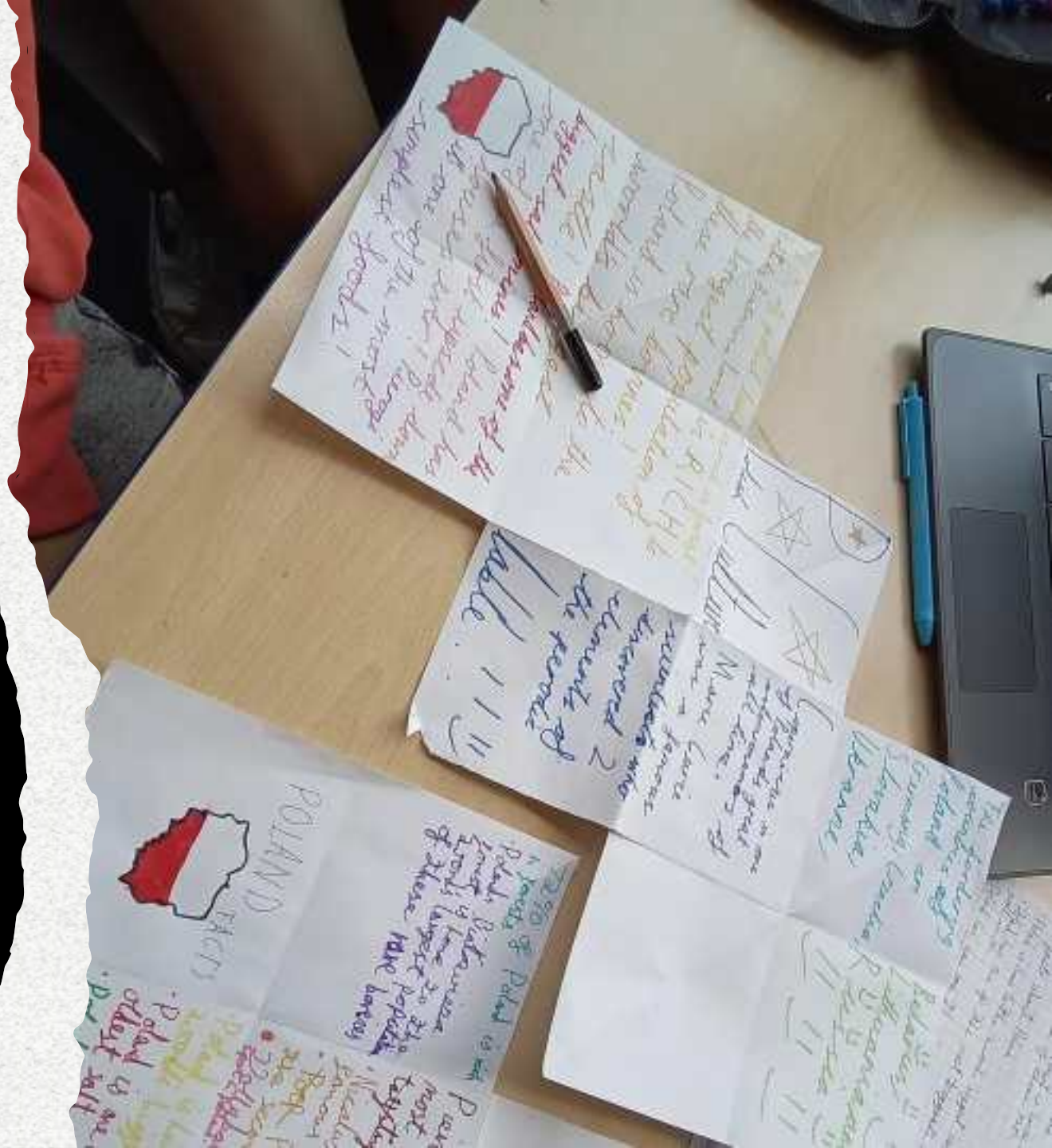

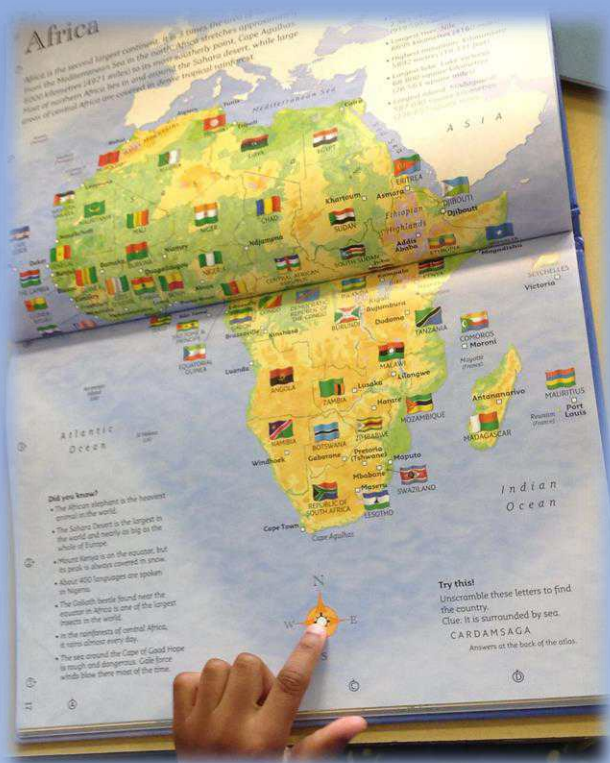




**Year 1, as part of our community celebration completing a task about belonging.**







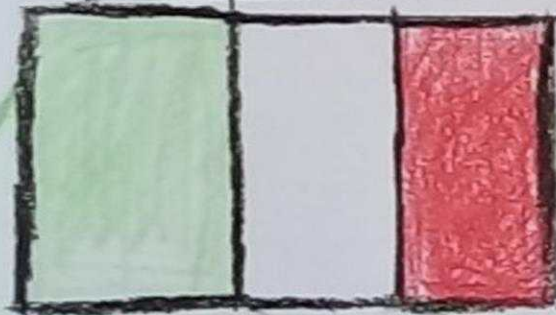

**Pope Francis**

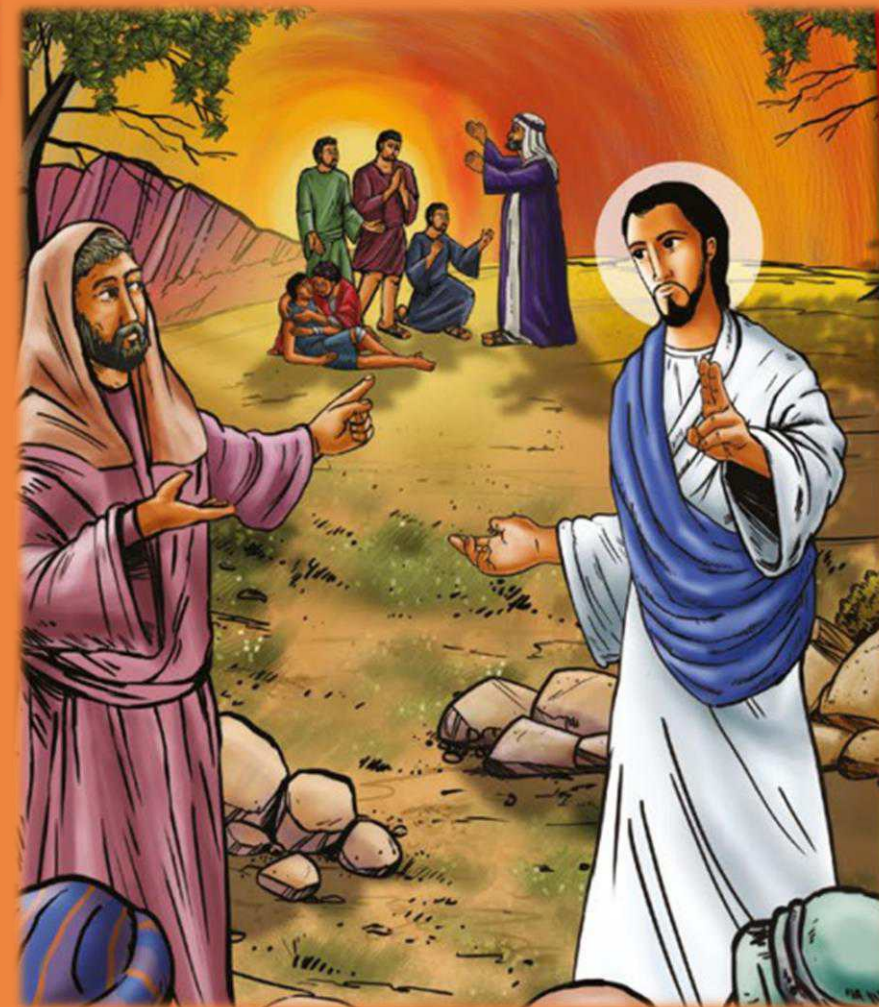
**"Let us allow God to fill our hearts with his goodness. A good example brings about so much good. Goodness always tends to spread."**
