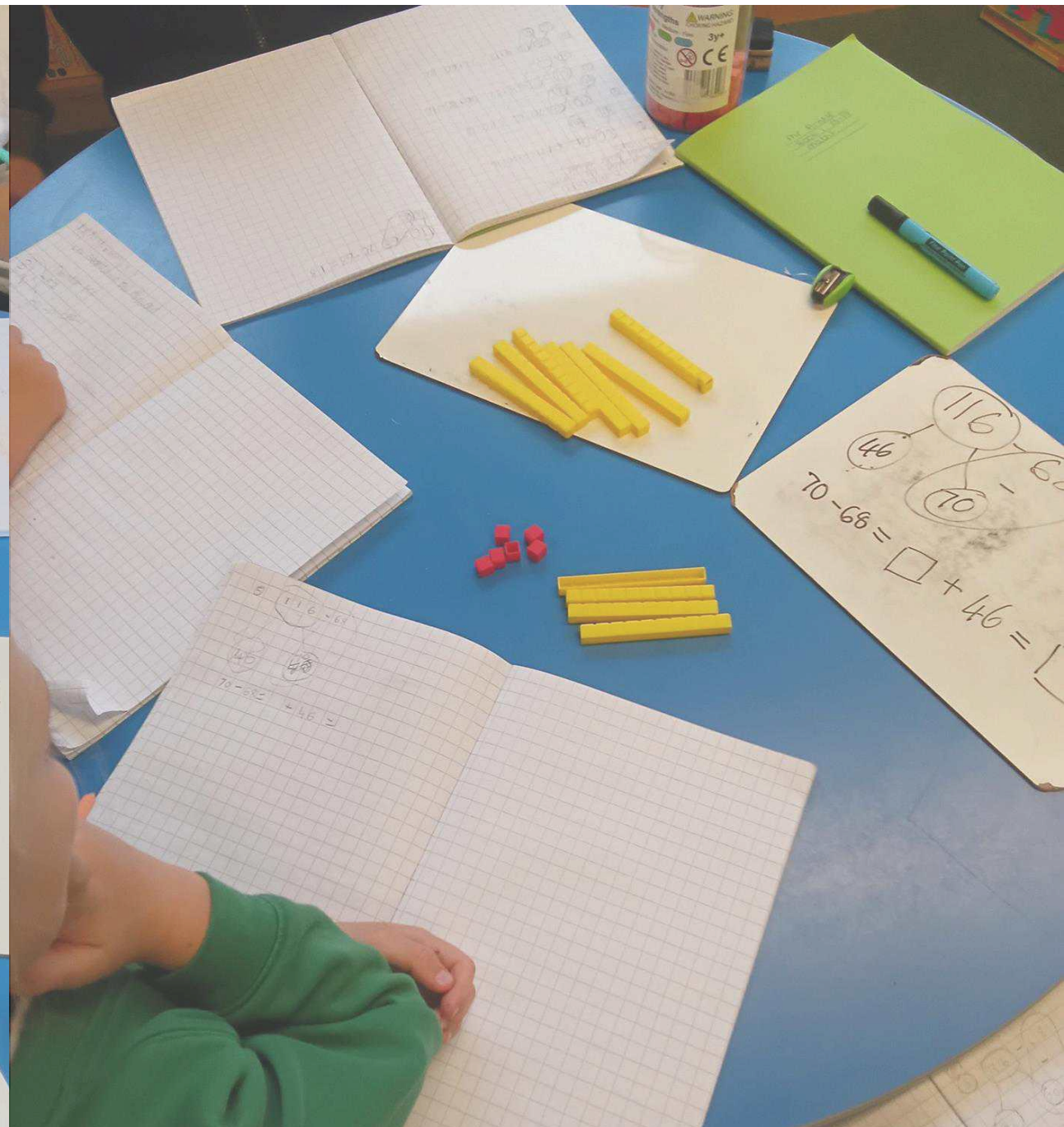
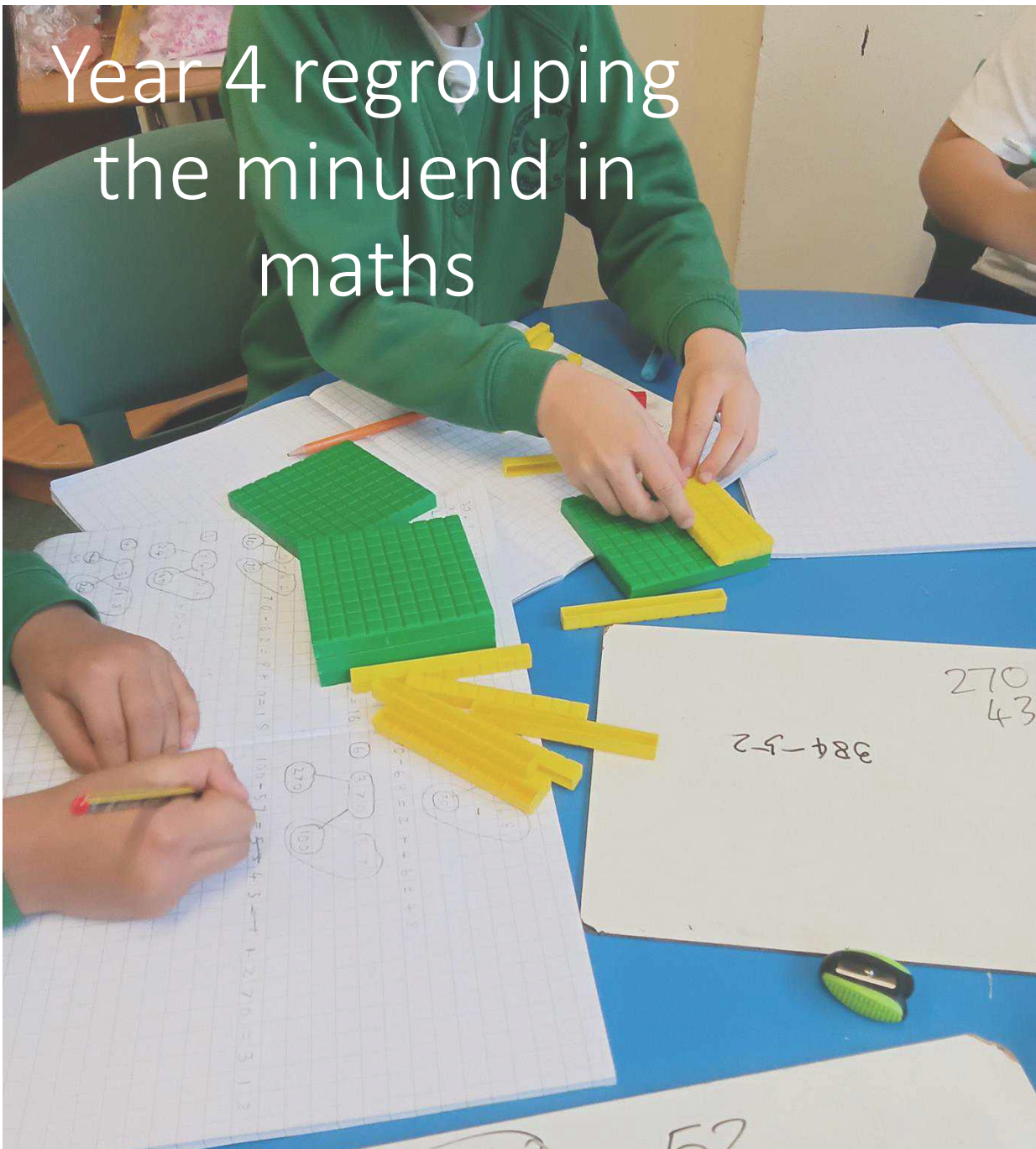
Y6 Shakespeare were busy enjoying their rounding games on Monday morning in their maths lesson!





Year 3 enjoyed their game of 'Wonky' in maths. Some very strategic thinking was going on to make the greatest value number.

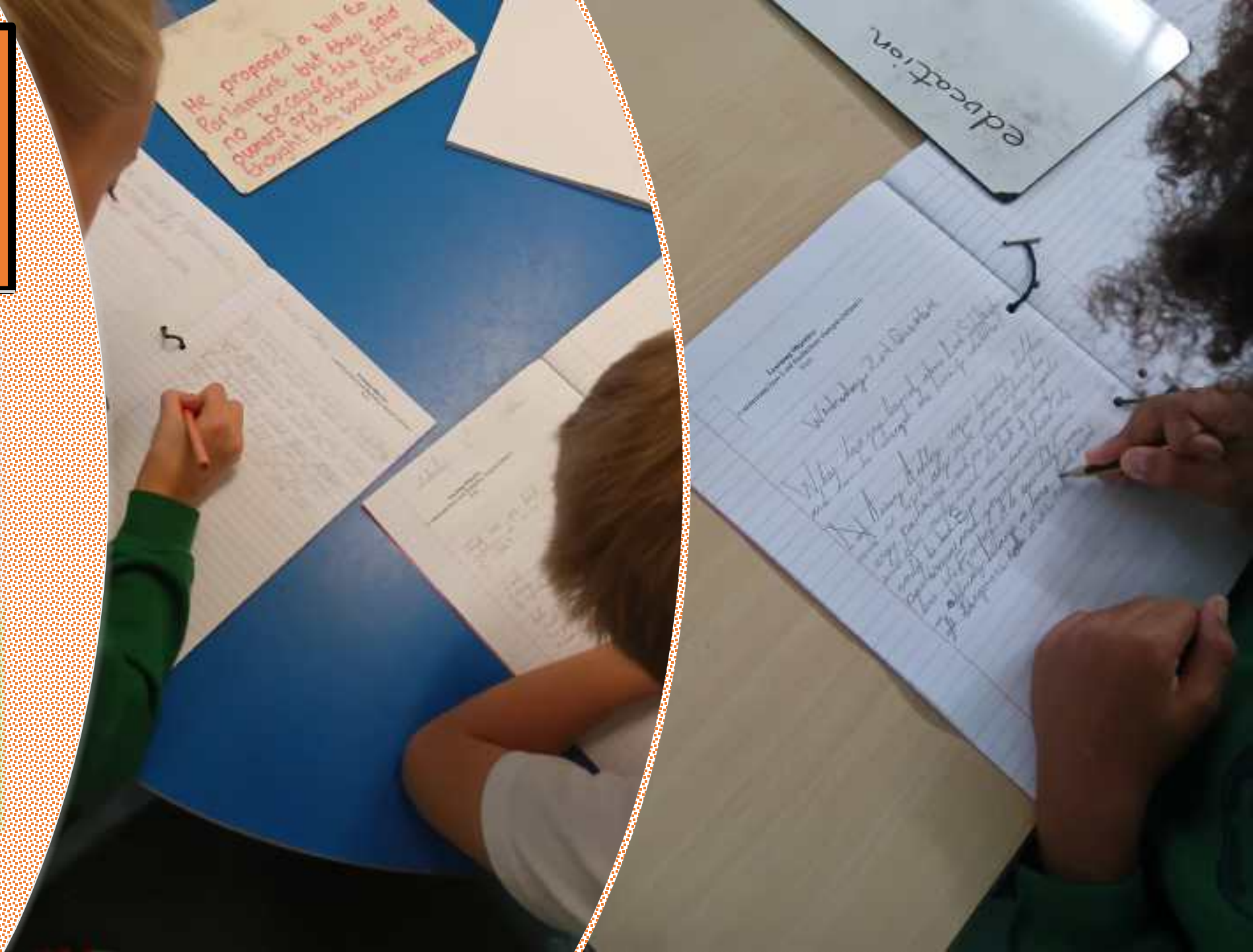
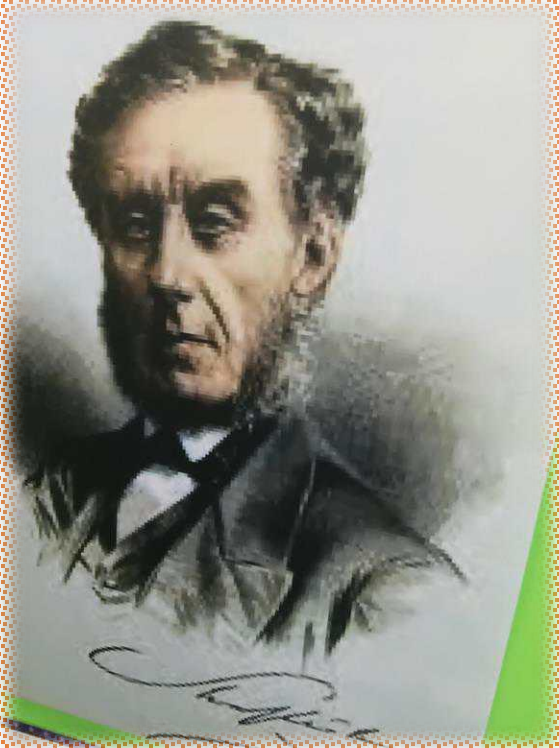

He proposed a bill to Parliament but it was not passed because the Quakers and other religious groups thought that would be wrong.

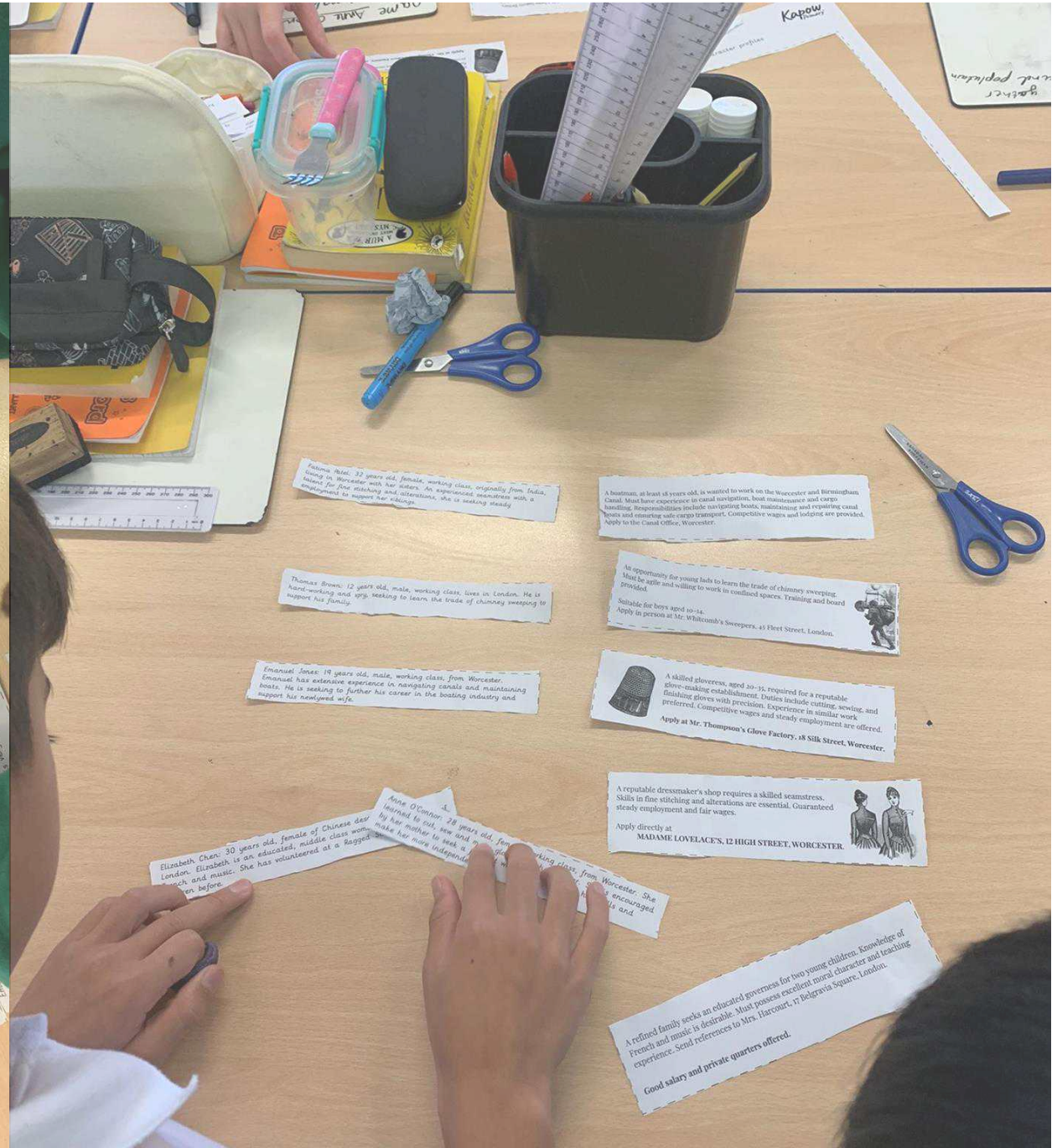
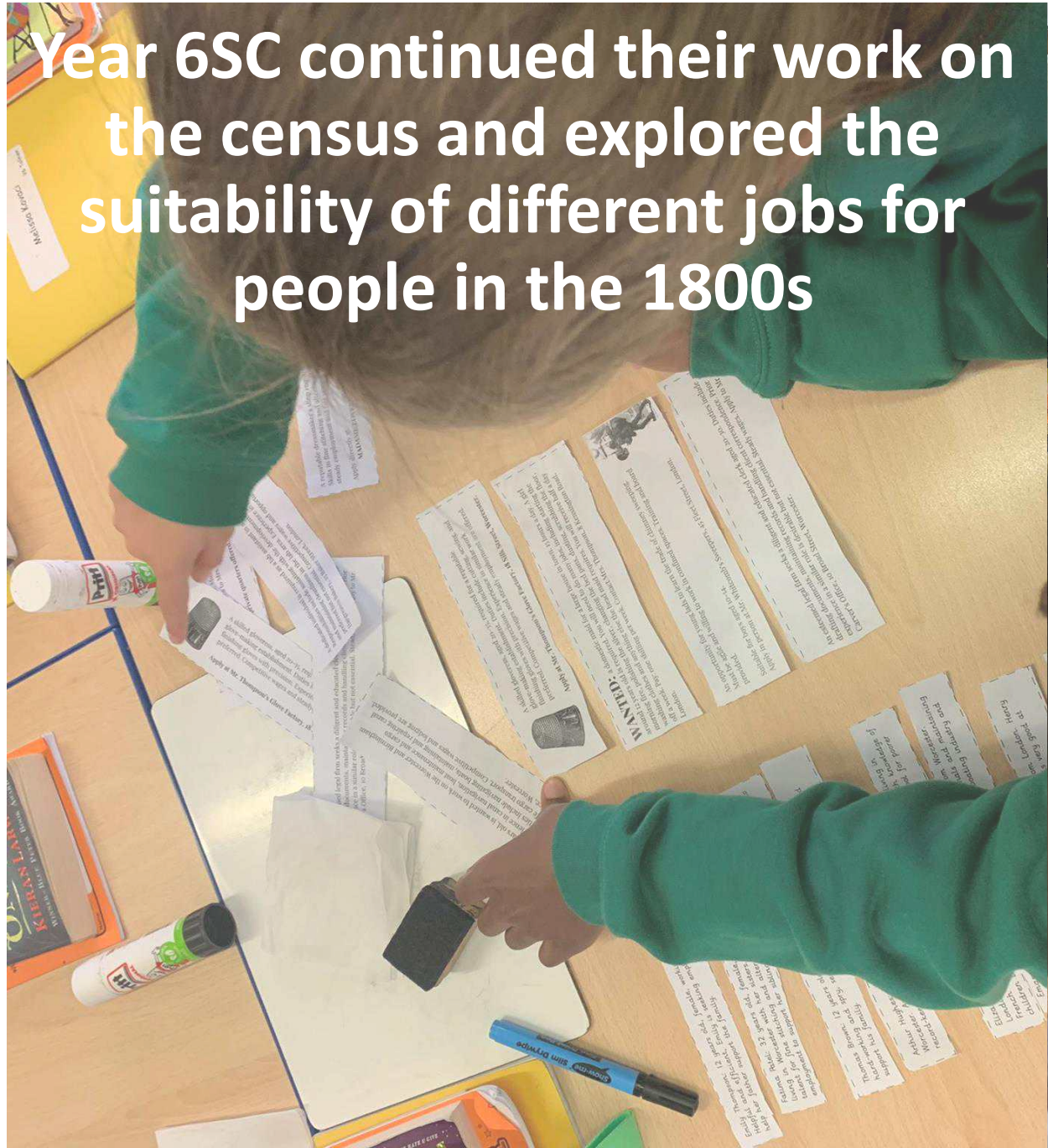

Year 1 reflected on God's creation and worked together to produce a frieze of land and water animals.

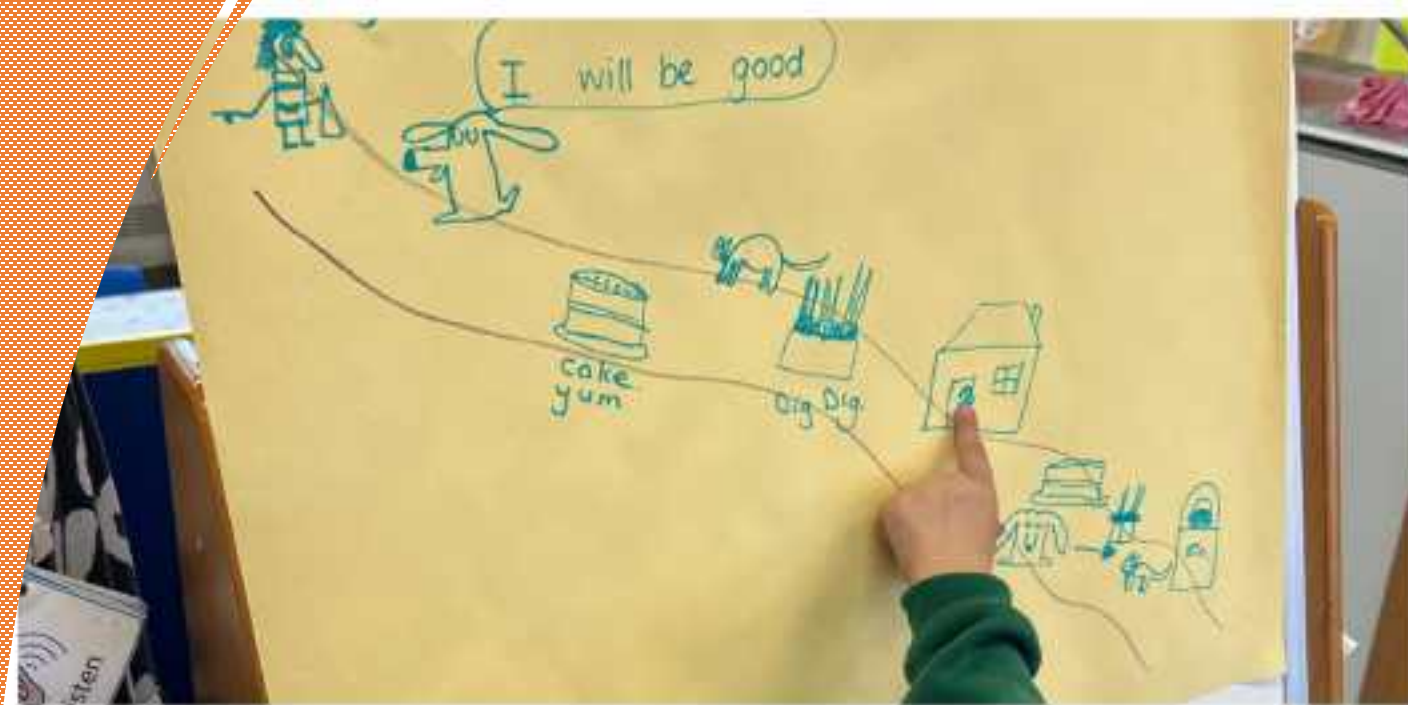

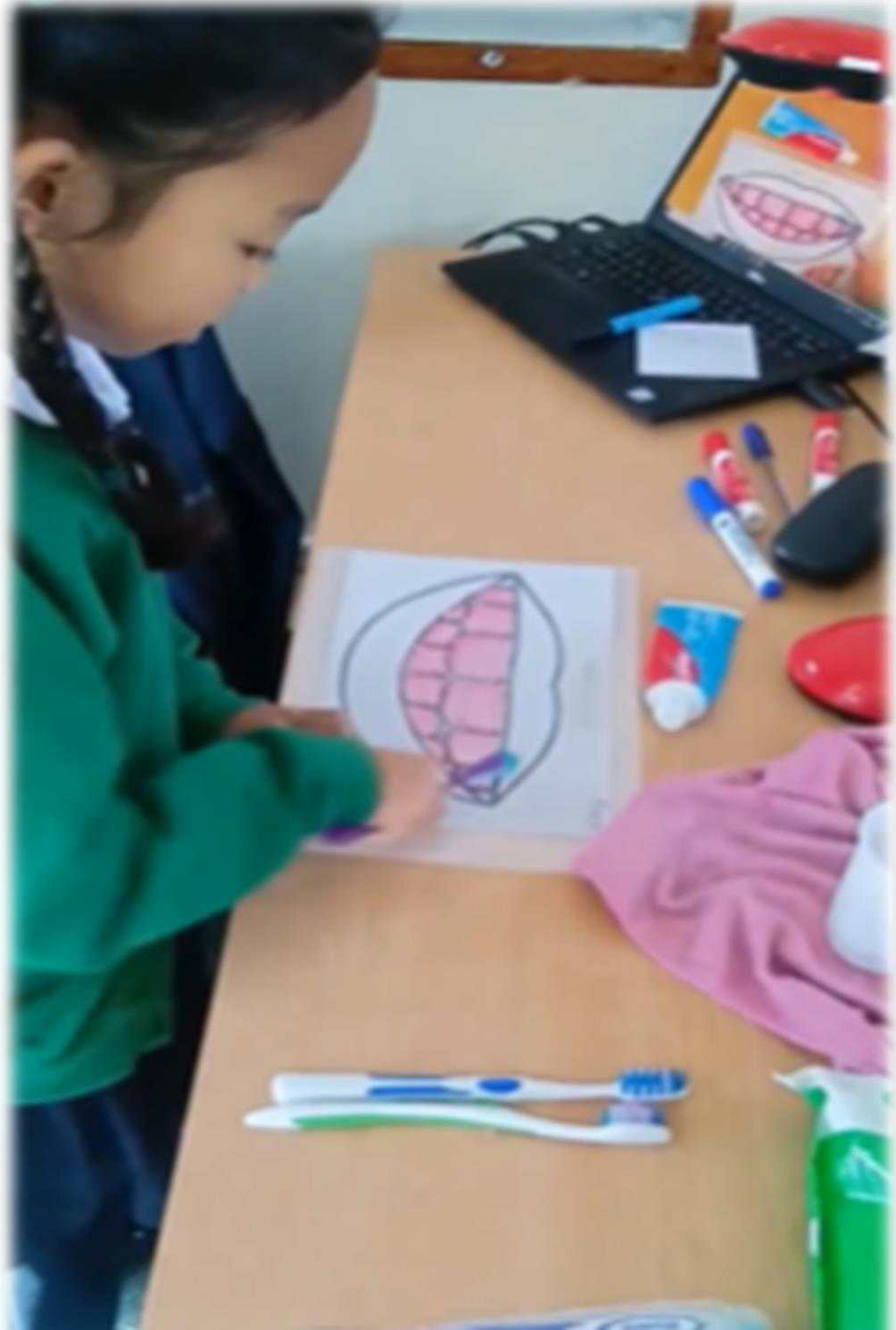


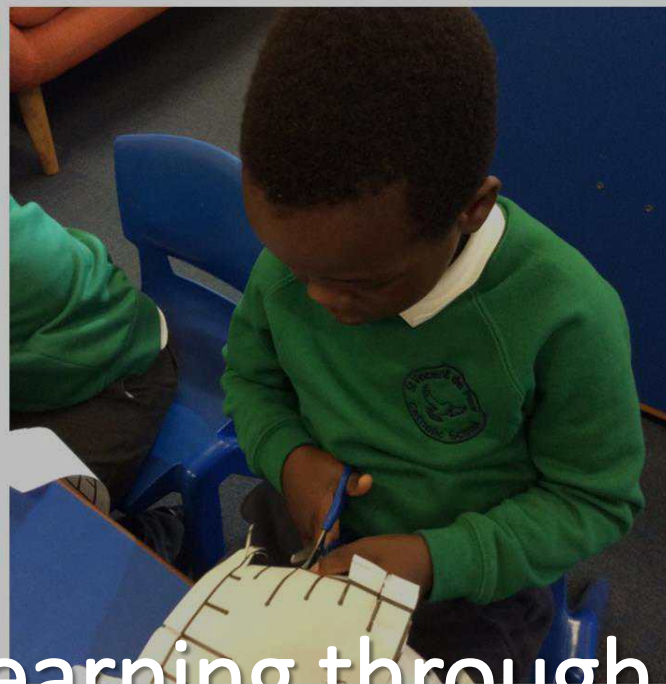
Reception are also learning to use a story map to retell a story. We can recall events and sequence them.



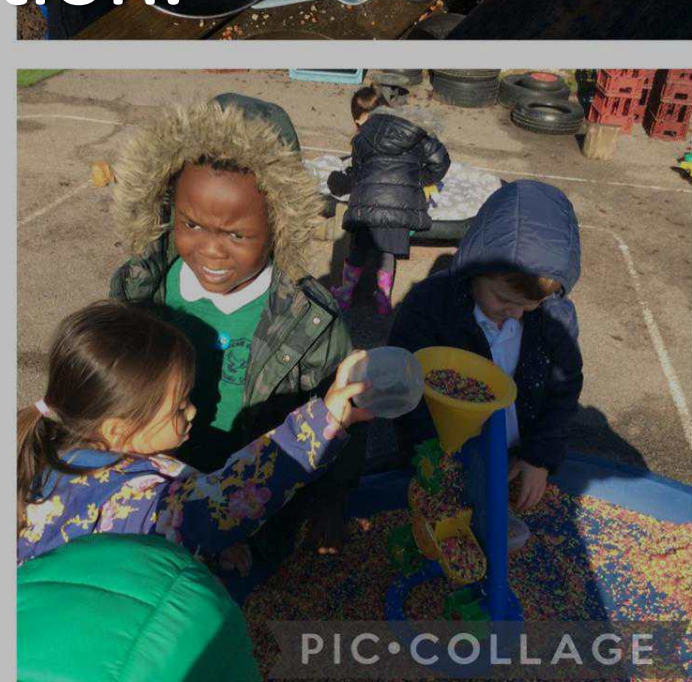
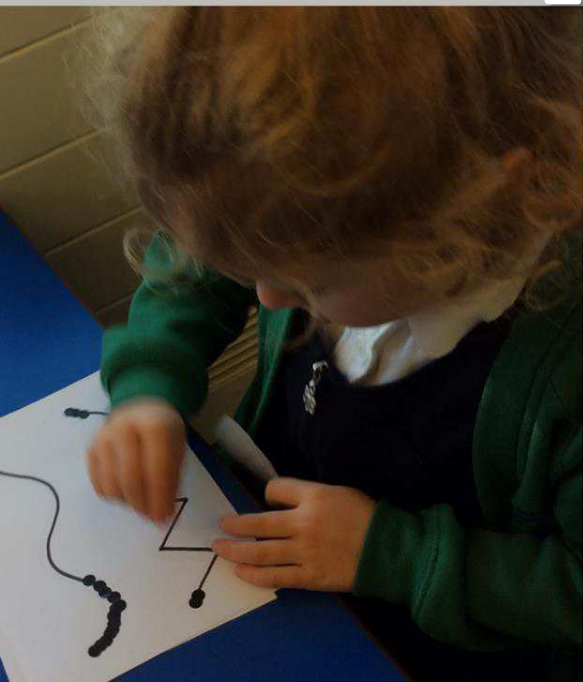

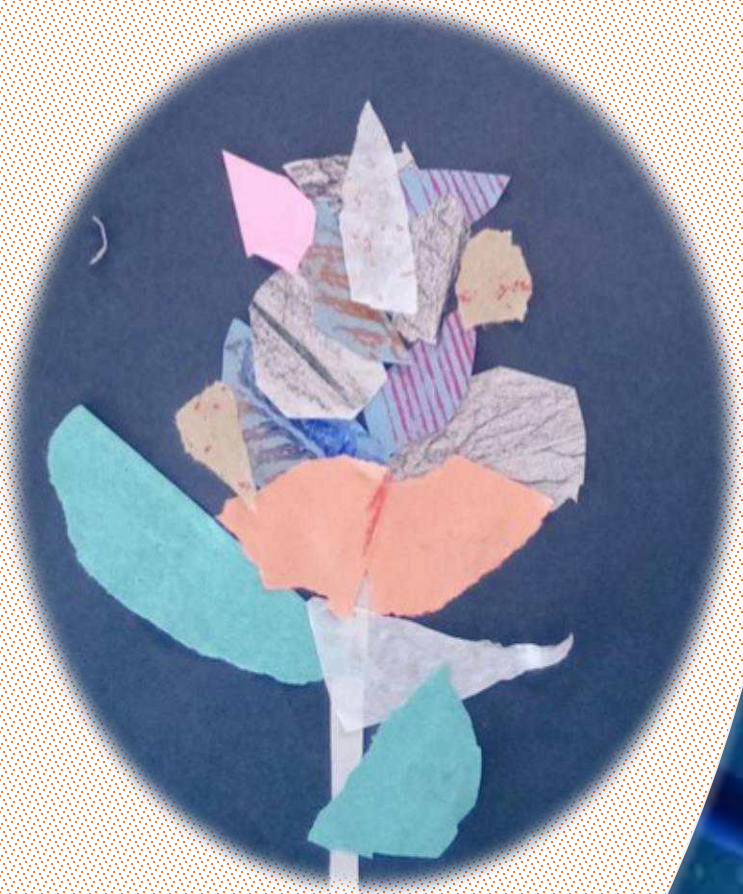




Shakespeare class have been exploring photorealism.

People were bringing little children to be with Jesus. The disciples turned them away, but when Jesus saw this he was annoyed and said to them, "Let the little children

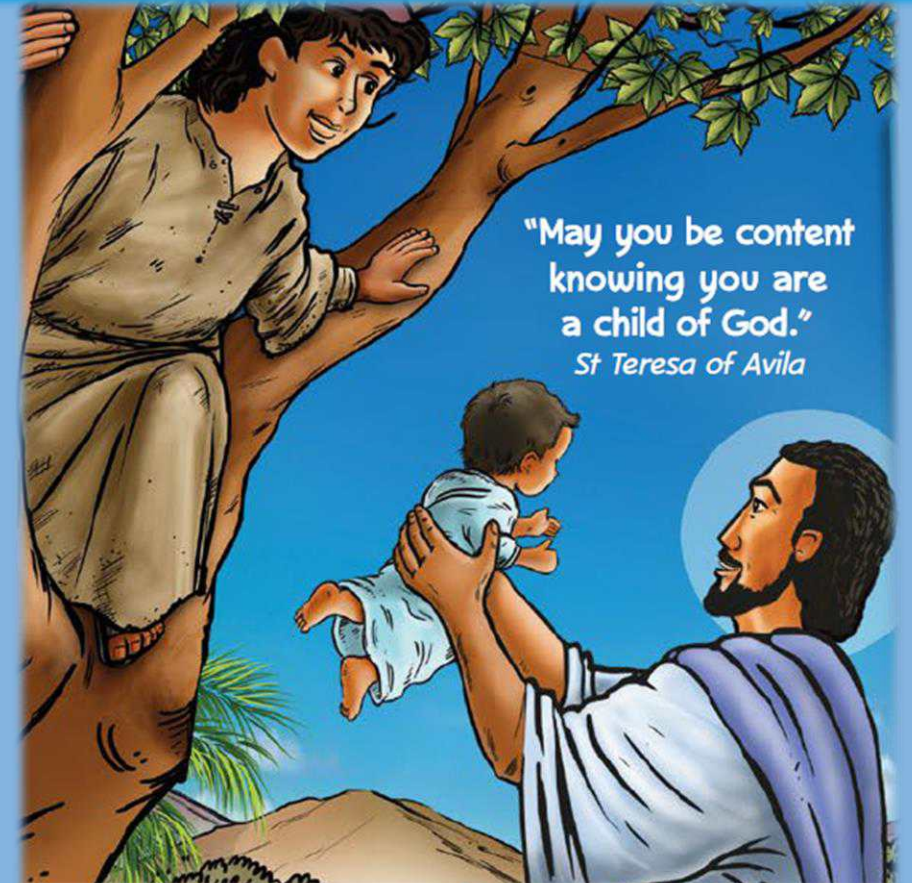
