



Dear God, I thank you!























Year 5 pupils have been designing and making their own pieces of installation Art.





















Another amazing clarinet lesson in Year 5 Teresa on Tuesday. The children can now play C, D, E, F and G and the squeaks are getting fewer!






It was lovely to hear one of our year 3 children share the 'Our Father' in Romanian during our year 3 collective worship.



Year 6 explored multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000 by completing a tarsia puzzle!













Reception class were busy, making information books on dogs.








Fun and learning in Reception practising our phonic knowledge and making the most of a bright afternoon.


