

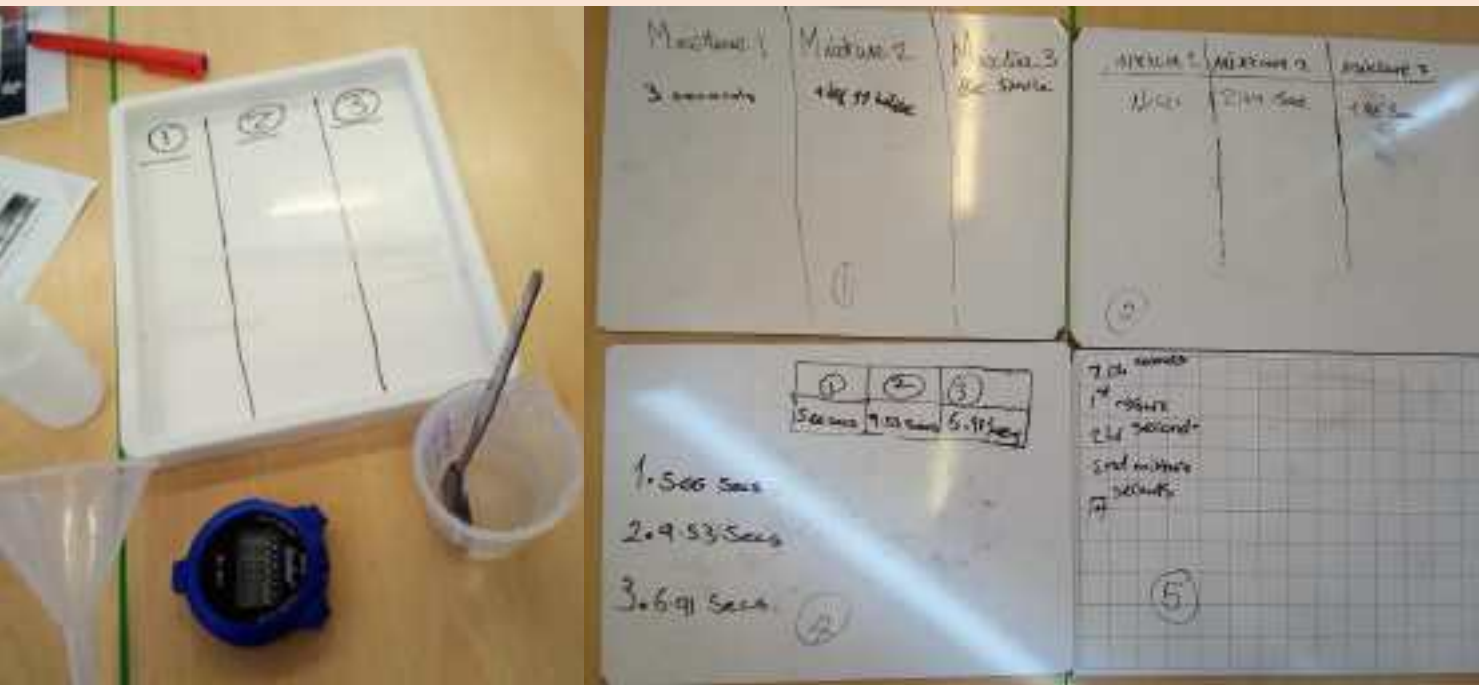
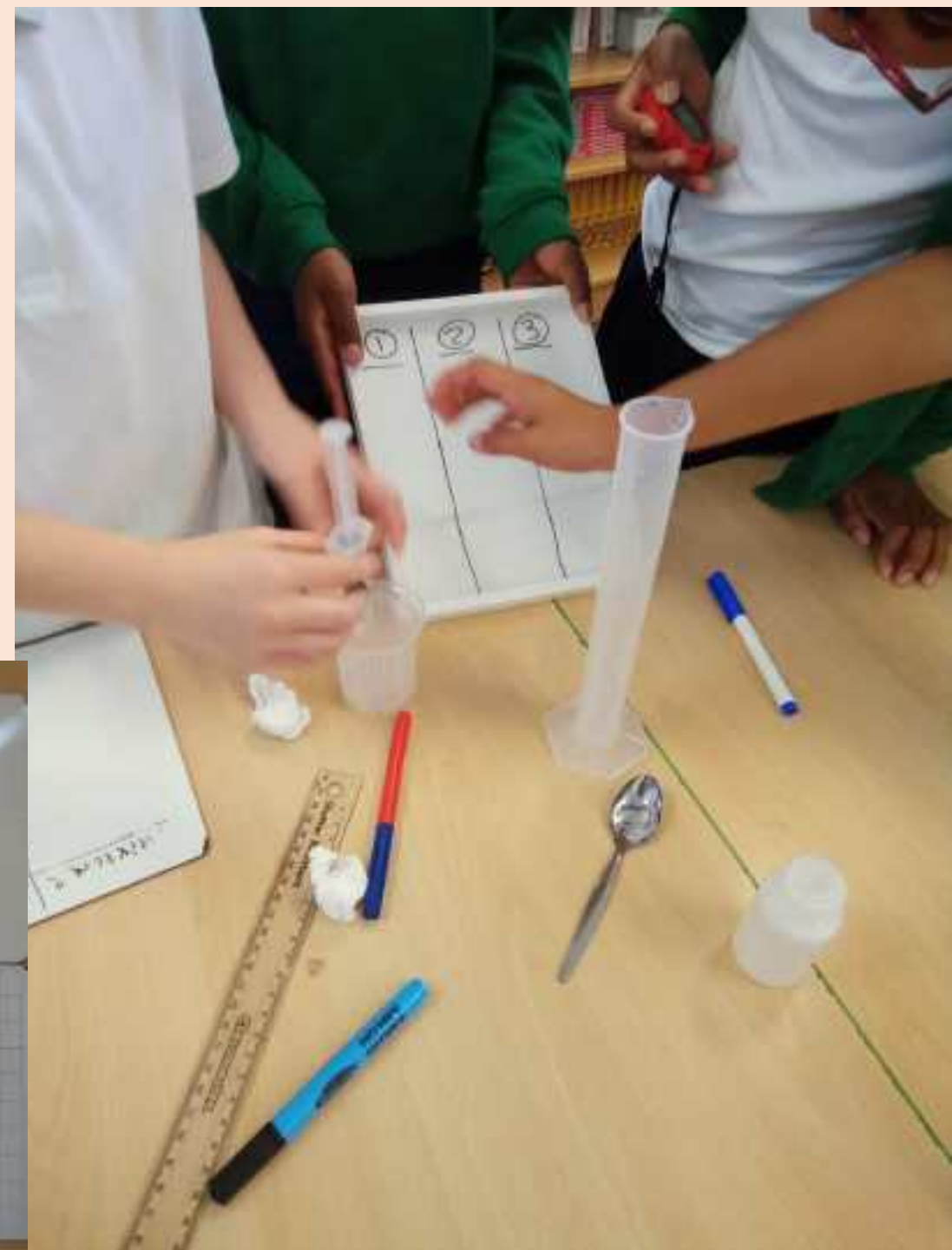

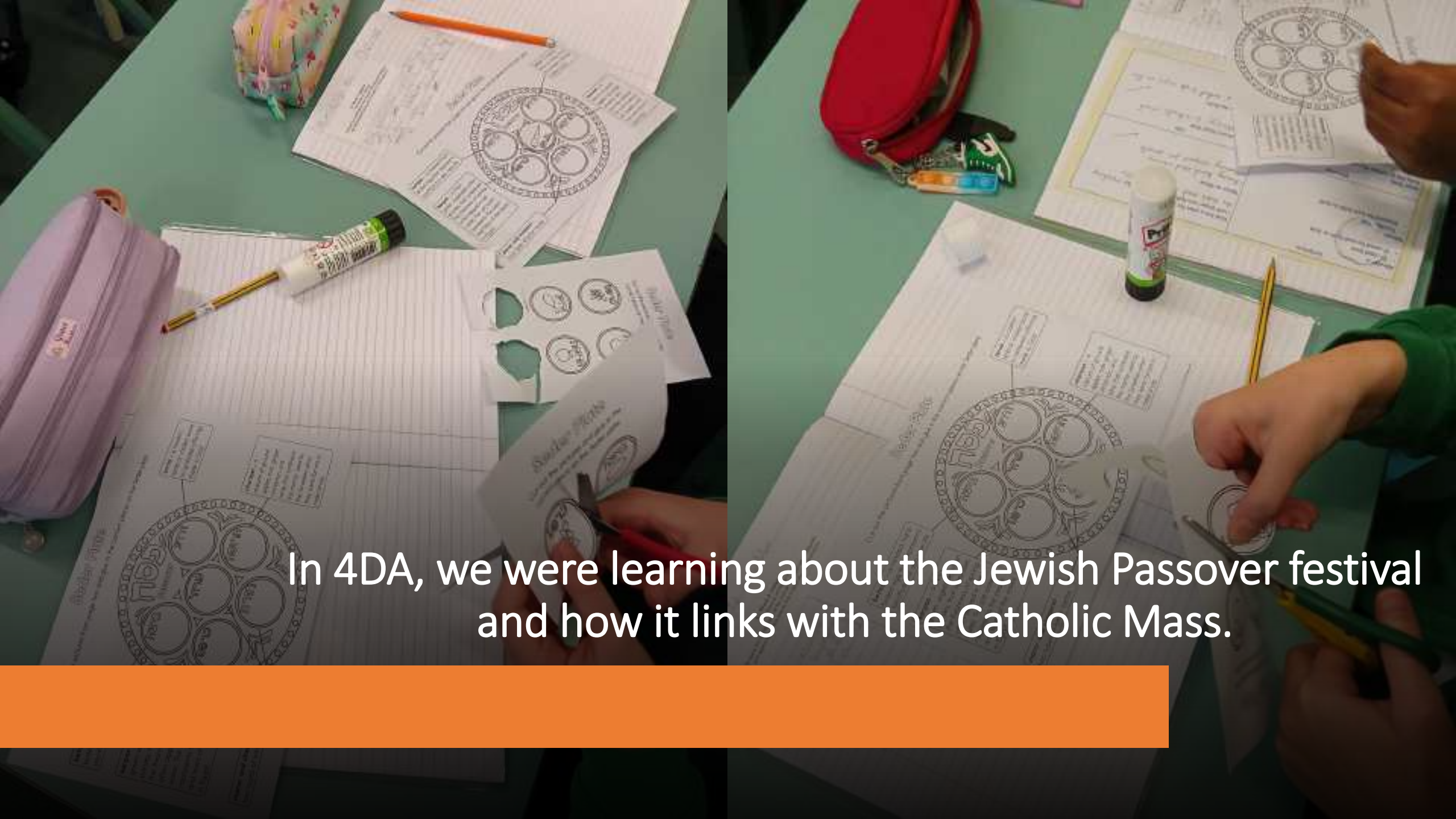
POEM

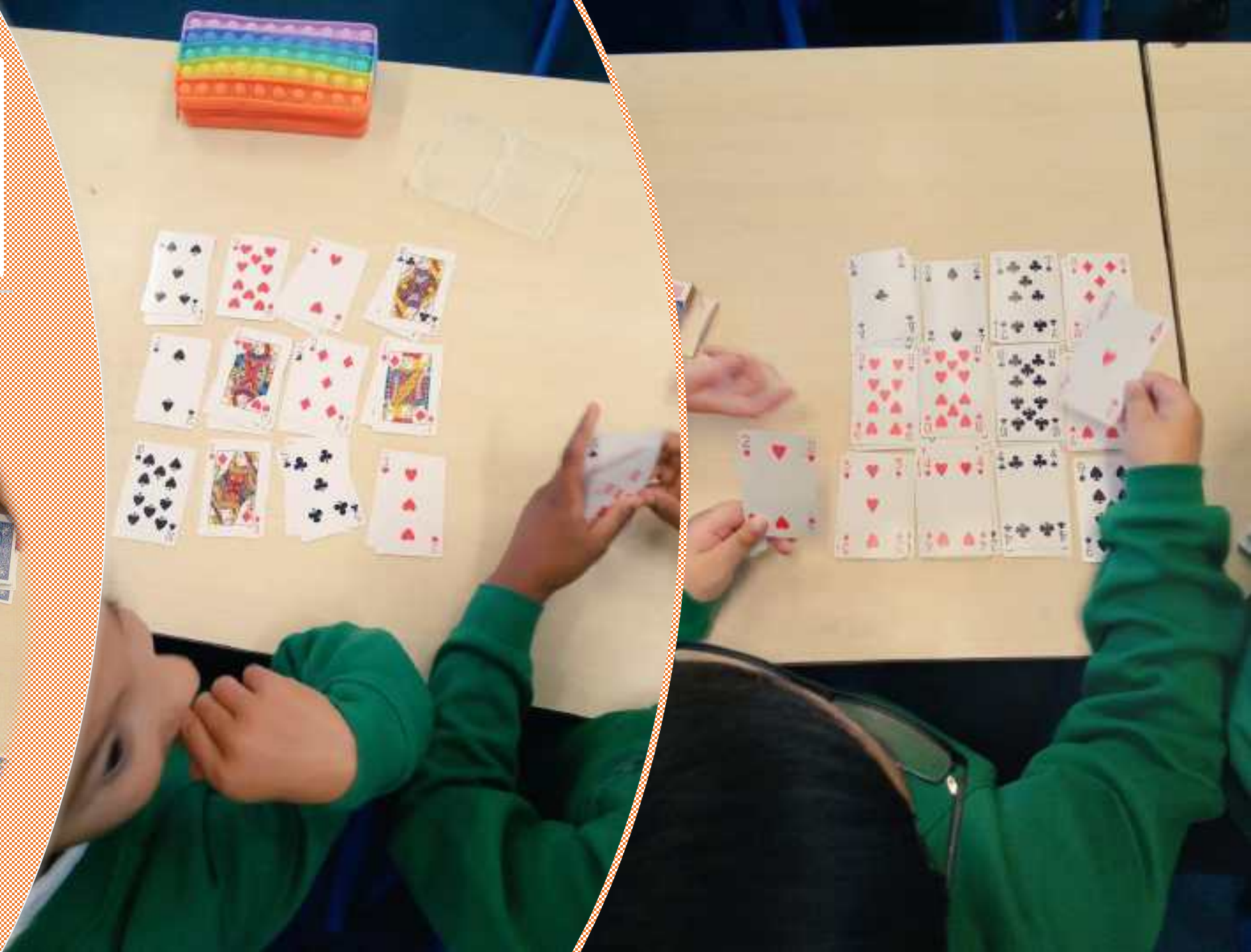


In 4DA, we were learning about the Jewish Passover festival and how it links with the Catholic Mass.

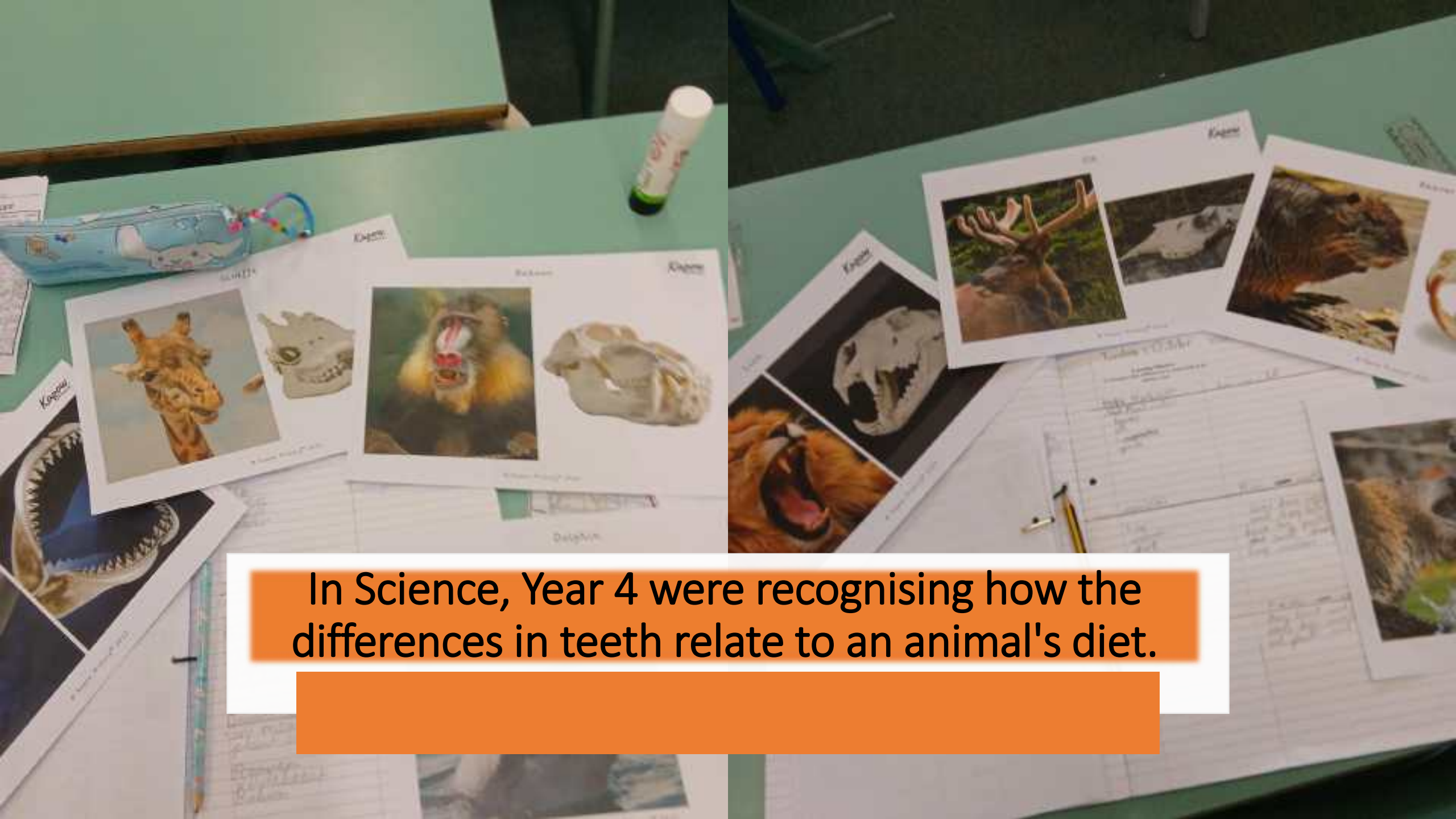

Another amazing clarinet lesson in Year 5 Teresa on Tuesday. The children can now play C, D, E, F and G and the squeaks are getting fewer!

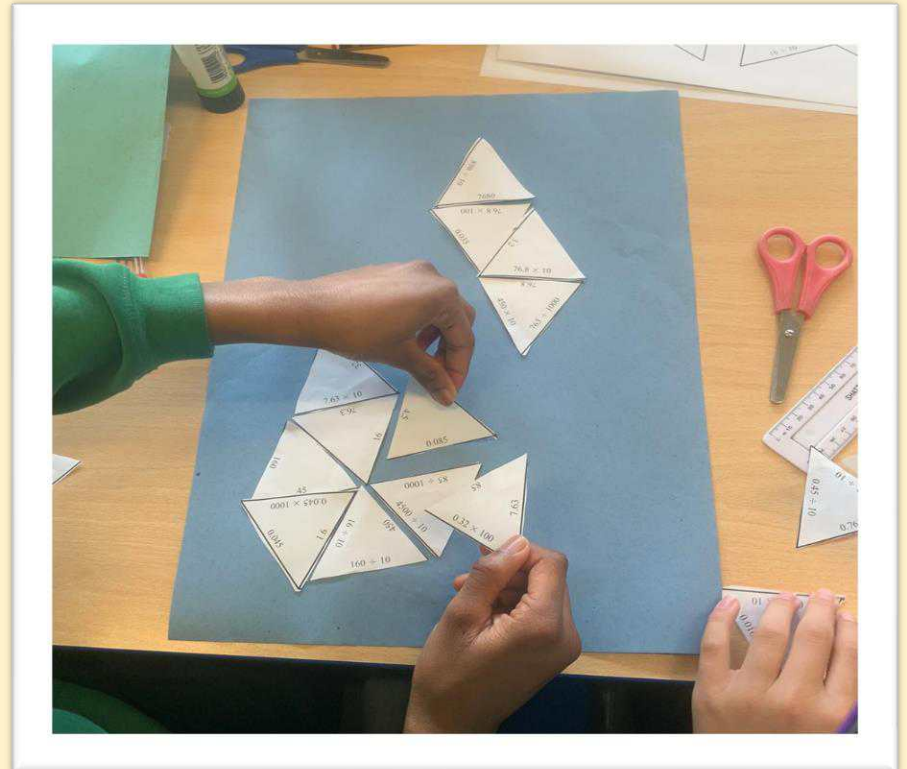
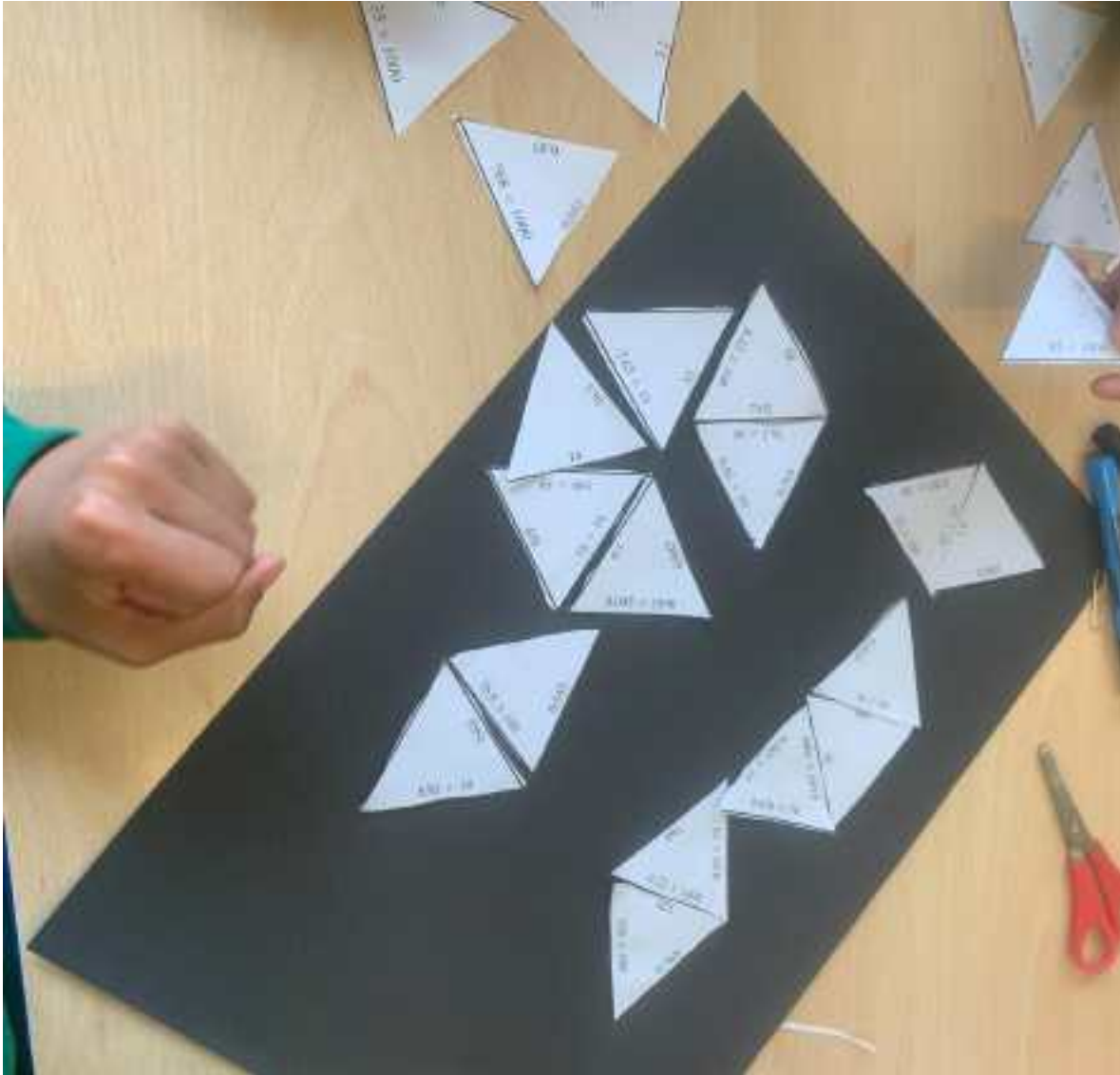


In Science, Year 4 were recognising how the differences in teeth relate to an animal's diet.

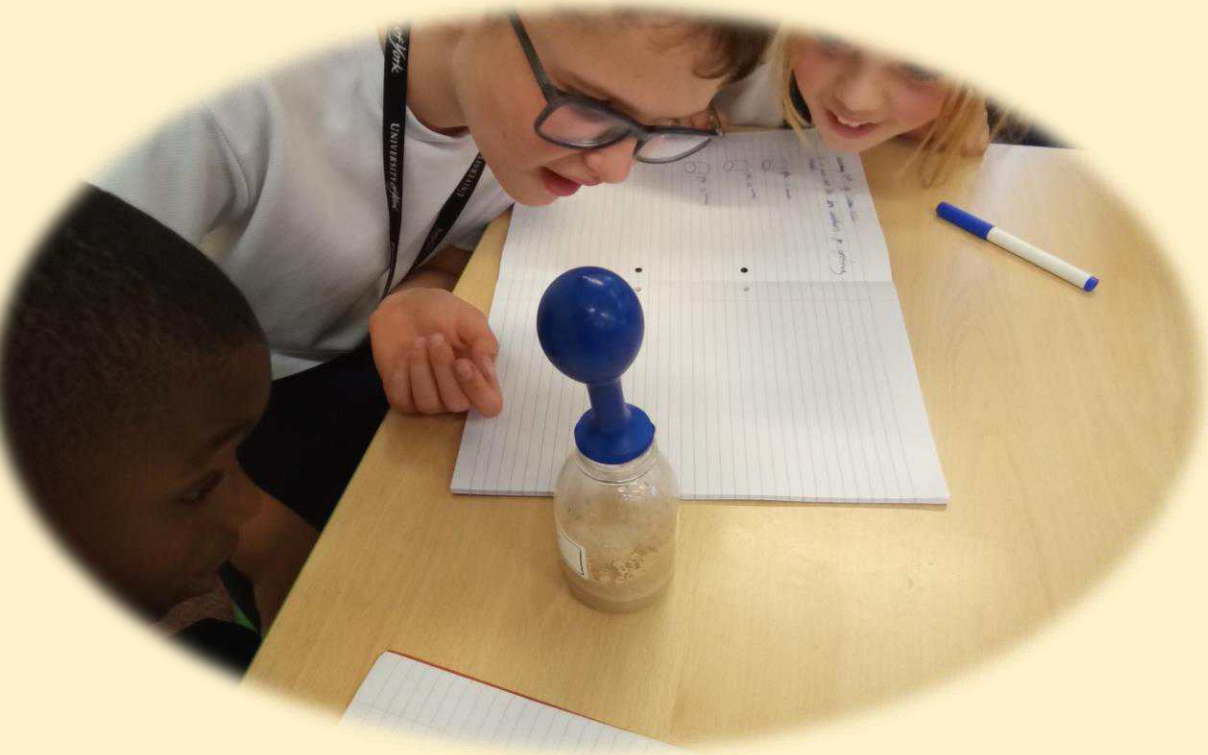
Year One have had fun exploring more than and fewer than. We then made equal signs to show the same as. Great fun!

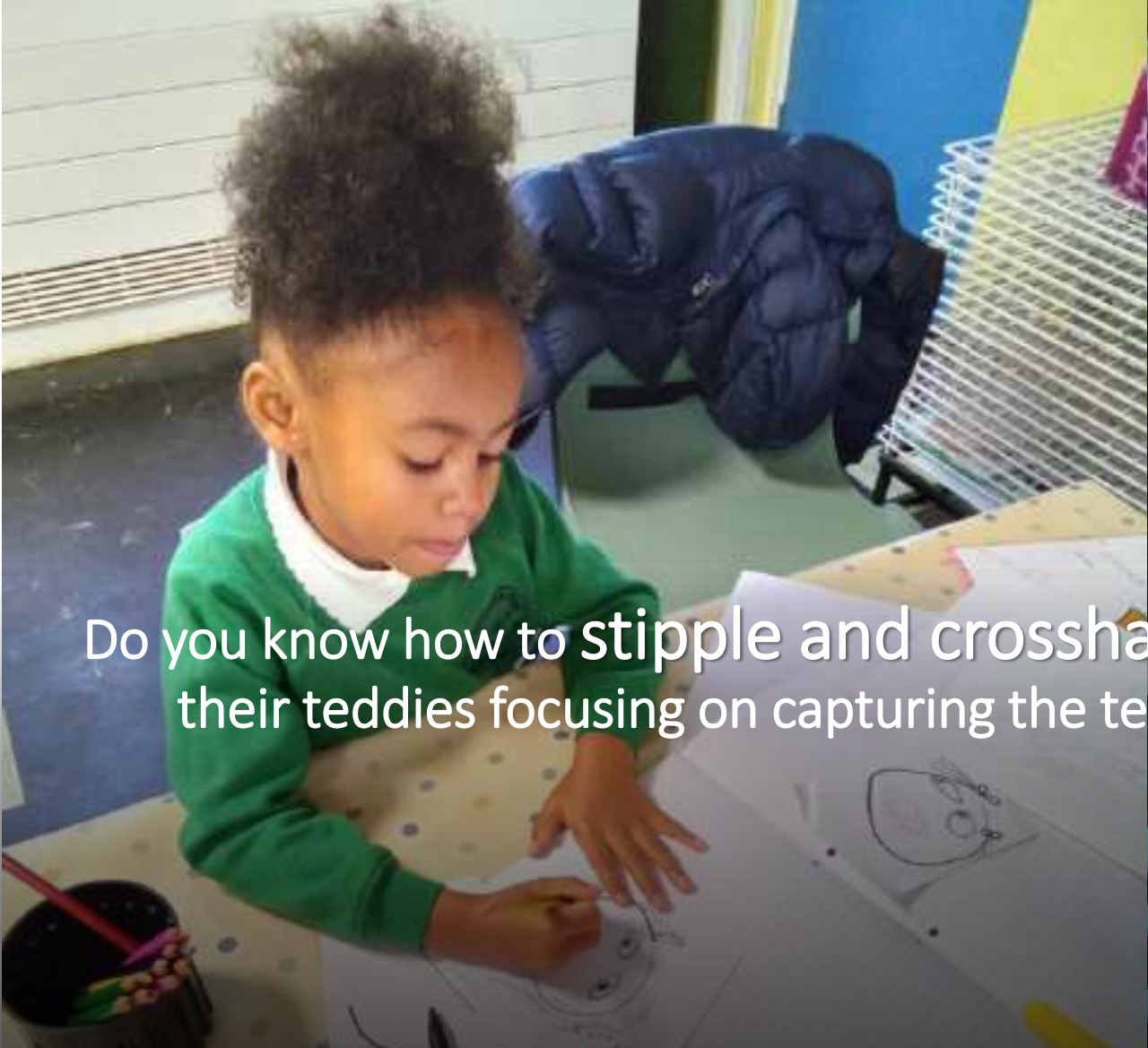


The Nursery children

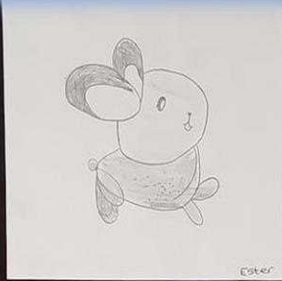


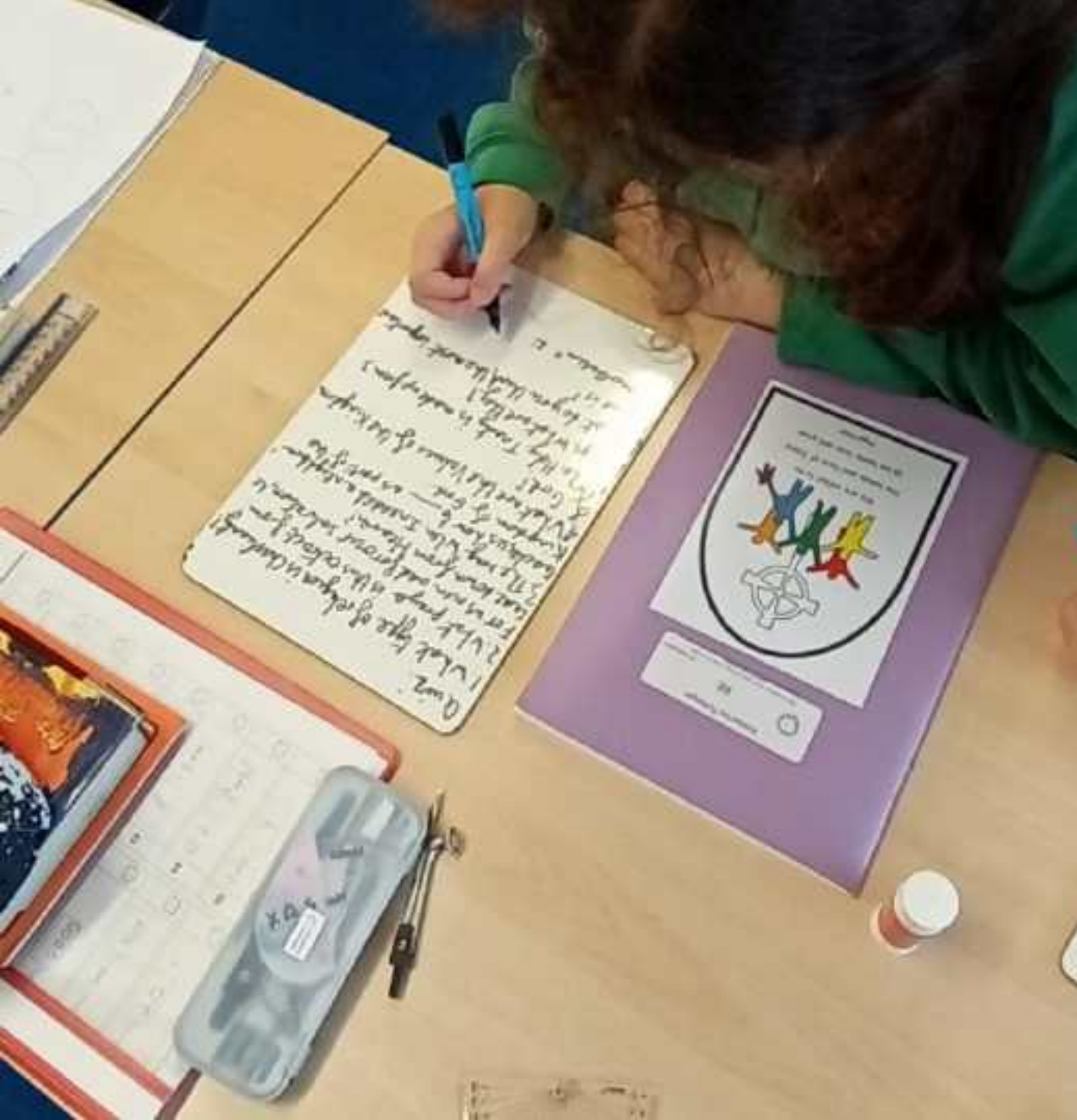


Do you know how to stipple and crosshatch? Year 2 do! They used their skills to draw their teddies focusing on capturing the texture in the fur. We are so proud of them!

Look how many countries our Year 2s are from! The children used atlases to find their special flag.



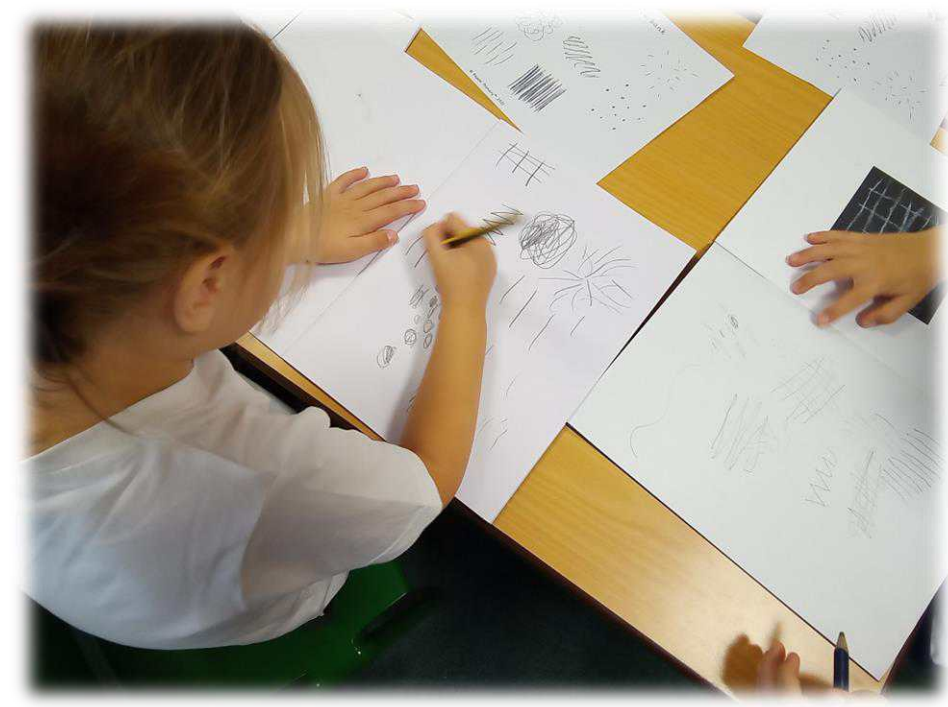
