

Year One wants to say thank you for our harvest. Thank you too for the harvest gifts that are still coming in.






















A little peep into the Nursery class. We continue to develop hand and eye coordination, as well as practising making comparisons 'more than', 'fewer than' and 'the same'.

They took letters home with them about it.








Year 1 also enjoyed learning tennis skills taught by an U10's tennis coach





Year 3 have been having fun learning about Botanical drawings. We are practising our shading and shapes.















Year 1 weather trackers, completing their weather diaries and learning about seasonal changes in Geography and Science.









Year 5 Teresa in their Science workshop, finding the best conditions for growing yeast.

















In History 4DA were learning about the diseases children caught and how they were treated in Tudor and Victorian times.


The Reception children enjoyed a lovely autumn walk on Friday afternoon. We found lots of colourful leaves, mushrooms, squirrels and berries.











Lovely autumn artwork in Year One: line drawing, observational drawings, shading and exploring colour.

Each design conveyed a special message.





Please read and reflect together upon this week's gospel. The theme is
