

Mozart Reception had a busy day on Monday, exploring the Numberblock 5, practising our cutting skills and also enjoying our new role play corner which is a 'classroom.'































Reception had so much fun becoming pirates, building ships, making treasure maps, fishing and investigating floating and sinking.

They are playing with what they know, making links, involved and enjoying what they set out to do.
















Members of our School Parliament Team attended the School Parliament meeting with the Mayor at the Council Chambers on Tuesday.



In Science, 4DA were constructing electrical circuits to see how they worked.











Year 4DA were using charcoal to create 3-d effects.













The Reception children have been exploring ways of making 5 this week.


























The children in Reception have been busy learning about inventors and engineers.

Into the Annunciation and looked at at different symbols and their meanings.


They then painted their own thinking about what symbols they wanted to include.

A Word from Pope Francis


"Jesus leads us to go out from ourselves more and more, to give ourselves and to serve others, leading us on our journey towards eternal life."
