



The Reception O'Connor children were lucky to be the first class to hang a decoration on the Jesse Tree, representing the story of Creation.



In Maths this week, the Reception children were learning about repeating patterns.



















We made our tree decorations based on what we heard and hung them on our school Jesse tree


On Thursday afternoon Year 2 explored 'The Christmas Journey' at St Hugh's and St John's Church.












In Science, 4DA were testing materials and objects to see if they were conductors or insulators.



Year 6MF carrying out a wonderful Act of Worship. Well done, children!














Look at our wonderful engineers in Reception.

### Year 6SC working on headstand skills. Pupils have worked in small steps and built confidence to fully extend their legs!




Year 3 added their art work to the Jesse Tree on Friday afternoon. We have created images to represent Miriam and Moses.





Some amazing maths fluency in Year 5TB this week!










Some cross curricular work in RE as Year 5TB made Jewish Sukkah tents to reflect on the Jewish Harvest festival Sukkot.

At the time when Pontius Pilate was the Roman governor of Judaea, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah, who was living in the desert. John went


