

It was a wonderful workshop learning about what a Victorian Christmas was like.






The Nursery's Nativity Story 2024

A yummy Christmas dinner and lots of fun!














Reception children had a lovely day. They looked wonderful in their Christmas jumpers and enjoyed their Christmas dinner.

Y4DA have been printing on fabric using different objects and templates to create their own designs.







Fantastic building in Year 6 Shakespeare too! Well done! 👏










Puzzle Play in the Nursery - a sense of achievement in achieving their goal

Come and see our lovely Jesse Tree, located outside the school office. Here, Y6MF are hanging their 'Ruth' ornament.




