The children reflected on their Lenten journey so far, and meditated on how they can give hope to others during this Jubilee year.



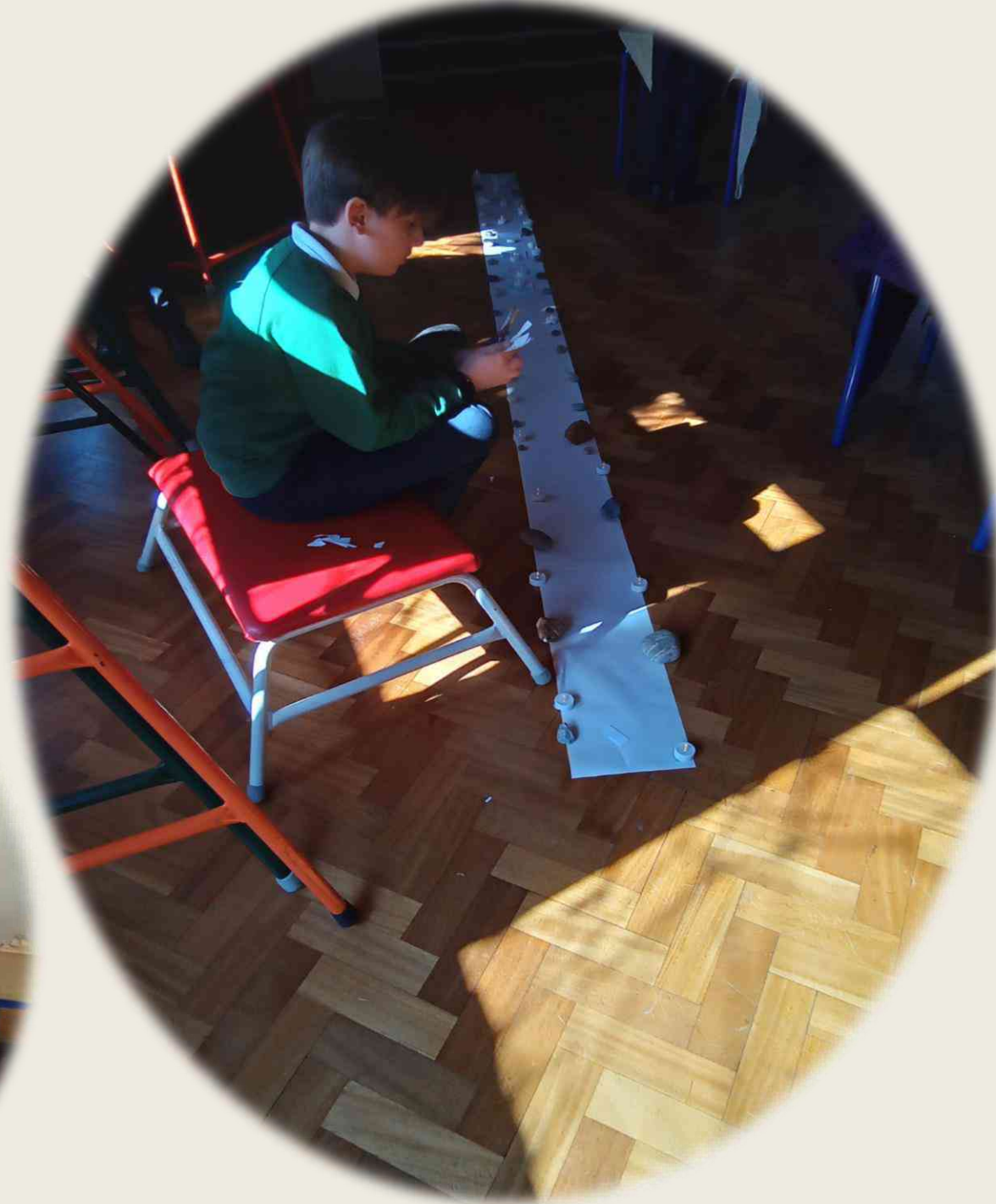

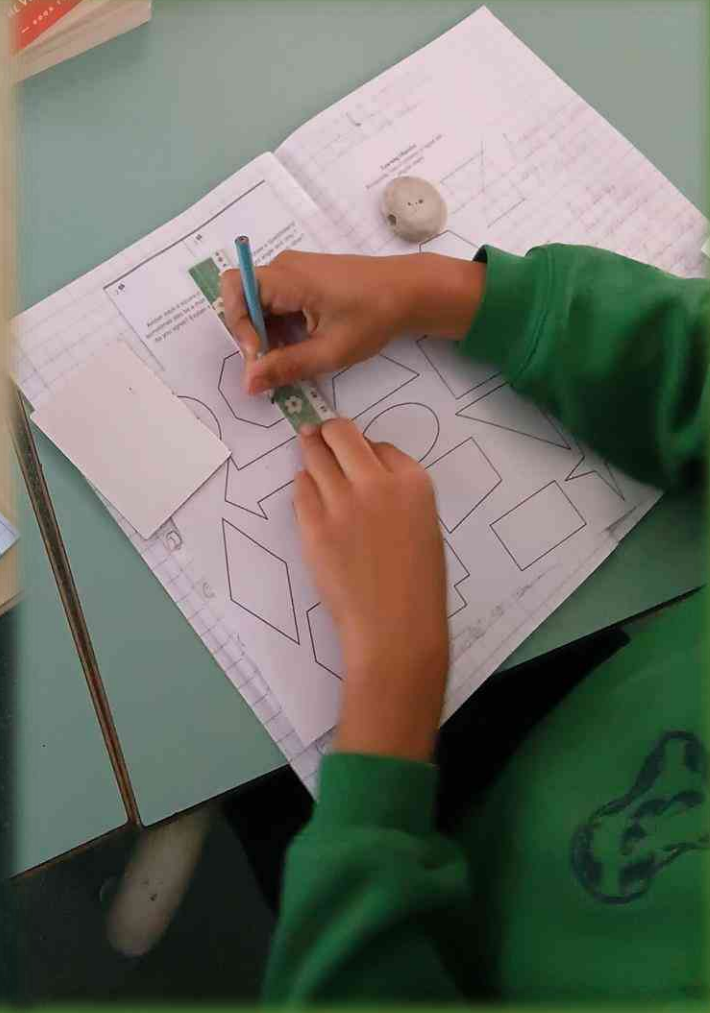
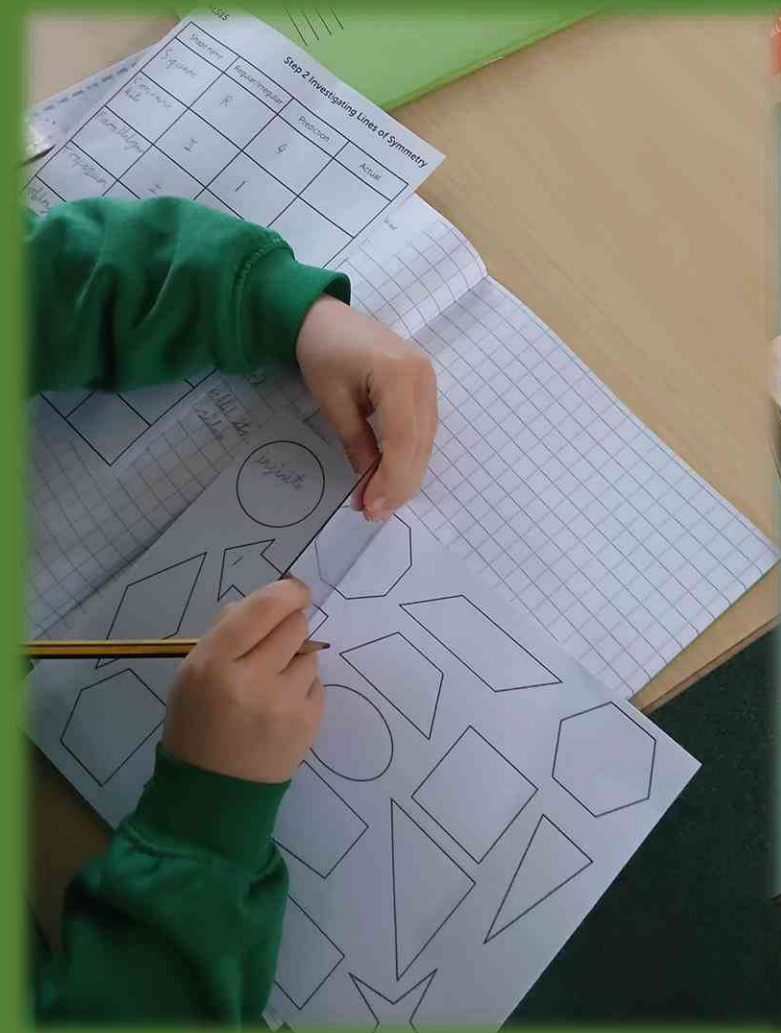
The Reception children have been busy exploring and collaborating during play, both indoors and outdoors!

In maths, 4DA were using mirrors to find lines of symmetry in both regular and irregular shapes.

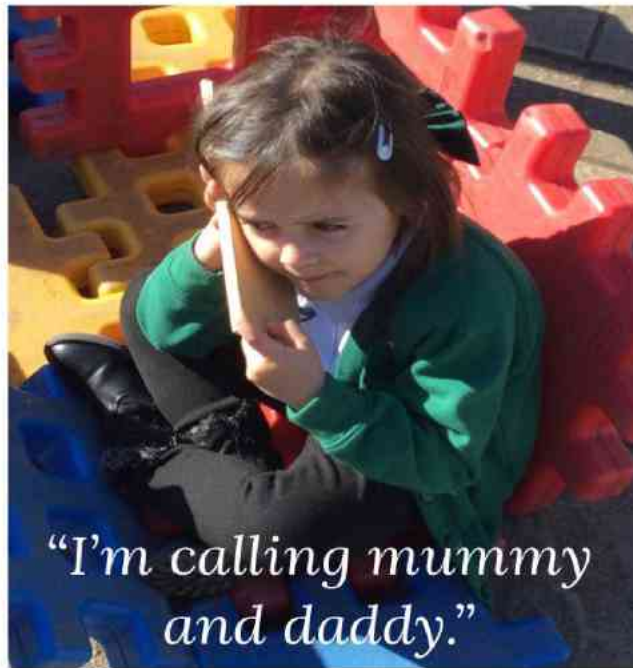

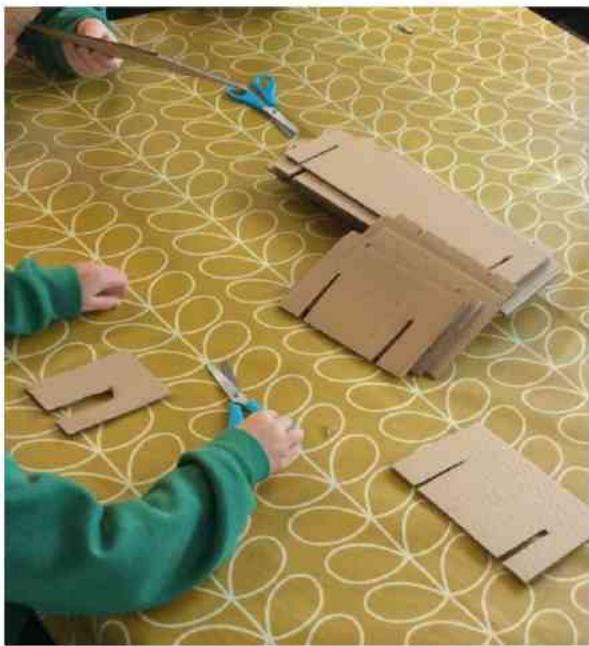
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The children in Reception O'Connor had a very creative week!

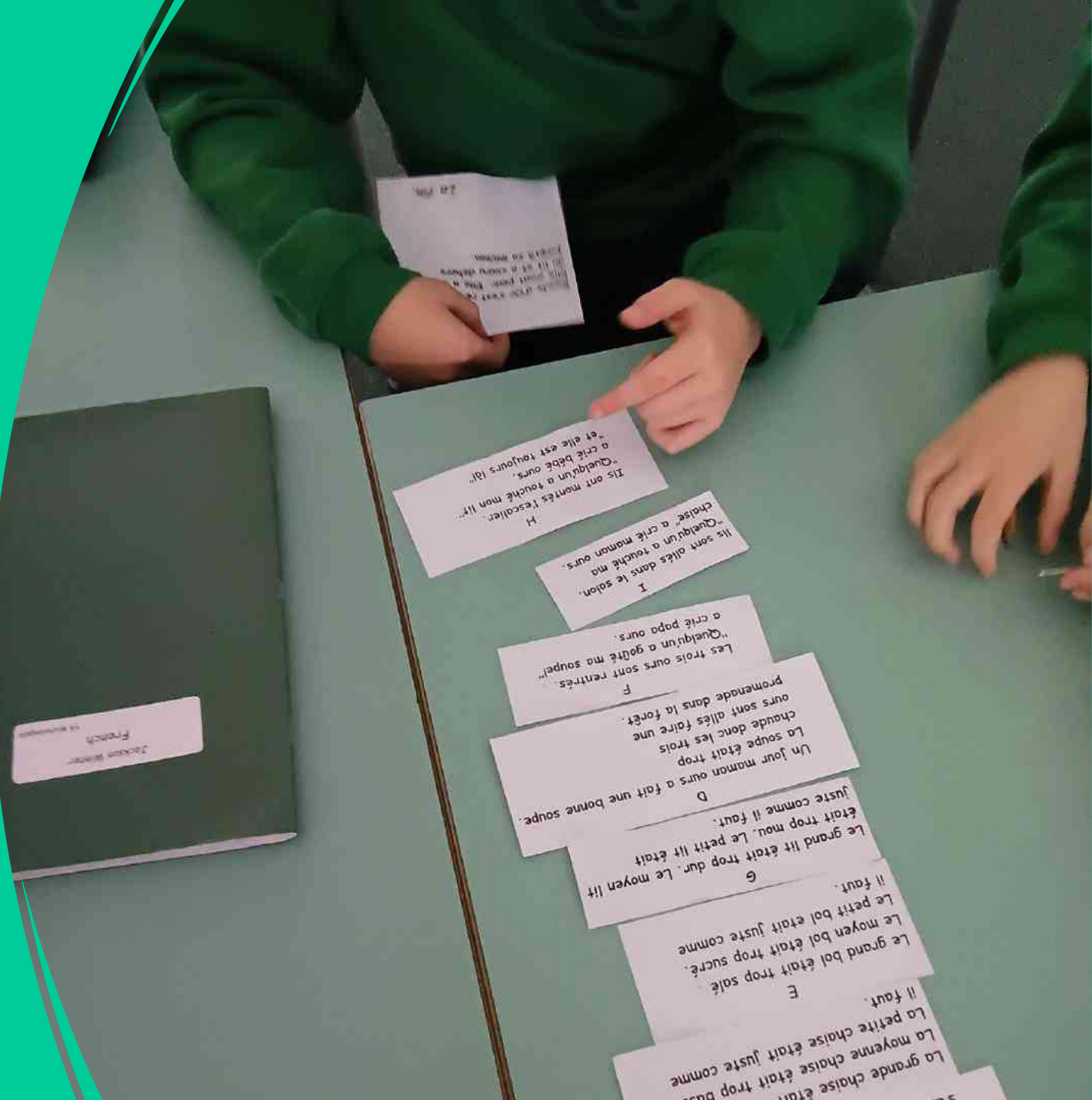
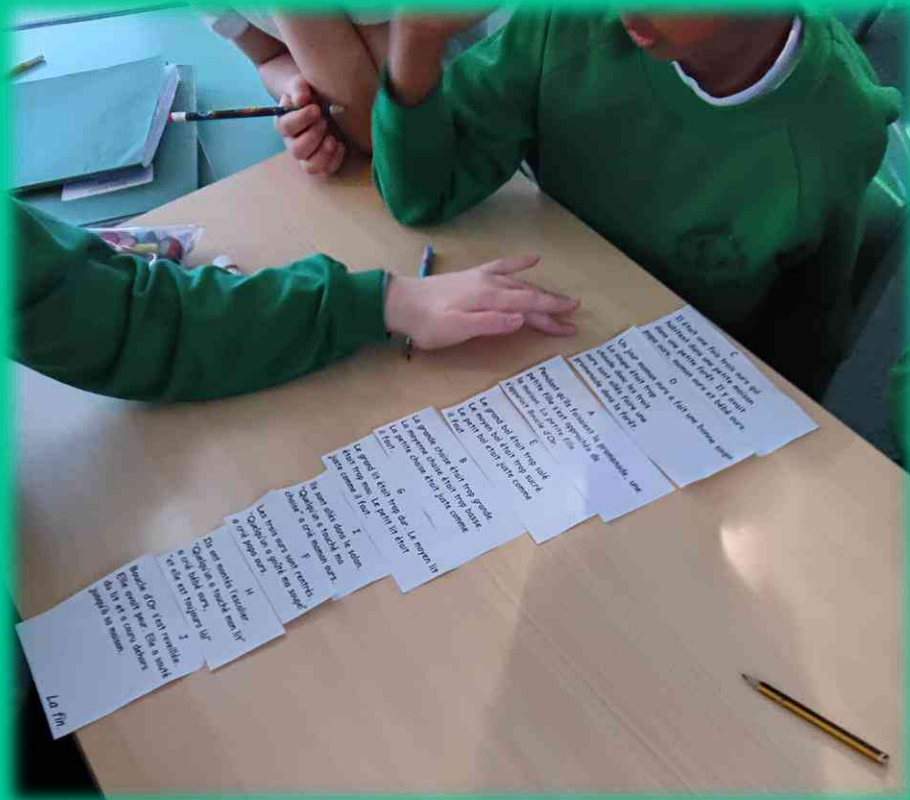




They had some great ideas for junk modelling. They decided to make laptops and we were so impressed with their efforts!





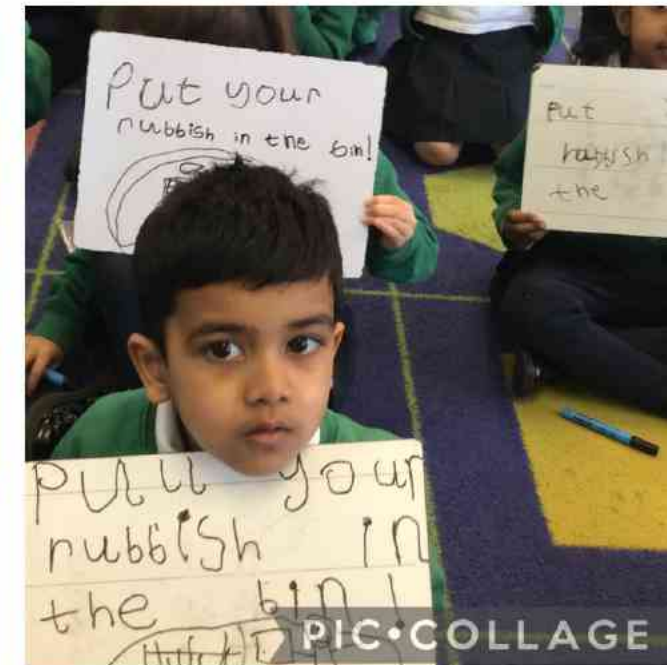
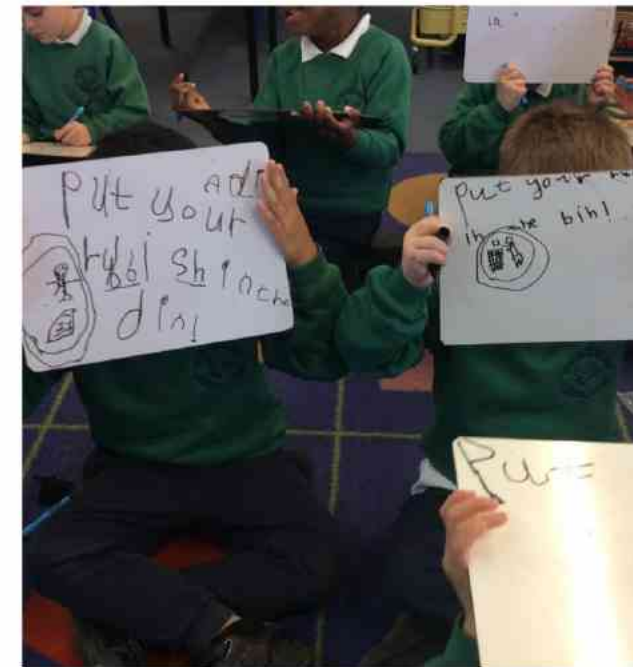
Year 4DA were trying to sequence correctly the story of Goldilocks and the three bears in French as one of their activities.

We had a lovely time in Reception sharing our achievements with our parents!



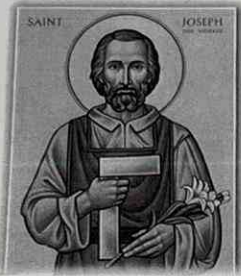

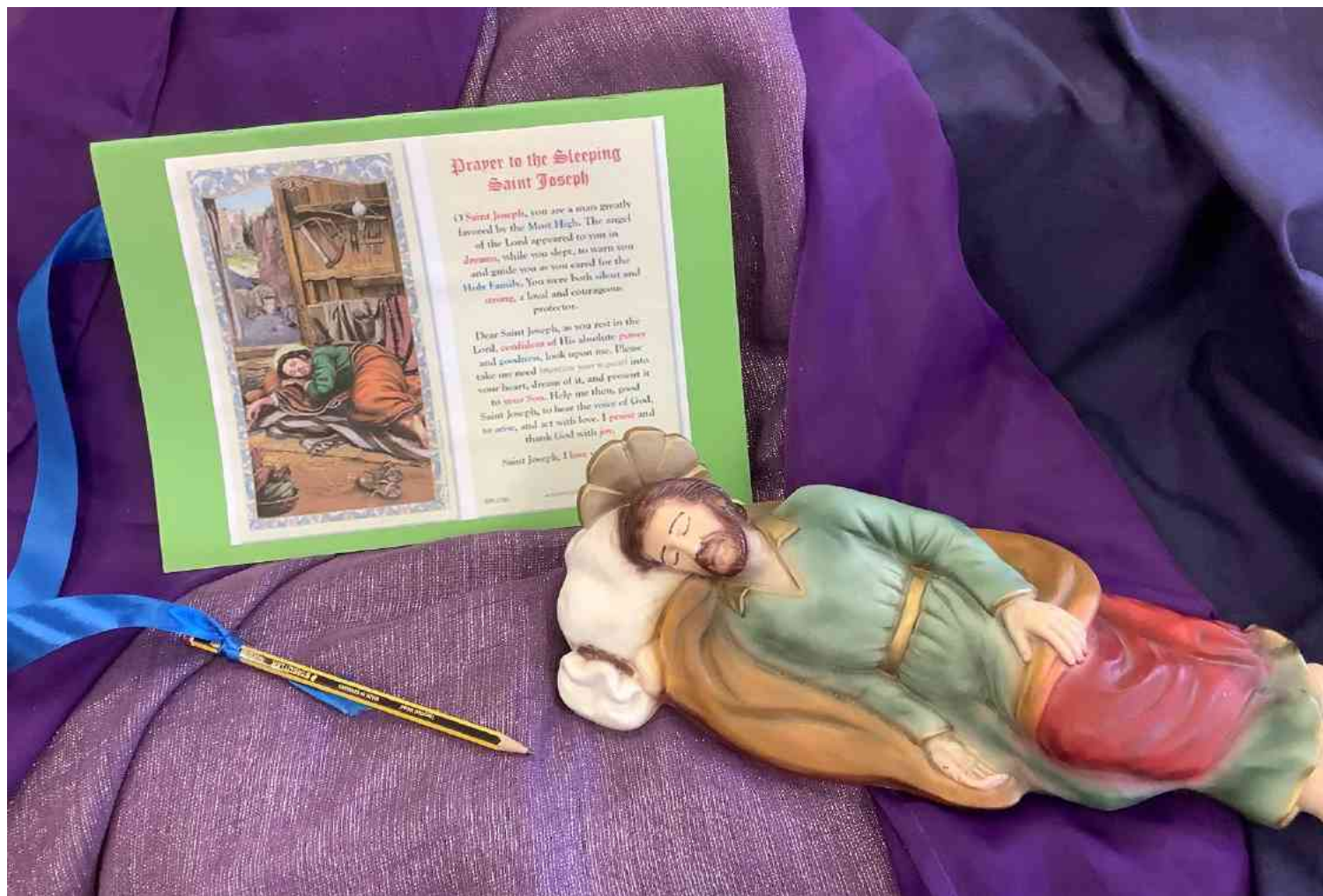
