




Remembering Pope Francis

Also we have looked at 2D shapes and have been manipulating clay to make wonderful creations!




Our Reception artists enjoyed exploring pinching, rolling and squishing clay into different shapes.















Year 3 had a great time writing and performing poems based on their favourite food.








They engaged in activities reflecting on the life of Pope Francis and the Jubilee Year.


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Our Reception children explored the story of Jesus rising from the dead using small world props a hands-on way to deepen their understanding of this joyful event!
