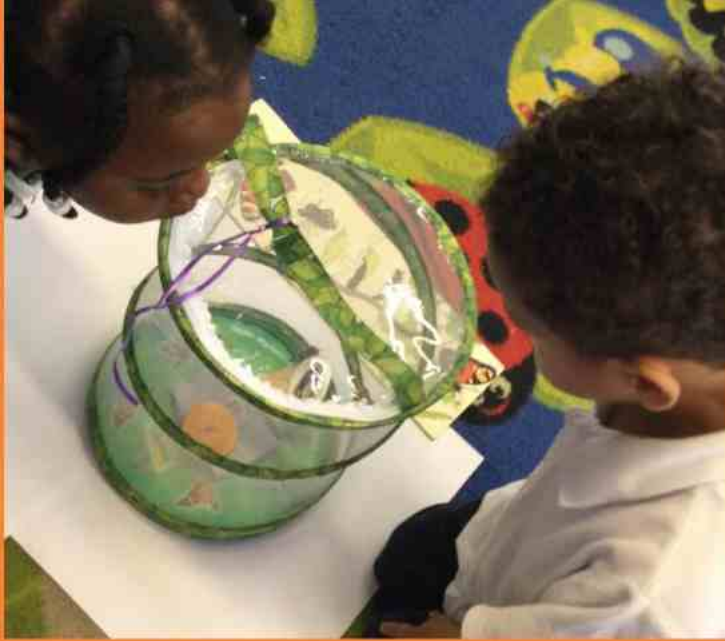


PUPIL POST

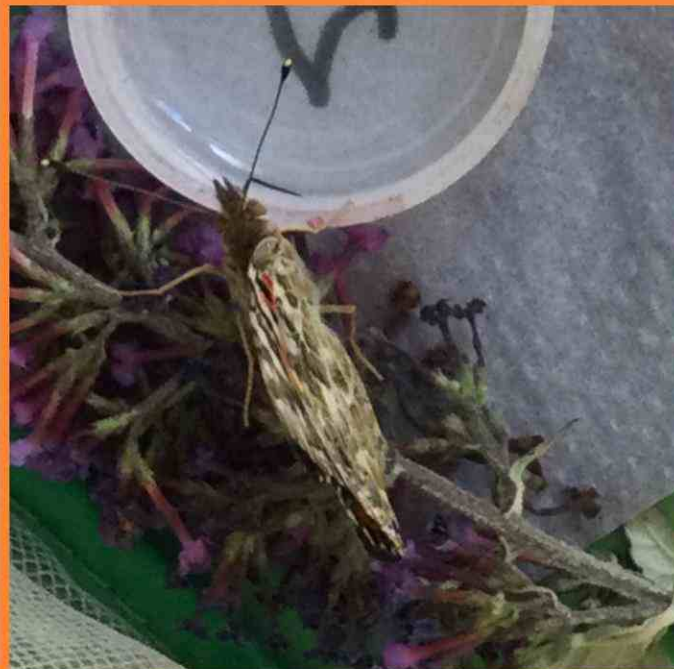
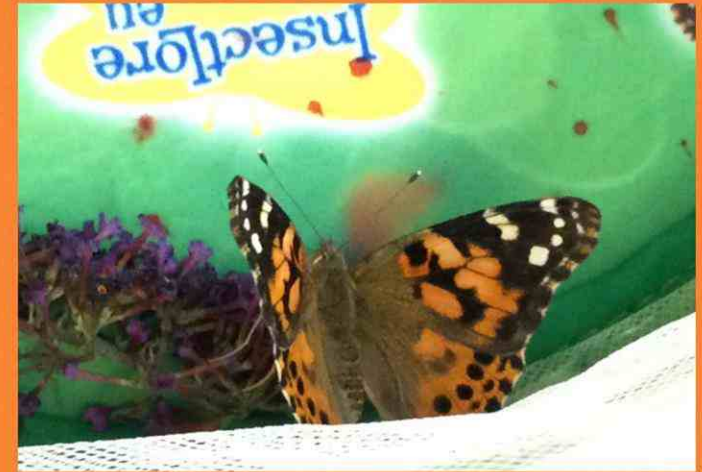
The children in nursery class chose a variety of activities in the heat on Tuesday and remained focused, while also drinking plenty of fluids to stay hydrated.

Bees have wings.



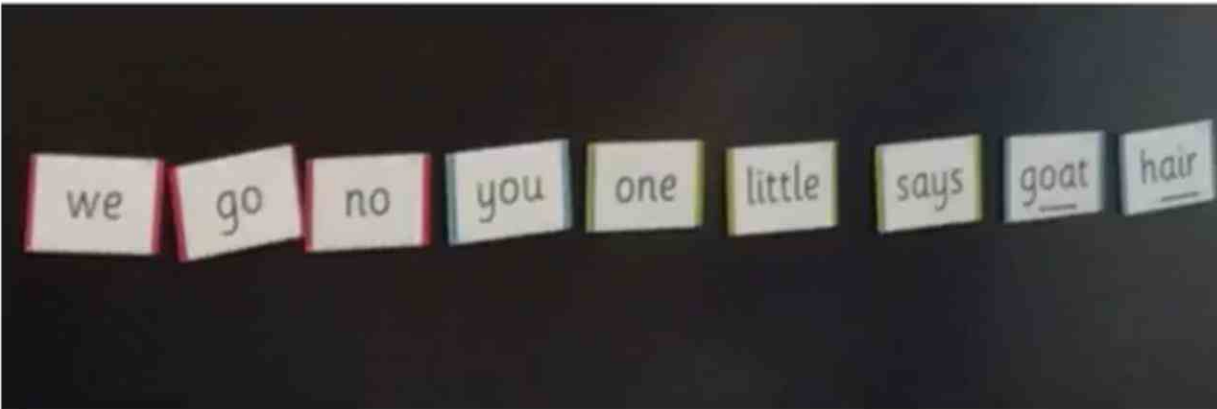
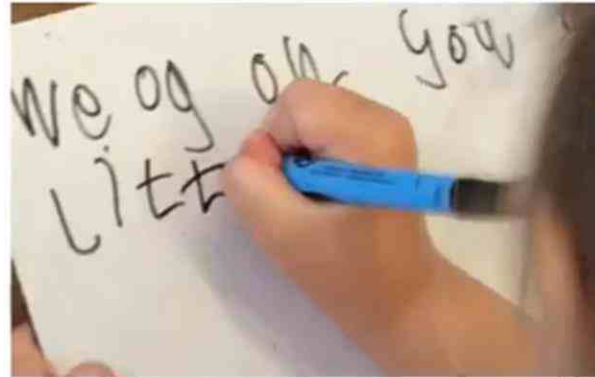

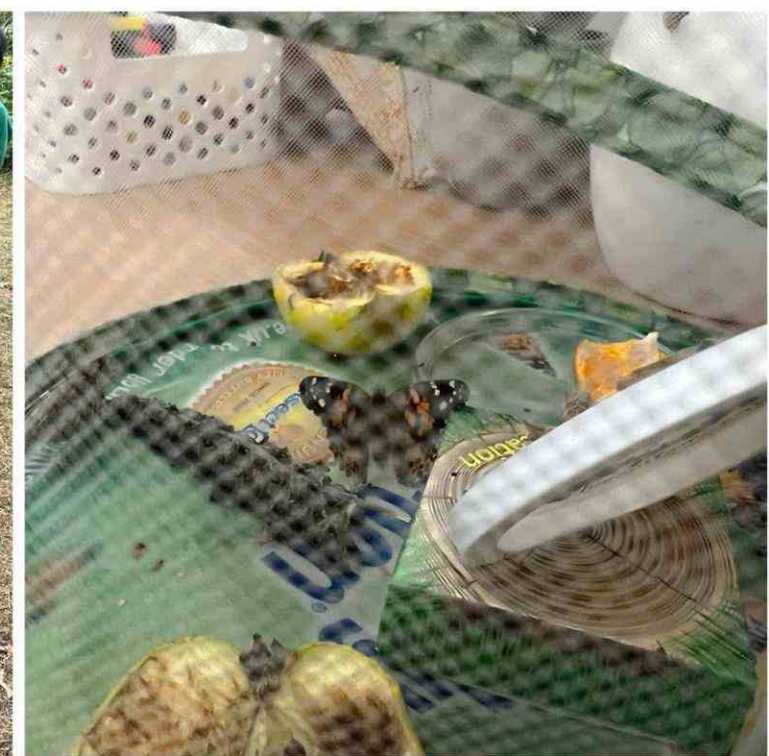




A few were reluctant to

Hope - looking forward with confidence to the future.





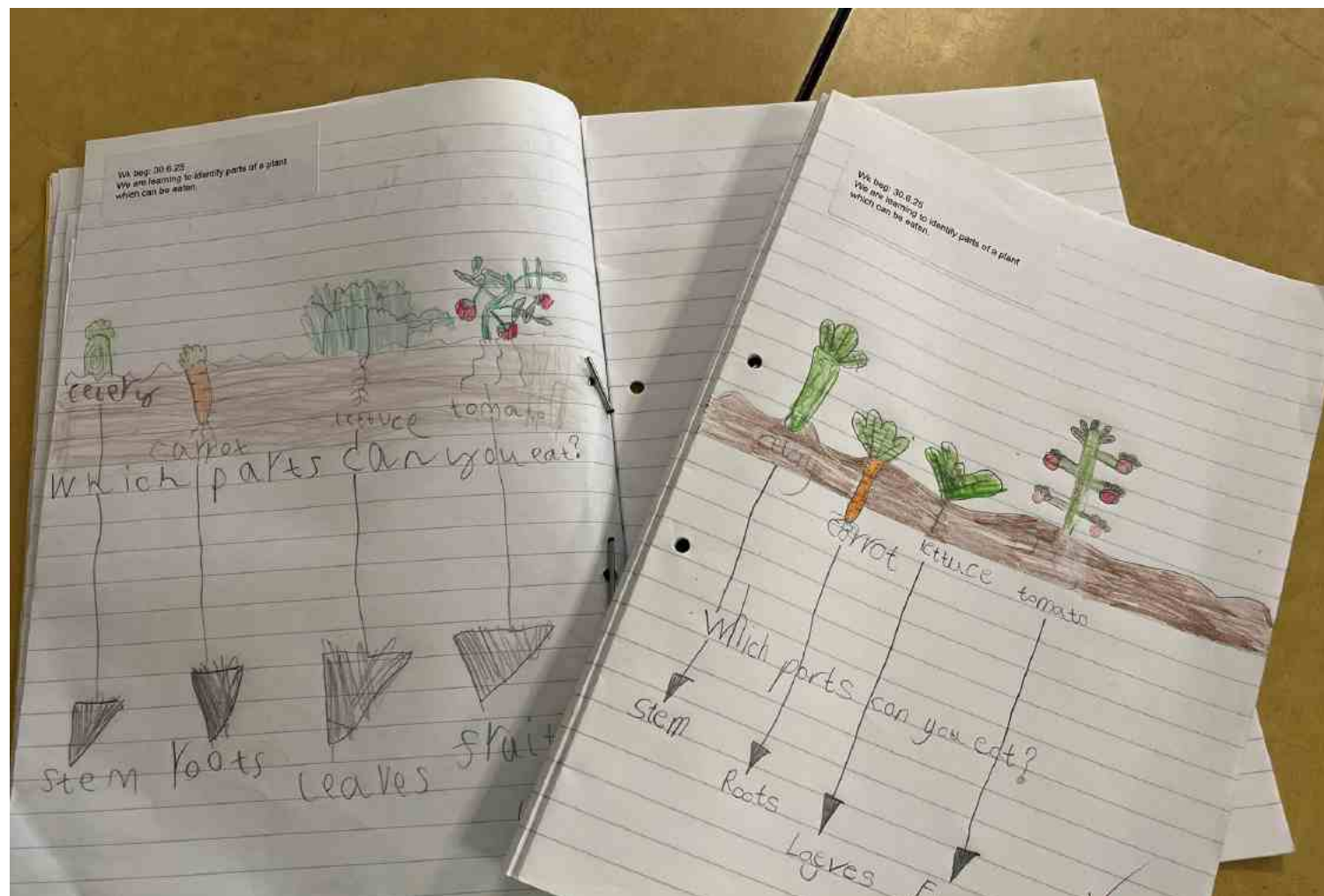
Nursery children were warmly greeted by Father Robert at St. Joseph's church and were captivated as they learned many new things.

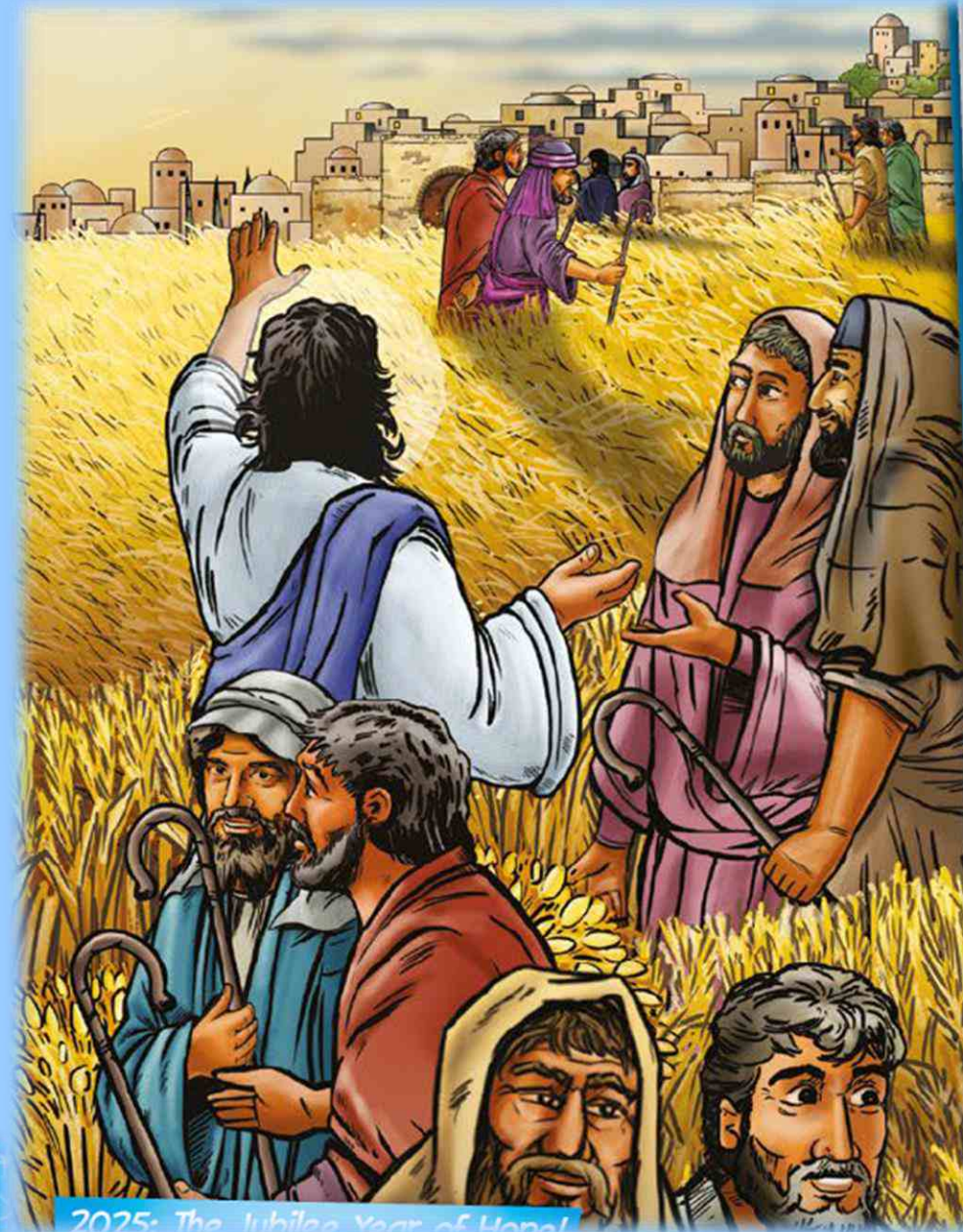
