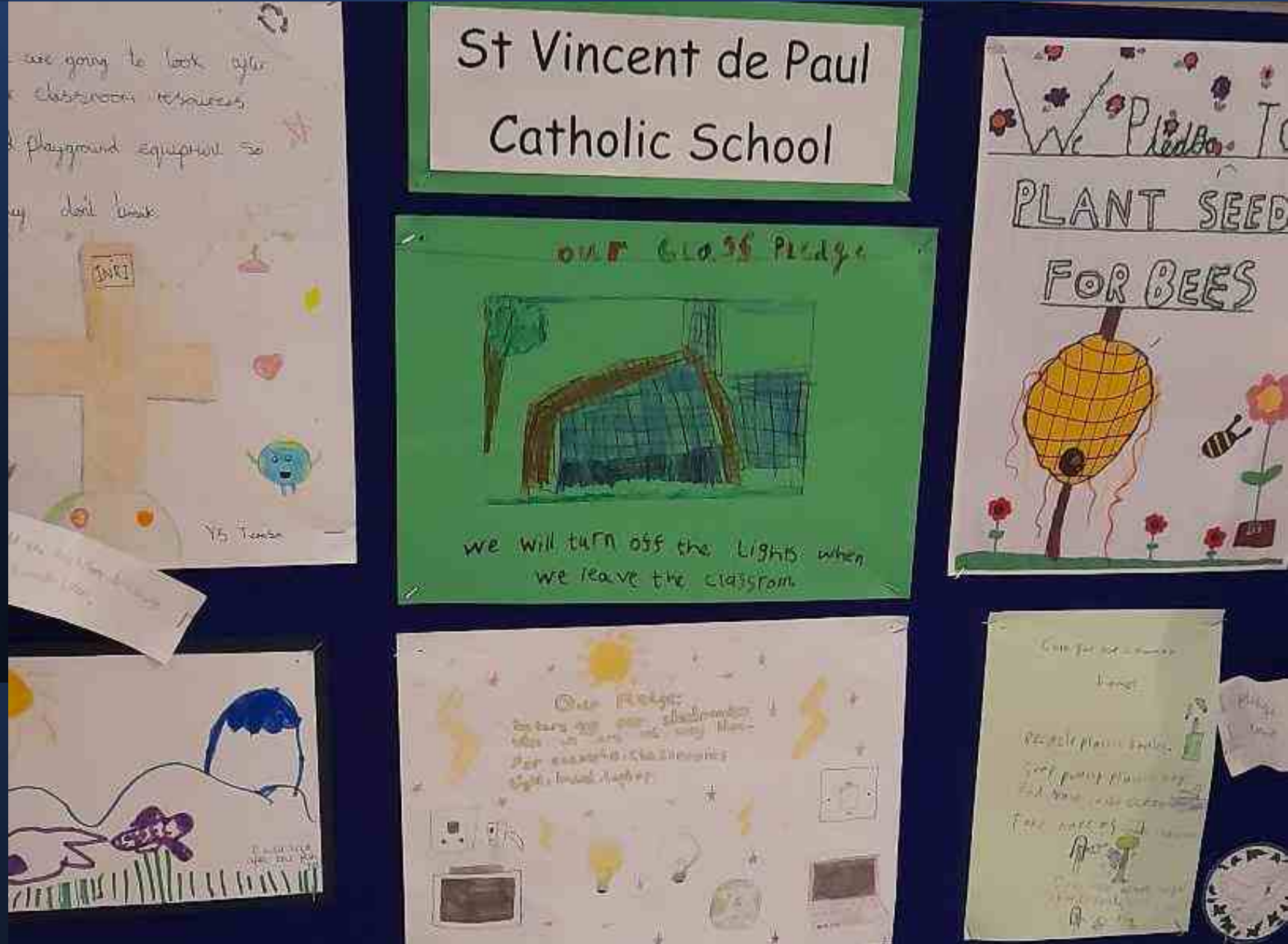

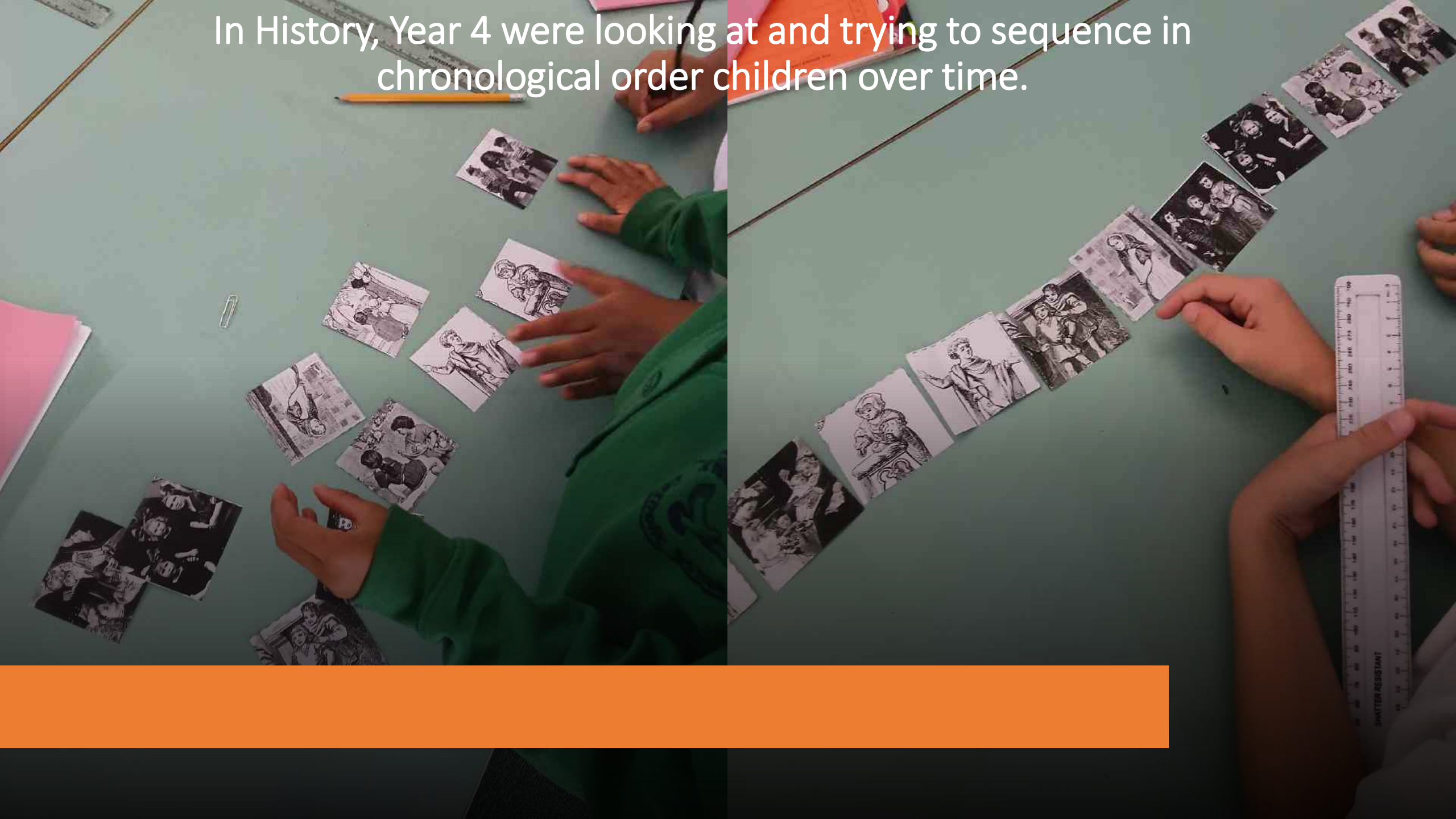

we dry our hands.

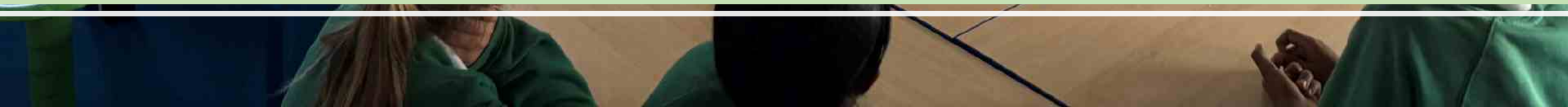


We drew

Don't believe everything that's online it could also be not true.

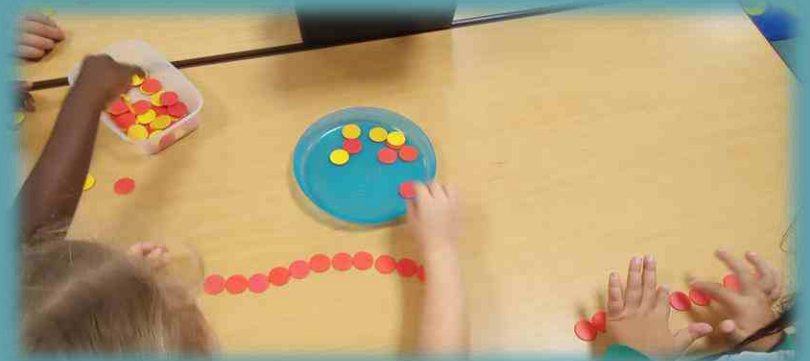

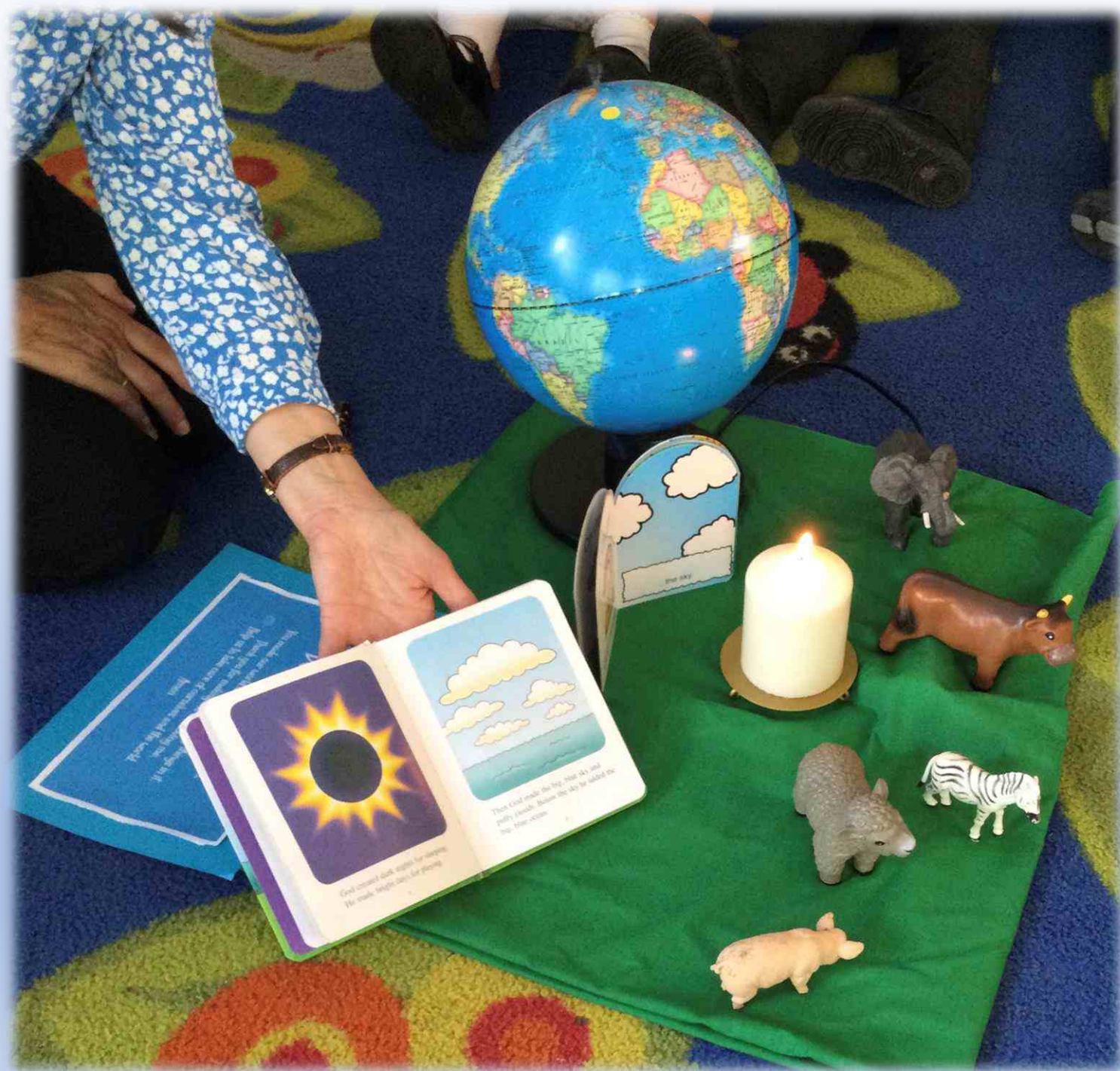
IS FOR TELLING

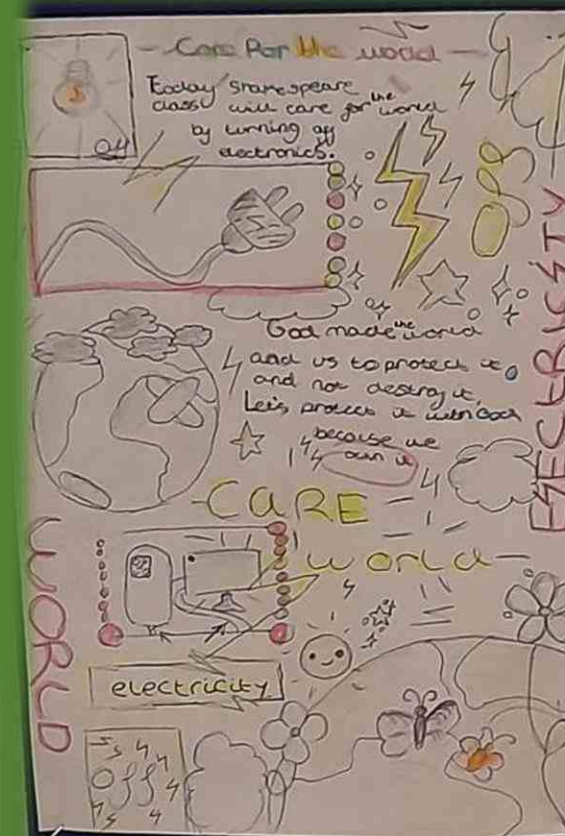
